

Bowl America: PBA Senior Tour will return in 2007

Henry Gonzalez of Colorado Springs, Colo., holds the championship trophy after defeating Tom Baker of Buffalo, N.Y., two-games-to-one in the best-of-three title match of the PBA Senior Manassas Open at Bowl America Manassas on April 25. Gonzalez, who earned \$8,000, was nearly 20 lanes away when Baker failed to strike out out in the tenth to win by a pin and instead left a 10-pin on his first toss, ultimately losing 268-248.

"I did not want to watch," said Gonzalez in explaining his disappearing act. "I was looking at a roll-off—you know a bowler like Tom is one of the best. It was just sweet to win." Gonzalez won the season-opening event on the PBA Senior Tour for the second consecutive year. Baker took home \$4,500.

Gonzalez advanced to the title match with a 2-1 win over Ron Winger of Westlake Village, Calif. Baker advanced to the finals with a 2-0 win over Dale Eagle of Tavares, Fla. Winger and Eagle each pocketed \$3,000.

Prior to the finals, Bowl America Regional Manager Don Armel, noting the success of this year's tournament, pro-am, and affiliated events, announced that the PBA Senior Tour will return next year.
