Asbury & Brosius Win Summer Tour

Ron Asbury of Rockville and Lee Brosius of Ft. Meade shared \$1,625.20 after winning the 25th annual Fair Lanes Summer Tour Finals held last month at Fair Lanes Rolling Road in Baltimore.

The 16 weekly stop winners from each of the four Fair Lanes Summer Tours (Baltimore & Washington, duckpin and tenpin) competed in two-game head-to-head elimination matches.

Asbury and Brosius earned the inter-city championship by defeating the Baltimore couple of Theresa Cotter and Dennis Cotter, 824-756. Asbury bowled 205-182/387, Brosius shot 208-222/430, and the team received seven pins handicap. Theresa Cotter rolled 161-152/313, Dennis Cotter tossed 153-130/283, and their team received 160 pins handicap. The Cotters took home \$2,458.80.

The Washington team of Eric Mitchell and Marlon Cook made it to Round 4; they shared \$762.60.

Third round local participants included Sherwood Page and Gregory Arnold, and Tim Gaidurgis and Steve Smith; each team split \$391.30.

Round 2 rollers who divided \$205.65 were April Woo and Andy Luk, Linda Elmore and James Taylor, Linda Harris and John Peters, and Gloria Davis and James Lyons.

Those wearing street shoes and sorting \$30 after Round 1 were Alexena Lesesne and James Maiden, Darnell Johnson and Tony Faulk, Jerry Jacobson and Eric Boardley, Phil Hayes and Joanne Williams, Maddy Jaro and Chip Hamilton, Meredithe Pennington and Leon Fletcher, Ted Wilkerson and Ron Fiskum, and Gloria Lyons and Derby Lyons.

Over \$10,000 was awarded in the tenpin finals, which was determined by each tour's entries. The bowlers contributed 50 cents per entry to the prize fund, which was matched by Fair Lanes.

In the long-running series between the two cities, Washington increased its lead, 14 to 11.

Three straight—a first!

The victory by the Washington team of Ron Asbury and Lee Brosius marked the first time that either side in the Baltimore-Washington rivalry has won the Summer Tour Finals three consecutive years.

A. Jane Timmons and Ron Holt won in 1987, and Trudie Wiggins and William Windsor took the title last year.

Area entries up 8 percent

Washington Summer Tour entries increased just over eight percent from last year, 4,183 to 3,848. Washington's all-time entry high was 7,346 in 1978.
