WHEATON PLAZA TO HOST AREA'S MOST POWERFUL CLASSIC LEAGUE

Fair Lanes Wheaton Plaza is proud to announce the formation of the area's newest scratch league - The Maryland Masters.

The most powerful contingent of area bowlers ever assembled in a local bowling center opened the 1968-69 bowling season at 9:30 P.M. on the 5th of Sept. Organized to provide competition for the area's top bowlers, the Masters promises to be the most exciting league ever formed in the local area.

Teams as well as individual matches are featured in this unique league. A total of seven points per game are awarded based upon the following format. Each team member bowls against his counterpart, on an individual basis, with the winner of each game earning one point for his team. The winning team is awarded two points for each game won.

All the color of professional sports is included in the pre-game formalities as opposing team captains exchange lineups just prior to the opening of the match. Bowlers are unaware of their individual opponents until the line-ups are exchanged.

Sixteen power packed teams have been formed and entered in the Masters. All are capable of winning the league championship as well as earning a big slice of one of the richest prize funds ever offered.

Individual and team achievements of those entered in the Masters include virtually all the championship titles that can be won in local bowling activities. Included are the 1968 City Association Classic Team Champions, The Central Building Maintenance team which established the tournaments all-time high team game (1161) and team series (3117) records. Also entered is the team that finished second in the City Tournament, Mario's Italian Grocers (3047). Mario's will be remembered as the team that attracted national attention in the 1967 ABC tour-

namment at Miami, Fla., when they rolled a 3141 team series to capture second place in the national tournament. The grocers collected a fat purse of \$2000 for their efforts and added another \$60 for rolling the 5th high team single game of 1115.

Carmen Don's Pro Shop, the 1967 City Team Champions and a local powerhouse for many years will field another strong team.

Individual team rosters include names like Jim Robinette whose most recent titles include the City Association Classic Singles championship (696), the 1968 WBPA Individual Singles title (8896) and who is a recent winner of the 10 game Fairlanes Classic Tournament.

The Association's Doubles champions, Buddy Engleman and Bob McKee (1305), and Matt Pangburn, the All Event champion are also members of the league. Tommy Townsend, 1968 Nation's Capital Singles Classic winner and one of the hottest bowlers in the area will be rolling with the Sincerely Yours team. Joe Baglio who holds the area's highest three game set (780) will also be participating.

The list of individuals and their accomplishments is endless. Sixty members of the league are members of the 700 Club. Roy Thompson heads the list with a lifetime total of 29 sets over 700. There are 53 members who carry an average in excess of 190. Chuck Parker heads the group with a 204, Larry O'Neil follows with 200, Jim Robinette is next with 199 and John Bolejack with 198. Five of the league members have also rolled perfect games. They are Bob McKee, John Woody, Ed Miller, John Musala and Jim Charles.

Thursday nights at Wheaton Plaza promise to be the most exciting this area has ever seen. If you enjoy bowling at its best be sure to come early to get a good seat for the action begins at 9:30 P.M.
