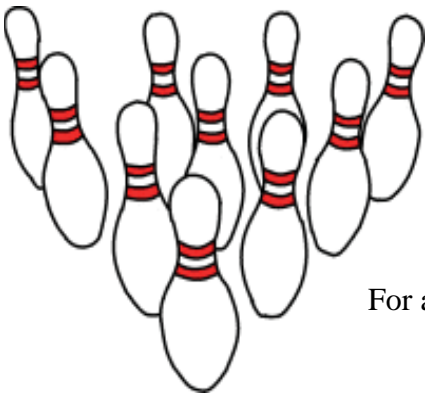

Starting with breakfast at the White House and ending with a private meeting with Veterans Affairs Secretary Robert McDonald, BVL representatives participated in a variety of activities honoring our nation's veterans on November 11, 2015.

BVL special guest BPAA Executive Director Frank DeSocio joined BVL Board Member Glenn Carano at the White House for breakfast where they had the opportunity to meet with the President and Vice President. "We were privileged to be there with an array of Veterans Service Organization leaders—from the Medal of Honor Society to the Blue Star Mothers of America. These organizations, like BVL, work hard every day to make sure our nation's veterans are remembered for their sacrifices and receive the best care possible. Sharing the day with them was an honor," stated DeSocio.

Representing BVL in the Presidential Color Guard—that opens and closes the official Veteran's Day celebration at Arlington National Cemetery—were Mary Harrar, of Thunderbird Lanes (Pa.), who carried the BVL flag, and her sister, Betty Carleo (a Veteran's Liaison for Bucks County, Pa.), who carried the U.S. flag.

Following the ceremony, BVL Board members Marci Williams, Libbi Fletcher, Anthony Colangelo, and Glenn Carano laid a BVL wreath at the Tomb of the Unknowns. As with

NCAUSBCA President Larry Gonzales died on October 22, 2015 following his recent battle with leukemia. He was 76. Gonzales, who resided in Fort Washington, Md., joined the association's board of directors in 2008 and began his one-year term as president on August 1, 2015. He served as tournament director of the NCAUSBCA Mixed Scratch Doubles event. A memorial service will be held in January, according to Mrs. Gonzales. Hall of Fame nominations proposal changes deadline date to January 31

A proposal by NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame Committee co-chair Judith Butler that would, along with voting and procedural changes, advance the deadline date for Hall of Fame nominations from April 30 to January 31, is expected to be considered by the association's board of directors at its December 19 meeting. Should the board vote to approve the proposal, those members planning to nominate a candidate for the Hall of Fame's "Class of 2016" would have six weeks to complete and submit the nomination.

The following guidelines are presented below for those wishing to prepare a Hall of Fame nomination.

All NCAUSBCA members have the privilege of submitting nominations to the Hall of Fame Committee for consideration. Nominations are open to all bowlers and non-bowlers who by their efforts have furthered the interests of the sport of bowling in the Nation's Capital Area.

Any person (league officer, proprietor, sponsor, association officer, director, press/radio/TV personality, etc.) who has demonstrated long-term or significant contri-

butions is considered suitable for nomination. Nominations must contain the full name of the nominee and a *one*-page biography including the reason(s) for nomination in one of the categories listed below:

Meritorious Service

- Promotion that created growth of the game.
- Obtained recognition of the game.
- Promoted public acceptance.
- Service to bowlers.

Bowling Achievement

- Bowling achievement.
- Image.

Transitioning lanes, first balls, socks on shoes, and more

Q. *I am having a problem in league deciding if I need to move or if I am making bad shots. In the first game, I am hitting the pocket and striking. Later in that game, I start going light and leaving the 10-pin. Then all of a sudden, I am going high and getting splits. Would you move or is it just bad bowling?*

A. With your description of events, I believe this is definitely a case of the lanes transitioning. When you start going light and leaving the 10, you are seeing oil carry down. You need to move right just a board or so with your

feet to get the ball to finish higher in the pocket. Then pay close attention so that as soon as you see the ball move high, like when you leave a 4-pin, consider a move left, probably at least two or three boards with your feet and one to two boards left with your target. The reason is the heads are drying out, and you need to find some fresh oil in the front part of the lane.

One of the hardest parts of our modern game is staying ahead of lane transitions. So just watch your ball reaction and move first when the ball acts differently; this way, you only waste one shot if you are wrong. You can always move back where you were.

Here is another piece of advice when you make the move: *Do it with conviction.* Know in your mind you are right. If you don't, you will not throw the ball well, and you won't know for sure if your move will work. Then you have to try it again, and you might be wasting more shots.

Q. *I am 15 years old and bowl for my high school team. I am getting my first ball of my own, and my question is, What weight should I get? Should I get a thumb insert and finger grips?*

A. For the first answer, go to your pro shop and show them the ball you use, and have them watch you bowl. They can make the determination on what weight you should go with.

As for a thumb insert, I don't think it is necessary right now. That being said, many pro shops like to use them to insure a clean release. The different cores in the balls can sometimes be a little tacky, and the thumb slug will eliminate this problem. This works especially well if you decide to have more than one ball. The feel will be more consistent.

As for finger grips, my advice is not right now. Finger grips are tacky and give you a little more turn or lift on the ball. You are still growing and developing, and I believe they can be hard on growing tendons from the added stress. You can always have them added later after high school days if you think they will help.

I know there are many high school bowlers using finger grips, and they may not have problems, but I am of the opinion that it is better to be safe than sorry. Tendon problems are a nightmare for bowlers.

Q. *I have noticed some bowlers in my league put a sock over the shoe on the slide foot of the bowling shoes. What is the reason for this?*

A. You are seeing more and more bowlers use a sock on the slide foot since the advent of synthetic lanes and approaches. Synthetic approaches seem to be more difficult to slide on. Many of them are on the tacky side. This can be hard on bowlers to stay consistent when sliding. So the sock over the slide sole gives consistency to the approaches.

For the most part, all approaches you bowl on will seem the same. The sock does take some getting used to. It makes the approach seem pretty slick, but people I know who use them swear by them.

Q. *I have been asked to go to the 2016 USBC Open Championships Tournament in Reno, Nev., this next year. I love to bowl in tournaments but have never considered the nationals. I am on limited funds and need to get time off from my job. I know there are many entries in this tournament, and winning money in the nationals is difficult. Can you give me any good reasons for going to this tournament?*

A. There are several good reasons for making the nationals an annual event:

- It is the biggest tournament in the country.
- There is a lot of tradition in the USBC Open that no other tournament has.
- Yes, it is difficult to win, but you never know if your game happens to match up that it is possible to win. The nationals pay many plac-

es, so you can most likely get some money back.

➤ Going to the nationals is more than just going to another tournament. It is an experience, and it can be a vacation. The 2017 tournament will be in Las Vegas.

Every third year, it will go to some other city in the United States. This gives you a reason to explore other parts of the country.

If you are on a time limit, you can fly. I always tried to take a week or two, so I drive; this way, I could stop when I wanted and really see the country. This makes the na-

tionals my favorite tournament, even though I might not have great scores.

We only get to go around once in this life, so make the most of it. It is really not as expensive as you think to do the nationals; try it once, and you will be hooked.

Q. *I just bowled in a tournament last month where the shot was much tougher than advertised. We were supposed to be on the house shot. This, however, was no house shot—the lanes were terrible, the scores were terrible, and everyone had a rough time, especially me. The more I tried to make good shots, the worse I bowled. What is the key for bowling on a shot that seems impossible?*

A. If you bowl in tournaments at all, this has happened to you. Sometimes it seems as though there is just nothing you can do to make things better. It has happened to me more than once. Sometimes the conditions just

don't fit your game. Then, you just have to do your best and move on.

There is a way to lessen the problems if not completely solve them: When a shot does not fit us, we try harder. This seems like the right thing to do, but it makes us worse: Trying too hard causes us to help the ball, or as some say, *steer* the ball.

You have to relax even more than normal: Let the ball tell you where you need to play the lanes. Try different balls; you need to make sure the ball is matching up to the condition. If the ball doesn't match up, you have no chance. That is why we

have more than one ball in our arsenal.

If the lanes are tough, everyone else is struggling, too. Do the best you can, and make your spares for your best chance to win.

Q. *I have just started bowling again after 20 years, and I am dropping the ball all the time. I never used to drop the ball. A friend of mine gave me a ball to use; it fits fine and doesn't hurt me, so what do you think the problem could be?*

A. The first thing I would look at is the ball fit. Even if it feels fine to you, it could still be the span or pitches in the thumb or fingers causing the problem. Go to the pro shop and have them check it out. Also, if they offer lessons, take one because it could be a timing problem.

Check out the ball first because no lesson can overcome a bad fit.

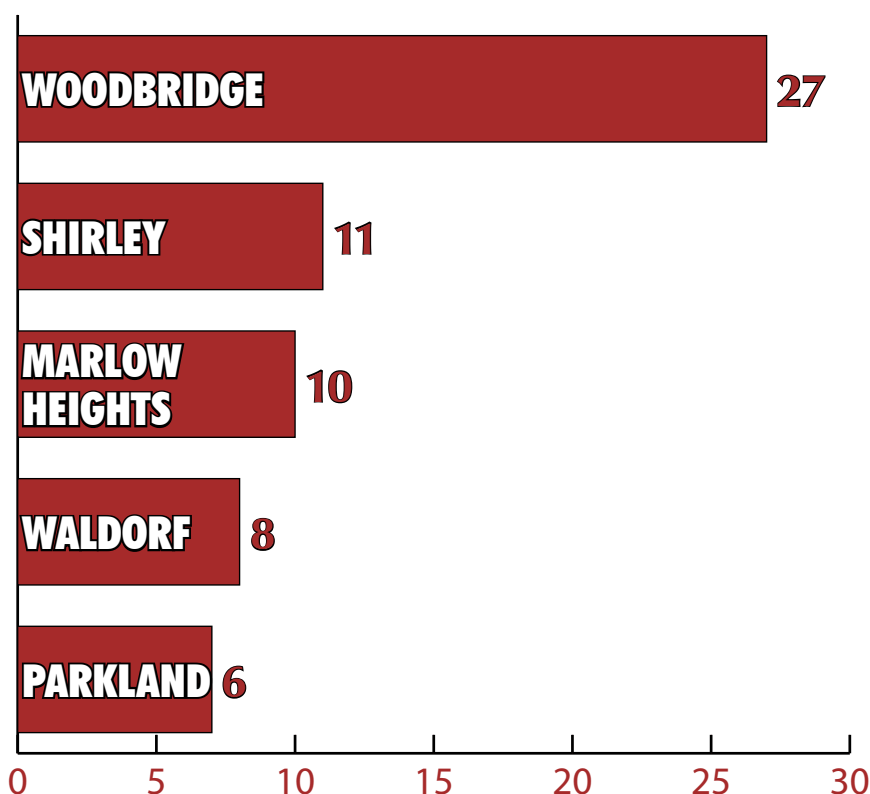
