BVL celebrates 70 years of service to America's veterans with increase in contributions

The sport of bowling once again confirmed its collective commitment to our nation's service men and women by joining forces and increasing annual contributions to the Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL). During the 2011-2012 season, leagues, associations, bowling centers, and bowling's corporate partners donated almost \$800,000 to BVL.

Of the total, more than \$500,000 was raised by state and local USBC associations, including \$15,400 by NCAUSBCA, which placed third among locals. Through tournaments, raffles, and hundreds of special events, America's league bowlers helped BVL continue its mission to brighten the days and boost the spirits of our nation's veterans being cared for through the VA Medical Center System and at State Homes. BVL dollars pick up where government funding leaves off, providing recreational and therapeutic programs and services that speed recovery and improve morale.

Bowling center contributions to the BVL cause continued to climb, with more than \$72,000 donated from centers during the 2011-2012 season, a steep increase from the \$13,000 raised during the 2008-2009 season, when centers first answered the BVL call for support.

"Not only are we proud that our sport continues to support BVL," noted Darlene Baker, chair, BVL board of directors, "but we are also proud that BVL operates efficiently and effectively—this year our management and operations costs totaled only 11 percent of our budget—we ensure that the money goes right to our veterans and the recreational and therapeutic programs and services that they have come to count on."

Helping those who served: Support the BVL

Most leagues should be reaching the one-third mark of their 30- to 35-week schedule. Prize funds should have been adopted more than a month ago, and the Audit Committee reviewed the league finances at least once (if not twice). League presidents: You need to ensure these duties are happening.

It's time to shift the focus to something very near and dear to this association, and that is BVL (Bowlers to Veterans Link), the only national sports organization dedicated to providing programs to our wounded and disabled veterans. BVL helps provide recreational equipment as well as arts and crafts materials for those who have served our country and fought for the freedoms that we enjoy each and every day. BVL also supports the nationally recognized entertainment troupe "Re-Creation", which visits hundreds of hospitals every year. I have personally

enjoyed performances of "Re-Creation" at the USBC Convention, so I can't begin to imagine the effect they have on our veterans. These are just two examples of how BVL funds are used.

This year marks the third in which we conducted an association mixed tournament in support of BVL, to where part of the proceeds will be donated. This year's venture added a singles event.

Over the years, the Nation's Capital Area USBC has been the top contributor amongst local associations in the country. Although we have fallen short of that top spot the last couple of years, we are always appreciative of the donations we receive from our membership to serve those who have served us.

So how can you help? In the near future, your lane representatives will visit the centers to collect donations for BVL. You can make an individual donation or your league can make a donation from a special collection or special events proceeds—ask your league officers and offer to coordinate the endeavor. You can also solicit pledges for BVL through either a flat fee or based on an amount per pin using a series bowled in your league; we will be happy to eMail you a pledge sheet.

League secretaries: Do yourself a favor and keep a list of any issues that arise during the season so that they can be reviewed and, if necessary, addressed dur-


ing the organizational meeting prior to next season.

Selecting an arsenal

Competitive bowlers invest the most and are the most likely candidates for building a wide-ranging arsenal of balls to cover needs across the large spectrum of centers, lane surface types, and the full range of oiling patterns. Most bowlers will make choices from several of the categories, and some bowlers may need options from each category.

This article provides bowlers the information to make a selection in several categories within a single brand, if the bowler so chooses to be loyal to a single brand. For those very few bowlers who are committed to being on a staff, the choices can be limited.

My personal recommendation would be that bowlers pick and choose the best available choices across the spectrum.

In the chart on page 11, most of the ball companies are listed, and the range covers reactive choices in heavy-long oil, medium oil, and light oil patterns, have equipment that would be appropriate for light oil.

Several of the manufacturers have a urethane choice in their lineup. For a full decade, urethane was top-of-the-line ball coverstock technology until reactive urethane evolved in the early 1990s. Urethane balls were for the most part made obsolete by reactive balls in terms of hitting power and ability to create larger angle of attack of the lanes. However, urethane will still play in today's environment with a "control-first" mind-

along with urethane and plastic options. Where possible, several balls per category are listed and are current releases within a single manufacturer brand. Please note, however, that not all brands set. Urethane would be better than weak reactive for bowlers with soft speed and a release that is not strong enough to allow them to move inside and bend the shot out and back to the pocket. Urethane also allows bowlers to play the old "down-and-in" style if the lane condition becomes erratic and over-responsive with reactive balls. Urethane will still arc but produce a flat mid-lane motion compared to reactive balls.

Several plastic ball options, including those with a stronger core, are listed as well; these stronger core balls would be for individuals with very soft speed and/ or for very dry lanes.

I usually find that bowlers with multiball arsenals have too many choices for medium-to-heavy oil as compared to options for light-oil situations.

There are variables such as a bowler's individual ball speed and release strength that need to be taken into account when picking the specific balls in each competitive bowler's arsenal. This does not take into account any variables of drilling patterns or surface changes that can impact ball performance.

If you have questions, you should consult your local pro shop operator.



The Case Book

League Protest Procedure

All written protests or complaints concerning the league rules, USBC playing rules or the league officers must be addressed first by your league board of directors for a decision. The board consists of the officers and team captains.

Upon receipt of a written protest or complaint, the league board of directors would meet, review the matter, and render a decision.

The league must keep a copy of the minutes reflecting discussion, quorum, vote count, and decision. After the decision is made, if either party feels the rules and regulations of your league or USBC have not been followed, an appeal may be filed at Bowling Headquarters in Arlington, Texas or the local bowling association office in accordance with USBC Rule 119.


Remember: File your complaint in writing with the league president who should then schedule a meeting at the next bowling session.


Where is Joe Bowler?

Week after week, the team is using Joe's absentee score. His league fees are not in the team envelope. The longer league fees go uncollected, the less likely they will be collected. If a bowler is gone for two consecutive sessions and the team has not communicated with the bowler. take a proactive approach and contact the bowler yourself. (See Rule 114a and Rule 115b for more information on withdrawal and collecting fees due.)

Withdrawal and arrearage factoids:

- > Verbal notice fulfills the notice requirement.
- > Two weeks are based on the calendar, not league sessions.
- > A member who withdraws properly with good reason is entitled to a prorated share of team prize money based on the number of weeks paid.
- > The league board determines good cause for withdrawal.
- > A league can file a complaint for up to six sessions of unpaid league fees.
- > A bowler must be notified of a meeting to file charges for failing to pay league fees.


