Four to be inducted October 6

NCAUSBCA's 2012 Hall of Fame Induction and Dinner Celebration will take place Saturday, October 6 at Rosecroft Raceway in Fort Washington, Md. The event begins with a "Meet & Greet" session with



cash bar at 4 p.m., and a buffet dinner featuring Carved Round of Beef with Horseradish Sause and Country Chicken Breast with Stuffing scheduled to start at 4:45 p.m. The induction ceremony will follow dinner.

The Hall of Fame's "Class of 2012" includes four individuals—Buddy Engleman and Bobby Hall Sr., two of area's best bowlers in the 1960s, '70s, and '80s, longtime youth league coach/administrator Richard "Rick"

Parker, and Alden "Andy" Anderson, who, in addition to being a former association director and serving as secretary of the Falls Church Commercial League since 1985, provided many years of technical assistance to the Nation's Capital Area Bowling Association and the Washington, D.C. Area Women's Bowling Association.

Tickets, which cost \$40, will soon be available at the NCAUSBCA office and through many association board members.

RERATE COMMITTEE BACK IN ACTION

The NCAUSBCA Rerate Committee recently began requesting information regarding tournament scores and cashings from bowlers who are competing or have competed in leagues that do not include head-to-head competition and also from those who bowl or have bowled in leagues not classified as USBC-certified Sport Bowling leagues that feature the more challenging lane conditions similar to those used in official Sport Bowling leagues, which use an average adjustment scale. This adjustment scale applies to Sport Bowlers who only have a Sport Bowling average. The scale is not considered a "rerate" of the bowler. Its purpose is to allow for a fair adjustment to what would be expected of the bowler on a standard league condition. After collecting information supplied by each bowler, who has 20 days to respond to the letter, the committee also will review data it has received from its local and national sources to determine if a rerate hearing is necessary. At such a hearing, the bowler is provided the opportunity to appear and produce witnesses if desired. Click [here](#) to view the current list of rerated bowlers.

This year's NCAUSBCA Senior Tournament, which will take place October 20-21 and 27-28 at Bowl America Falls Church, will for the first time accept entries from bowlers ages 50 to 54, who will compete in their own division. ... [Donny Carr](#) of Laurel, Md., won the \$5,000 prize in a national raffle that raised \$14,500 for the International Bowling Museum and Hall of Fame (IBM/HF). While most of the \$20 tickets were sold during International Bowl Expo 2012 in Reno, Nev., Carr purchased his winning ticket during a pre-sale at The Lanes Fort Meade, where he works in the pro shop. An accompanying silent auction, which featured a wide variety of items, netted another \$3,700 for IBM/HF. Eric Kearney, a former NCAUSBCA member, is managing director of IBM/HF, which is located in Arlington, Tex. ... NCAUSBCA Hall of Famer Mark Glover successfully defended his title July 22 when he defeated George Tignor of Winchendon, Mass., 193-170, to win the Professional Bowlers Association East Region Mil-Ray Foods Senior Open presented by Roto Grip at Playdrome Cherry Hill. The victory was Glover's seventh career regional win and his second as a senior. Glover earned \$1,500, while Tignor earned \$850 as runner-up. ... The four-lane bowling installation at the Naval Support Facility in Indian Head, Md., has changed its name to MWR (Morale, Welfare, and Recreation) Stars & Strikes Bowling Center.

FINAL FRAME

Mary Ann Mills, a two-time international bowling titlist who was secretary of the Friday Night Mixed League at Crofton Bowling Centre, died May 19 at her home in Chesapeake Beach, Md. She was 62. In 1977, as Mary Ann Jocius of Riverdale, Md., she won the Division II singles (667 series) and all events (1,672) categories in the Women's International Bowling Congress Championship Tournament in Milwaukee, Wis. ... Lillian Hennessy, wife of the late Hall of Famer Bob Hennessy, died May 26. She often assisted Mr. Hennessy, who succeeded fellow Hall of Famer Matt Bennie as secretary of the Nation's Capital Area Bowling Association in 1979 and served in that position until 1987.

FOR THE RECORD

In his April/May "Ask Bob" column, Bob Korth wrote: "plugged balls are not allowed by PBA rule." This is no longer the case. Today, per PBA rule, plugging material may be used in accordance with current USBC specifications. "I try to answer all questions correctly," noted Korth, who last was a PBA member in 1996, upon learning of the oversight. "This reminds me to double-check my answers first."

Believe it or not, there are some averages already online (and no, it's not my league). Double check and make

sure your averages are correct before your new season starts. There's nothing worse than finding an incorrect average while at a tournament.

Think about recognizing some of these outstanding performances and accomplishments in our annual Hall of Fame. Nominations are accepted through April every year.

You have been a great audience. Thank you for listening and allowing me to spend this bit of time with you. I am glad to have been given the space in this publication, which is produced for the benefit of all of our members. Utilize the information in it, and let it be a resource for you to communicate with us as well as your fellow bowlers.

I wish all of you the very best that bowling has to offer, and I will continue to work with the association in whatever capacity I can.

Board elects McGregor as NCAUSBCA manager

NCAUSBCA Assistant Manager Ronald McGregor will succeed the retiring Ray Brothers as manager at the start of the 2012-2013 season. The announcement was made following a vote by the association's board of directors at its June meeting at the NCAUSBCA office.

McGregor, Temple Hills, Md., is a former president of the Nation's Capital Area Bowling Association (NCABA), who was elected to its Hall of Fame in 2005. Following the 2006 merger of NCABA, the Washington, D.C. Area Women's Bowling Association, and Vir-Mar District Junior Bowling Association, he retired from the U.S. Geological Survey and joined the NCAUSBCA staff in his current position.

McGregor said he intends to review all aspects of office operations before announcing any changes.

Ray Brothers, who joined the NCABA board as a director in 1981 and served as president (1988-1989) and then assistant secretary and later assistant executive director (1989-1995) and executive director (1995-2006), was hired as NCAUSBCA's first manager prior to the start of the 2006-2007 season. He is a 1991 Hall of Fame inductee.

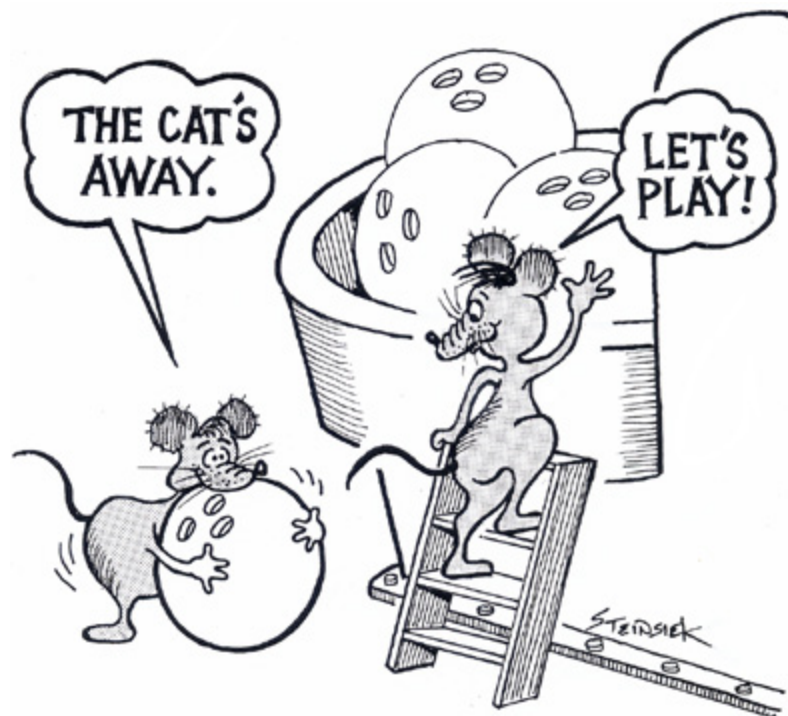

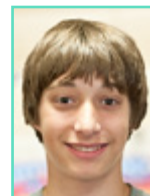

Storm 2012 Soldier & Family Assistance Center project a big hit at Fort Meade

Hoping to learn how to properly spin his bowling ball to strike, Sgt. 1st Class Chiedoziem Nwofor visited The Lanes Fort Meade on Saturday morning. After a just a few hours, the member of the Warrior Transition Unit (WTU) was spinning and curving his ball down the lane.

That's what can happen after getting pointers from professional bowler Jeff Carter, who has rolled 108 perfect games and holds the United States Bowling Congress highest league average record of 261.74.

"[Carter] was outstanding," Nwofor said. "He taught me how to do it."

A collection of the top professionals in the sport were on hand June 9 to teach Soldiers from the WTU and their families the art of bowling. In groups of 15, a total of 60 Soldiers were given two-hour lessons from the team of veteran bowlers at no charge.

"It's an honor; it's kind of cool to have the stars in here," said Mike Sinek, manager of The Lanes, Fort Meade and a NCAUSBCA director. "It's really great to do something for the Soldiers and their families."

Sinek developed the idea of an instructional event for WTU members after seeing the success of the Soldier and Family Assistance Center therapeutic bowling program held every Tuesday at The Lanes.

"It gets them out here with their families; it gives them another activity that they can do," Soldier & Family Assistance Center Director Mark Stoessel said of the sport's therapeutic benefits. "It can help them heal and get their mind off their injuries."

The original idea of bowling helping soldiers began with bowling writer Jim Goodwin eMailing some bowling friends how golf had run a similar event. Storm President Dave Symes expressed his support and encouraged his marketing team to develop a plan. Storm Marketing Director Roger Noordhoek and Sinek went to work.

Sinek and members of the SFAC began planning for the unique event.

"This has never been done in the bowling industry," Sinek said. "It's been done with golf but never with bowling."

"I know after talking to everyone who participated this was a very moving experience, and one that I believe nobody will forget," said Noordhoek.

While the company participates in many charity events, Storm's Vice President of Operations Corbet Austin said the company jumped at the opportunity to work with the wounded warriors. Coaches traveled from all over the country, including Utah, Georgia, Illinois, and Florida to participate.

"We want to help, we want to give back," Austin said. "You don't get to share your appreciation enough with the military, I think. ... Just talking to some of them and some of the stories they have, it's like 'Wow. You guys have been through some really tough things.'"

"And here they are, they have a smile on their face. They're dedicated, and they serve our country to keep us safe. If we can give back a little bit just to show them a tiny bit of appreciation, which is not much compared to what they have to go through, hey, we're in."

The event staff featured Randy Pederesen, a member of the PBA Hall of Fame with 13 PBA titles who is now an ESPN analyst; Hank Boomershine, a USBC Gold Level certified coach; and several Storm team members, including USBC Hall of Famer Bob Hart, Jeff Carter, Dale Niemela, Mike Luongo, Mickey Luongo, Louie Wemett, and NCAUSBCA members Jeff Baker and Chris Johnson.

"These are the TV guys coming out to teach you how to bowl," said Sgt. 1st Class Denny Phillips of the WTU. "These are professionals. That's big."

Through video cameras and one-on-one instruction, coaches worked with members of the WTU and their families on crafting their bowling skills.

For a few members such as Phillips, Saturday was their first attempt at bowling.

"I wanted to learn," Phillips said. "I just

decided to come out and give it a try, and I wound up liking it. I really like it."

In addition to lessons, each member of the WTU was given a custom bowling ball and bag from Storm and shoes from Dexter.

Phillips, who had only previously visited the bowling center to pick up some french fries, went from not knowing what bowling shoes were to owning a pair. Nwofor said he's ditching the house balls for his new, custom tie-dyed one.

Both Phillips and Nwofor said they appreciated Storm for bringing the top-level instructors. "I don't know much about bowling, and I never really heard of Storm, but they put on a show like this—this is unheard of," Phillips said. "This is a once-in-a-lifetime kind of thing."

"Most Improved Woman" honoree saluted by younger league bowlers at Bowl America Chantilly

During the 2011-2012 league payout of Mixed-Signals.Org at Bowl America Chantilly, one award created more applause and cheering than any of the others: *Most Improved Woman*. The recipient was Erma Pierson, a woman in her mid-80s who bowls with her husband, Pete, and have been in the league over 10 years. Prior to joining my league, they bowled at the former Bowl America Duke.

The cheering for Erma came as a result of how much bowling means to her (and her husband—they've been married over 60 years). Erma has been through a number of medical issues, including one involving her right shoulder a few years ago. Bowling meant so much to her that she established a left-handed average and kept bowling that way for a full season.

This past year was her second full season back as a right-handed bowler, and she improved 16 pins from 2010-2011—from an 84 to 100. When she first joined us, her average somewhere in the area of 110, so to see her closer to where she was is awesome.

Erma is well loved by everyone and very much a social person. If you bowl in this league, your night is not complete until you get your hug from her. Even when she and Pete did not bowl one year, they would still come out to visit, and it would take them 10 minutes to leave because Erma always hugs people on her way out.

Going into the 2010-11 season, their team needed two people, and I placed a much younger couple with them, and it has been a perfect match ever since. Said the lady of this couple about Erma: "She's like the grandmother I never had."

Summer league benefits, ball care, and much more

Q. *I have been asked to bowl in a summer league. I have always refused, as I think the bowling season is long enough, but I seem to start out each year very slow. What is your opinion of summer leagues? Do you bowl in a summer league? Do you think it helps your overall game?*

A. Like you, I used to take the summer off. I always felt it was a time to get away from the game and recharge for the next season. I could get away with it because my game is a classic-style game. I don't have a lot of quirks in my approach or release to cause a lot of problems.

Now that I have gotten older, however, I find that I do lose timing and flexibility, and it takes much longer the next season to get back in the groove. So I have changed my mind about summer league.

Depending on the complexity of your game and your age and physical ability, I

believe at least one league in the summer is a very good thing to do. I now bowl in a summer league that is handicap with both men and women where there is no pressure to perform. This allows me to keep some semblance of timing and lets me work on things that I want to learn for the next season. I also found it to be more fun than our scratch leagues that can get to be more like work sometimes.

This league finishes in Reno, Nev., for all the teams, and rooms are paid for out of the prize fund. Each team also gets some money returned to each bowler. The finals are combined with a sweeper, so you can get a few more dollars to play at the casinos. The best part is I no longer have bad starts to the winter league season. A fun summer league is a good thing.

Q. *I am going to bowl in a summer league*

this year and because we live in a moderate climate, I just keep my equipment in the trunk of my car. It has been all right in the winter because it rarely freezes here, but summers get very hot. Will this have an adverse effect on my bowling balls?

A. Yes! Any extreme in temperature is not good for bowling balls. They are, after all, mostly made up of resins, and extreme heat could cause them to crack. So keep them in the house or in a locker at the bowling center.

Q. *I have quite a bit of ball speed, somewhere around 19 to 20 miles per hour. I have been throwing the ball through the break point more than usual. Is there a ball out there that will give me a better mid-lane read without losing power at the pins?*

A. Have I got the ball for you! Get yourself a Roto Grip Defiant. This ball was made to help bowlers with your exact problem. This ball reads the mid-lanes like no other ball on the market today and still has unbelievable continuation into the pins. Give this ball a try; it will give you everything you are looking for.

Q. *I have always been paranoid about getting that nasty knot on my thumb, and now that I have it due to bad drillings over the years, I find that my thumb holes are way too big. I have tightened up one of the four balls I have, but I find myself still paranoid of tight thumb holes. How do you get over that fear? My brother and I are working on loosening up my swing, and I can't fully do it if the ball is sliding off the thumb early. Please help!*

A. I have a couple of things that will help you. I also bowl with that nasty knot. It is caused by squeezing the life out of the ball, usually because the thumb hole is too loose or there's too much reverse pitch.

Here is how I have helped the problem. First, I discovered Thumb Carpets, which are just what they sound like. They are shaped like bowling tape and go in the back of the thumb hole. They are soft and have a carpet-type texture. This allows air flow around the thumb

so it eliminates suction, which means you can get a tighter feel without hanging up. They are not expensive and last a long time. I have been using them since 1998, and they work great.

You will not find them in pro shops; they are a grass roots product that only a few people and the inventor know about. I do have them, and they cost \$20 for 10. If interested, send a self-addressed No. 10 envelope with two first-class stamps on it to: Bob Korth, 750 Hemlock Ave., Central Point, OR 97502.

The other thing I discovered was to grip the ball differently than most and differently than what is taught. Instead of putting the fingers in the ball first and then the inserting the thumb, I do this backward. I now put my thumb in first, then I turn the thumb slightly to the left and rotate the fingers back to the right to get them into the ball. You don't need a big turn of the thumb, just a 1/8 to 1/4

When you practice, start by working mostly on your spare game. High-average bowlers are very good to great spare shooters. The secret to averaging 200 is spare shooting. All it takes to average 200 is one double a game and the rest spares with good count. With every spare you throw away, it takes another double to catch up.

Q. *I have just started to bowl regularly for the first time in a summer league this year. I have no equipment of my own. I can't afford to get everything at one time. In your opinion what is most important?*

A. I would purchase bowling shoes first. The reason is after you break them in, you know what you have in terms of how they feel and slide. Bowling shoes

Since then, I use only questions asked of me by my readers. So these are definitely questions from real people.

I take pride in the fact that I answer every question by eMail even if they don't make the article. Most of the answers I give are from years of experience. If I don't know the answer to a question, I get help from others I know in the game, and I give them the credit by name for the answer. I don't know everything, and I have asked for help many times. I have also been wrong a few times, and if that happens, I hear about it, believe me. On those rare occasions, I will correct it in the next column.

My qualifications are that I have bowled and been involved in the game for 59 years. I started in the game as a pin boy in the 50's. I have had 300 games and 800 series with every cover stock of bowling ball from Rubber to Reactive urethane. I also have carried a 200 average every year since 1961. I have worked in all areas of bowling center including the pro shop. I have been President of our local USBC and was a tournament director for 10 years. I have also attended many coaching seminars and am currently a Bronze coach. My whole intent of these articles is to gear them to all averages and keep the answers simple. So I still need you my readers to do your part and ask me questions. I will do my best to find the answers.

inch turn. This locks the thumb in the ball, and you don't feel the need to grip it at all.

Q. *I want to improve my game this summer. What is the most important thing to work on?*

A. This question will have a different answer for every person. It all depends on where your game is at right now. I will answer this generically, as I have no knowledge of your game.

The first thing I would do is to take a lesson from a certified coach; he/she will be able to pinpoint what it is you need to work on. If taking a lesson is out of play, go to your local pro shop and get your equipment checked out. No one can improve if the equipment they are using does not fit correctly. Ask your pro shop operator to check your arsenal and it is a great time to fill in the holes you have in your arsenal. Summer is a slow time in the bowling business and good deals abound.

at the beginner level are not expensive, and you save money each time you bowl. Those shoe rental costs add up fast. Soon you have paid for those shoes by the rental fees you don't pay.

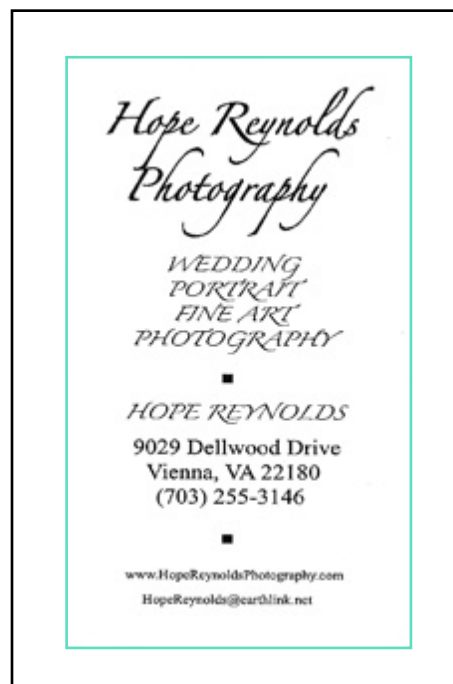
Next, you will want to invest in a ball; go to the pro shop and let them guide you into the ball you need. Pro shop owners are very good at getting you into a ball to fit your skill level.

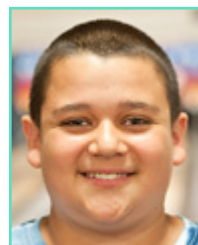

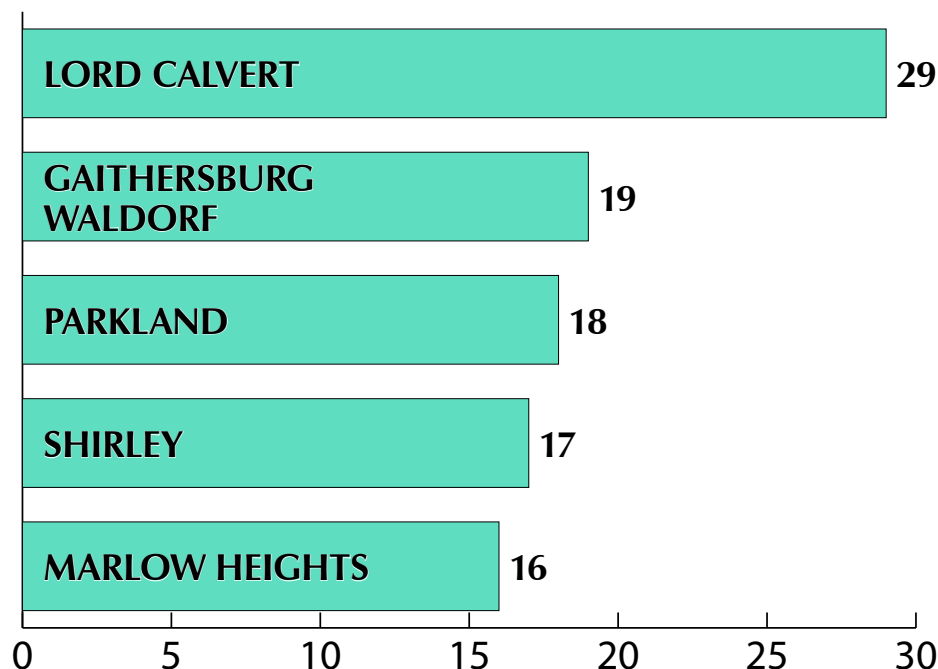
