## FAIRCHILD WINS M.A.A.S.B.A. TOURNAMENT

Chuck Fairchild defeated Larry O'Neill, 266-167, in the championship match to capture the \$530 top prize in the first Middle Atlantic All-Star Bowling Association event held December 7th at Normandy Lanes in Ellicott City, Md. After finishing fourth in the five-game qualifying round with a 1086 total, he rolled games of 242, 270 and 239 for a 751 in the three-game semifinal round to earn the top berth for the step ladder finals.

Mike Hahn led all qualifiers with an 1152 to earn a paid entry into the next MAASBA event.

The Normandy tournament saw fifty-eight bowlers competing for twelve prizes (based on a one-to-five ratio) and it took a total of 1063 for the five games to make the semi-finals. Following Hahn in the qualifying were O'Neill (1138) and Jim Wolfe (1117).

With the field cut to the twelve semifinalists, all qualifying pins were dropped and they bowled three games to determine final standings, with the top three advancing to the finals. Fairchild, enroute to averaging over 233 for the day, rolled his 751 to earn top spot, followed by O'Neill (728) and Bob Yates (711). O'Neill bested Yates 256-212 to advance to the final match. Yates earned \$180 for his third place finish, while O'Neill collected \$265 as the runner-up.

The next MAASBA event will be January 18th, 1981, at Ten Pin Coliseum in Alexandria, Va.
