Ladd, Pinkston Win Metro BPA Invitational

Mike Ladd and Sheila Pinkston, two of this area's top tenpinners, walked off with the honors at this year's Invitational Singles classic conducted by the Metro Washington Proprietors Association.

Ladd, close in the running for the top-ranked bowler of the 1974-75 season, went into the final round of match play with a 213 average over the ten games of qualifying play. Ladd took home \$685.50 and Pinkston pocketed \$226.25 for the wins.
