Aragaki, Kossowicz, Watson Win Singles

Hank Aragaki came out of relative obscurity of late to win the Classic Division of the Nation's Capital Singles Classic in July. Aragaki posted 1084 for the five game test and took home first place of \$500.

Lee Brosius took the runner-up spot with a 1043, worth \$250; and Larry O'Neil was third with 1041, good for \$150.

The Classic Division was set up for bowlers averaging 180 and over.

The Major Division, for bowlers of 169 to 179, was won by Walter Kossowicz with a 1064, good for \$400. William Boroska was second with 1008 for \$250; and Ed Woodbury placed third with 992 for \$150.

The Regular Division, for bowlers of 168 and under, was won by Douglas Watson with 993 for \$200. Second place went to Wah Sheck with 944 for \$125. There was an unusual third place tie this year. Charles E. Green and Bessies M. Green both shot 875. The Greens are not related, and Bessie is the only woman to cash in the tournament. Third place tie money was worth \$67.50 each.
