Club Meade to host Hall of Fame Induction & Dinner Celebration

Five to be inducted October 5; gate list will provide easy entry into Fort Meade

NCAUSBCA's 2013 Hall of Fame Induction & Dinner Celebration will take place Saturday, October 5 at Club Meade, Fort George G. Meade's full-service dining and catering facility, located at 6600 Mapes Road in Fort Meade, Md. The event begins with a "Meet & Greet" session with cash bar at 4 p.m. and a plated dinner featuring London Broil, Chicken Marsala, or a vegetarian option that's scheduled to start at 5 p.m. The induction ceremony will follow dinner.

The Hall of Fame's "Class of 2013" features five individuals—longtime league secretary and league/tournament promoter Dena Kearney; Dean Ryan, the former center manager of The Lanes Fort Meade who has been one of the area's biggest proponents of Sport Bowling; along with top area bowlers Donny Carr, Gregory L. Turner, and Terry "T" Wiley.

Tickets, which cost \$40, are now available at the NCAUSBCA office and soon may be ordered through many association board members. Ticket holders must write their name on the ticket stub and return it to the NCAUSBCA office so that the name can be placed on a special gate list for the event that will allow, with Photo ID, easy entry into Fort Meade. The back of the ticket stub can be used to include names of other attendees with whom the ticket holder wishes to be seated.

SUMMER MEMBERSHIPS LAST ALL SUMMER

While USBC memberships purchased after March 15 "expire" July 31, 2013, they will cover the extent of all summer leagues and tournaments through October 1. At the 2012 USBC Annual Meeting, the delegates passed an amendment which removed the statement that memberships purchased after March 15 were valid for the following season as well. As a result of this amendment, all bowlers will need to purchase a 2013-2014 membership before competing in a fall/winter league or tournament.

USBC OFFERS OFFICER CERTIFICATION PROGRAM

The USBC Officer Certification Program teaches league presidents, secretaries, and treasurers his or her responsibilities for the office positions he or she holds or wishes to seek. To become a certified officer, a member must first go through the instructional course and then pass the exam. Prior to taking an officer course, all members will have to take USBC's Basic Bowling Knowledge Course and pass the exam. A one-time \$25 registration fee is required. Once paid, members will be able to take any course he or she desires. Additional information is available [here](#). This program is not mandatory. Meanwhile, NCAUSBCA encourages all officers, at the very least, to thoroughly review USBC Rule 102 (League Officers) to understand the basic duties of each officer position.

Looking for input on achievement awards

The 2012-2013 bowling “year” has come to a close and, with it, my second one-year term as president of your association.

Our sport is undergoing a transformation at the national level with respect to the achievement awards program. Starting with the 2014-2015 season, those achievement awards will be discontinued at the national level, and the responsibility placed with the local associations to provide. I've received some mixed feedback over this and would like to share some positive aspects.

Instead of a “one size fits all” con-

cept, each association can put together an awards program tailored to its membership. And it does not have to be actual awards; some “outside the box” thinking could bring forth a program where, for example, a point value could be associated with each award that could be redeemed at your local pro shop or select area merchants.

Over the years, these awards have been received differently by different leagues: Some look forward to them, while, for others, it does not matter. This is an opportunity to put some-

thing together that better reflects what you all want to see.

If you have ideas for an awards or recognition program, please do not hesitate to let us know what they are. Your association has over 20,000 members, so we may not be able to please everyone. Your input, however, can help in which direction to take matters.

The upcoming fall/winter leagues are around the corner and are usually preceded by their respective organizational meetings. While those are not always well attended, it is there that crucial aspects of the league are decided: weekly fees, league schedule, position rounds, and holiday breaks. Some leagues also hold their officer elections at that time, while others do that prior to the completion of the previous season.

Heroes bowl with the pros spells victory

The official name of Storm's second Wounded Warrior project was called Morale, Welfare, and Recreation Project. "Heroes Bowl with the Pros" was the user friendly title that describes another wonderful heartfelt Storm event.

And so it was in May that the Storm Team descended on the Bethesda Naval Bowling Center – Building 56 on a mission of bowling, appreciation, and goodwill.

Heroes Bowl with the Pros was the second event of its kind for The Bowler's Company. It is a way of giving back to the men and women who served our country.

The Wounded Warriors were from all branches of the military, and this year's heroes had more significant injuries than those who attended the Storm Soldier and Family Assistance Project held last year at The Lanes Fort Meade.

This year's Storm ensemble included Liz Johnson, Jeff Carter, Peter Somoff, Mike Sinek, Mike Luongo, Mickey Luongo, Dale Niemela, Jeff Baker, Latise Baker, Chris Johnson, Rick Graham, and Louie Wemett. Ron Adkins from Dexter also attended.

Many of the 60 or so soldiers were amputees, suffered from Post Traumatic Brain Injuries from IEDs, or had other debilitating injuries while serving and protecting all Americans.

"We are on par from our turnout last year," said Storm's Mike Sinek, a NCAUSBCA director who was instrumental in founding the Storm Wounded Warrior Projects. "Bethesda is the home of military medicine, and it is important that we can focus on the Warriors and their rehabilitation first-hand. The projects offer the soldiers something other than their usual rehab or gym visits."

Quite simply, the bowling is fun. It offers the Warriors a chance to get

away from their routine and free their minds of all with which they have to deal.

There was plenty of healthy bowling instruction exhibited by the pros. The Warriors were appreciative.

"After last year's project, Storm's response was, 'Where can we do another Wounded Warrior event?' said Sinek. "Bethesda is a higher profile venue. The Wounded Warrior Staff embraced the project last year after viewing the video and hearing from the attendees. The net result was higher participation rehab rates, up to 50 percent. The carryover effect was better social improvement and faster transition out of programs and into everyday life."

All of the Warriors received bowling equipment from Storm Products, Master Industries, Vice, Dexter Shoes, Bowlingball.com, Kegel, Bowl-

er's Supply, and Threadworks. Additional items were donated by USBC, Delong Unlimited, and Bowlers Journal International.

"What is special about these events is getting a chance to see the soldiers enjoy themselves in this environment," said Storm's Mike Luongo. "The Warriors love bowling, and many had bowled in leagues before they were injured. It is a lot of fun."

"I do clinics all over the world, and these events are the most rewarding I ever do," said Storm's Dale Niemela. "The gentleman I was coaching in the wheelchair now has a 'bowling strategy.' It isn't just bowling and rolling the ball; he thinks he can beat his wife now, which is the big thing."

Champions crowned at 68th Annual Open Championship Tournament

The BCBC (Barnyard Crew Bowling Club) #2 fivesome from Camp Springs, Md., with Marv Norris (621), Odis Williams (534), David Barge (652), Yancy Alexander (678), and Joe Queen (645) tallied 3,891 to capture the Team Event in the NCAUSBCA 68th Annual Open Championship Tournament that was conducted in April at Bowl America Fairfax (team) and Bowl America Falls Church (singles & doubles).

Meanwhile, a 3,440 score by "The World vs Us" from Woodbridge, Va., which consisted of Arthur Vroom Jr. (700), Supachai Papee (642), Debbie Myers-Barnes (728), Wilbert Windsor (621), and Darryl Carreon (749) took home the Scratch Team title.

Tom Kim (620) and Dale Lion (815) of Fairfax Station, Va., won the Doubles division with a 1,634 score that included a handicap of 199. The Woodbridge, Va., duo of Michael Herman and Charles Campbell secured the Scratch Doubles title with 1,493.

Matthew Warner of Upper Marlboro, Md., was victorious in the Singles Event with 849 (690 scratch). John Fillis of Stafford, Va., won his second consecutive association championship, the Scratch Singles with a score of 795.

Samuel Norman Jr., of Upper Marlboro was victorious in the All Events with 2,395, while Paul Rumbaugh II of Stafford, Va., earned the Scratch All Events with his 2,181 total.

A pair of Hall of Famers emerged victorious in the new prize categories offered for bowlers 55 and older that were sponsored by the Sports Plus/Carmen Don Pro Shop. Andy Anderson of Falls Church, Va., recorded 820 (775 scratch) to take top honors in the 55+ Handicap Singles, while



ASK BOB • BOB KORTH

You write these tips: Why do you need lessons?

Q. I saw in a recent article that you took some lessons. Why? You write these tips. Why do you need lessons?

A. I am glad you asked this question. I don't care how long you have bowled. I don't care how much you know about bowling. I don't care how good you are or think you are. No one knows everything, and you certainly can't see yourself in the act of bowling. What you think you are doing is not always what you are doing. For some unknown reason, many bowlers seem to think the game is easy and lessons are not needed.

Those of you who golf would not hesitate to take golf lessons to get even a stroke better. Bowlers, on the

other hand, will not take a lesson to gain 10 pins of average.

I am 71 years old and have bowled for 60 years. I have averaged over 200 every year for 52 consecutive years, and I need lessons at times to get or keep my game together.

This time was to regain the ball

speed I have lost since getting older. I got tips from my lessons at Kegel and with my coaching friend Ron Clifton from North Carolina that have gained me about two miles per hour of ball speed.

Lessons from qualified coaches can improve anybody's game, no matter

what age or experience the bowler. The touring pros take lessons and work on their game all the time; they must to stay competitive.

If they need coaching, why not you or me?

Q. I have been bowling for five years now. My average is 163 and has not improved for at least two years. I have bought several new balls and a spare ball but nothing changes. How can I get over this hump?

A. First and foremost, read the answer above. Along with this advice, please take this to heart: Listen to what a coach tells you. Try it, even if at first it feels strange or you think it is not working. Change takes time.

Then work very hard on your spares. At the 160 to 190 level, the holdup encountered in average building is caused by the spare making ability.

Getting better at spares will raise your average quicker than anything else. Just one extra spare a game equals 10 pins plus in average—not counting the fact that as you get more accurate at spares, you will also get more accuracy on the first ball. This will get you more strikes.

Don't let the cost of lessons deter you from taking 6 to 10 of them that will cost you less than that new ball—and lessons last a lifetime.

Q. I want to practice more, but I can't afford more than about four to five games a week. Is there a way to practice for less?

Amara Smith-Speights wins Va. State Pepsi title by huge margin in “perfect” season

A 330-pin divisional victory earlier this year in the state finals of the Virginia State Pepsi USBC Youth Championships is among the latest bowling accomplishments

of Amara Smith-Speights, 12, a sixth-grader at Rippon Middle School in Woodbridge, Va., where she has been a straight “A” student the past three years and a player on the junior varsity basketball team.

She entered the competition at AMF Hanover in Mechanicsville, Va., with a

193 average and began with a 603 three-game total, then ran away from the field with games of 246-238-205 (689) to secure her title and \$425 in scholarship funds.

This occurred shortly after Amara scored her first career perfect game at Bowl America Woodbridge on March 23, 2013, a day she called the greatest of her life. The perfect helped her earn the NCAUSBCA Triple Crown Award in the Strike Force League, in which she averaged 201 and also recorded her highest of four 700 series during the season, 791.

Having earlier qualified for her first North Pointe Junior Gold Championships that recently took place in Detroit, she competed in the “Under 15 Girls” category and tied for 72nd place in a field of 169, averaging 163.4 for 15 qualifying games on the demanding lane conditions.

Amara, who started bowling at age 5 under the tutelage of her grandfather, Bruce Smith, is always striving

to improve—even watching bowling on YouTube—and her record demonstrates success in her endeavors. In successive youth league seasons



at Bowl America Woodbridge beginning in 2008-2009, her average has advanced from 110 to 142 to 164 to 174 to 201 this past season, when she also averaged 200 in the Sunday Youth Adult League at Bowl America Woodbridge and 161 in the Youth Travel Scholarship (Sport) League.

Amara, whose favorite pro bowlers are Pete Weber, Scott Norton, and Kelly Kulick, appreciates the support she receives from her favorite bowler—her mother, Teri Smith—and from Barry Clark, manager of Bowl America Woodbridge.

There’s sure to be more written about this youngster’s bowling efforts in the days ahead.

A. Ask at your local center if there are any special days that bowling is offered for less. Many have specials, especially in the summer months. Some centers offer special rates for league bowlers. Some centers sell cards with blocks of 25, 50, or 100 games paid up front for less money per game.

You can also get the most out of your practice dollar by shooting your spares first and the strike ball second. For example, shoot the 10-pin first and then at the pocket with the next ball. This will get you twice as many shots for the same money.

What do you get for a strike in practice? You get one shot instead of two.

Q. I have always been amazed that a 15- or 16-pound ball would deflect as much as it does when contacting a 3½-pound pin. Do you know how this happens?

A. The pin is sitting on a base of about two inches in diameter. The part of the ball touching the lane is extremely small, so when it contacts the pin, the weight of the pin plus the amount of surface it sits on has a deflection effect on the ball because of that small amount of surface the ball sits on.

Not to mention the ball has just rolled down a lane with oil on the surface of the lane which the ball picks up. This reduces the amount of friction between the ball and the lane even more.


