Pay early, earn rewards at 2014 USBC Open and Women's Championships

ARLINGTON, Texas – Teams entering the 2014 United States Bowling Congress Open and Women's Championships will be eligible for some great rewards just for signing up early.

Each member of teams paid in full by July 1, 2013, will receive \$20 in Championships Cash upon check-in at their respective tournaments in Reno, Nev., in 2014.

The vouchers can be used toward Bowling Ball Express, yearlong brackets products, merchandise at the USBC SportStore or at any of the USBC-run side tournaments being held in conjunction with the USBC Open and Women's Championships.

As an added bonus, Open Championships bowlers who meet the July 1 deadline and register for a 10:30 p.m. doubles and singles squad will earn a \$55 rebate as part of their prize checks, essentially bowling singles for free.

"We have so many dedicated bowlers and team captains," said Brian Lewis, USBC Managing Director of Tournaments. "This rewards program is a way for us to show our appreciation for their continued support of our tournaments."

The 2014 Open Championships will be held at Reno's National Bowling Stadium. The cost for each bowler is \$55 per event and \$15 for all-events for a total entry fee of \$180. Registration already is under way.

The 2014 Women's Championships will be held at the Reno-Sparks Convention Center, and registration also is under way. The event will feature four-player teams for the first time, a new divisional structure, and an all-scratch format.

MEMBERSHIP DEPT.

Steve Graves, a 2004 Hall of Fame inductee who moved to Florida a few years ago, died April 18. He served as association president for the 2002-2003 season and was involved in starting the Ways & Means Committee, with which he was extremely active. ... Meanwhile, Herb Zost, a 1997 inductee who was editor and co-publisher of the area's first tenpin bowling magazine, Ten Pin Journal, passed April 15. He was once a member of the Bowling Writers Association of America and the Professional Bowlers Association, and his late father, Carl Zost, was a 1971 inductee.

The 8th Annual DC's Finest Mixed Handicap Tournament will take place July 27-28 at Bowlerama Lanes in New Castle, Del. Features: teams (2 men/2 women), mixed doubles, singles (including a senior's handicap category for bowlers 55+), all events, and optional scratch events. Bowlers entered in singles must also bowl doubles the first time they bowl and vice versa. Enter singles multiple times but cash only once; enter doubles multiple times but cash only once with same partner; enter teams multiple times but cash only once, cash again by changing two members. Bowlers must use highest certified winter average from 2011-2012 for 21+ games or highest 2012-2013 winter average for 21+ games as of May 31, 2013 or, if neither, a summer league average based on 21+ games as of July 20, 2013. Handicap: 90 percent of 220. Entries, reentries, and walk-ins accepted based on lane availability until 1 p.m. on July 28, 2013. An entry blank appears in this issue.

Ian Conrad Penny, 12, scored 190-278-268/736 on a 189 average February 9 in the Juniors league at AMF Waldorf. ... Bowl America is relocating its Extreme Performance Pro Shop from its Fairfax center to Bull Run.

Ryan B. Harrison of Glen Burnie, Md., and Mack McLarty of Greenbelt, Md., recently were suspended from membership in the United States Bowling Congress. ... Steven E. Angel of Mechanicsville, Md.; Hoses Davis Jr., of Baltimore; Matthew M. Gunter of Arlington, Va.; Richard T. Windsor of Greenbelt, Md.; and Donnie D. Womack of the District have been reinstated to membership and again become eligible to compete in USBC leagues and tournaments with all of the attendant membership privileges.

The total cost for a four-player team at the Women's Championships will be \$560. Entering by mail, fax, or phone will require an additional \$10 processing fee per team and \$10 for each doubles/singles set.

June 1 deadline for league final averages

The 2012-2013 bowling season is almost over, and if you're like me, you're glad to see it end so that you can enjoy some summer activities.

League Secretaries:

> We as always urge you to get the final averages into the office on or before June 1, as this will give us enough time to get the Annual Averages books printed and delivered to your centers in time for the 2013-2014 league season. Send me an eMail if you wish to receive an electronic final average form. Please be sure to provide a Bowler ID Number and "Pins-Games-Average" totals for every bowler, even those who may have subbed just one time. Mark "L" or "R" (Left or Right) in the "Hand"

column on the form only if the bowler used the hand he/she did not normally use, such as due to injury. Otherwise, leave that area blank.

➤ Don't forget about the Triple Crown awards to be given to the male and/or female member with the league high game, series, and average—all three achievements.

> As a reminder, or perhaps it is news, membership cards purchased in the summer season are only good for this summer and will expire on July 31, 2013. (See page 14.)

> Remember to document any problems with your league rules so that you can get them changed at the up-



Champions declared in 68th Annual Women's Championship Tournament

A second successful defense of the Scratch Singles title, a second repeat champion, and two double winners were among the highlights in the NCAUSBCA 68th Annual Women's Championship Tournament that took place March 2-3, 16-17, and 23-24 at AMF Annandale.

"Divas-R-US-2" of Alexandria, Va., which consisted of Debra Moore (432 series), Christine Moore (576), Heidi Myers-King (479), and Marchel Smith (489), tallied 2,837 to win the Team title and \$1,600. Meanwhile, the "Pin Packers" foursome of Landover, Md., with Mary Smith (603), Willona Johnson (552), Decola Jones (565), and Catrina Snowden (588) totaled 2,308 to capture the Scratch Team title and \$330.

In the Doubles competition, Charlotte Herndon, Manassas, Va. (547), and Jacqueline Thomas, Alexandria, Va. (597), placed first with 1,513 to share \$1,000. Meanwhile, Nichele McConnell, Gwynn Oak, Md. (623) repeated as a Scratch Doubles champion, this time with Hall of Famer Terri Franklin, Clinton, Md. (566), and the pair split \$200 for their 1,189 score.

Sarah Bercaw, Alexandria, Va., scored 800 (569 scratch) to win the Singles event and \$700, while Quintina Jefferson, Capitol Heights, Md., recorded 673 to again repeat as champion in the Scratch Singles category. She earned \$125.

Bercaw's nine-game 2,274 total (1,581) also took home the All Events crown and \$475. Shanell Overton, Lorton, Va., won \$240 for the Scratch All Events with 1,846—the tourney's only 1,800 total.

Myrna Jenkins of Lanham, Md., was the other double winner, taking top honors in the two new prize divisions—the 55+ Handicap All Events with 2,230 (1,186) worth \$250 and the 55+ Handicap Singles with 772 (424) for \$300.





Staying sharp over the summer; "over/under"; following through

Q. I am shutting down bowling for the summer. How can I do this but maintain some sort of game for next season?

A. Don't shut down completely; you don't have to bowl every day, but try to go once a week at least. It will keep your mental and physical game in some order.

Also, remember summer is a great time to get to know your arsenal. Without the pressure of league or tournaments, you can better learn your equipment and plug the holes in your arsenal with a couple of new balls and at a better price. Bowling equipment is on sale in the summer during the times of less demand.

Summer is also a great time for lessons.

Q. What is the meaning of the term "over/under"?

A. "Over/under" occurs when you throw the ball and get immediate and violent hook, and then on the next shot, you try to adjust, and the ball just hangs and seemingly does not even begin to hook. No matter what you do, this "over/under" reaction keeps happening.

Over/under can take place for a variety of reasons. You may just need to use a ball with a different surface. It could be that you are playing the wrong part of the lane or that your timing is off and causing you to turn the ball early. In fact, early turn is one of the most common reasons for under/over, right next to ball surface.

These are the most common fixes. If you are still having problems, get a coach to help you.

Q. My teammates have been telling me I that I am not following through. Is there something I can do to remember to follow through?

A. Before beginning your approach, do some mental imaging. Picture yourself finishing at the line with a perfect follow-through. Then, when you get to the release point, picture a nail in the ceiling. The nail is sticking out and needs to be driven into the ceiling. You drive it into the ceiling with your thumb.

This will help to make you follow through every time.



Book Review

Mark Miller's *Bowling* well worth your time

Sportswriter and bowling historian Mark Miller recently published an historical account of the sport, *Bowling*. The book is a concise yet detailed description of the evolution of America's greatest indoor pastime. A variety of historical and contemporary photos throughout enhance and reinforce the content, making it an easy read for bowling and non-bowling fans alike.

Miller begins with a discussion of contemporary bowling in America and describes four levels of participation in the sport: open play, leagues, tournament, and elite. He goes on to describe the continued existence of variations of bowling in New England and the Mid-Atlantic states known as candlepins and duckpins. By far, however, tenpins is the most prevalent form of bowling throughout the country today.

While nobody knows exactly when bowling began, Miller tells of potential beginnings in the Stone Age, findings in Egypt (dated 3200 B.C.), and the gradual movement of various forms of kegling from Europe to the United States in the early 1600s. Early bowlers used implements such

tions in ABC and WIBC paralleled America's history of limiting participation of non-whites and females and ultimately allowed participation by all Americans. He describes the evolution of bowling into the modern era, including the boom in league participation between World War II through the 1970s and popular bowling programs on television, including "Celebrity Bowling," "Jackpot Bowling," and "Make That Spare."

Finally, Miller discusses the growth in technology and identifies a variety of circumstances that likely contributed to the decline in league bowling participation. Despite this decline,

as rocks, balls, bones, and wooden discs to knock down their targets.

Miller recounts the development of organized bowling in America, including membership organizations such as the National Bowling Association (TNBA), the American Bowling Congress (ABC), the Women's International Bowling Congress (WIBC), and the American Junior Bowling Congress (subsequently known as the Young American Bowling Alliance). As organizers of America's greatest indoor pastime, membership restric-


bowling is one of the fastest-growing high school sports, and youth bowling and collegiate programs are offering more scholarships than ever.

Miller's overall treatment of the history of America's greatest indoor pastime is well worth your time.





Unlocking the mind

By Malcolm James

I can't tell you how many times I performed poorly in a tournament, and yet on the drive home, I could go on and on about what I did wrong. So what was missing? Bowling is a game of consistency and repetition regarding the physical game, but I lacked the most crucial part needed to compete at the higher levels: the mental game.

Allowing your mental game to grow requires practice, just like your physical game. I often see young bowlers who can throw one bad shot, and their game is gone. They don't have a strong mental game to put that frame behind them so they can make the best of the frames that lie ahead.

I would recommend working on your mental game with your local USBC-Certified Coach. There are a number of drills and techniques that can help you deal with everything from distractions to managing your nerves. As a member of the self-proclaimed NCAUSBCA Jr. Dream Team, I can say this has been the single greatest asset I have.
