NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame member **Mike Hahn** of Sterling, Va., died September 12 at age 70. The fiery right-hander, considered by many observ-

ers as one of the best bowlers ever in this area, ranked six times in the association's "Top 10," including three consecutive seasons beginning in 1968-1969 as No. 2 to Jim Robinette. He placed sixth in 1983-1984 even after injuries had curtailed his schedule. In the 1990s, in an attempt to return stature to scratch competition in this area, he founded the Nation's Capital/Baltimore Area Masters Scratch Tournament Bowlers Club. "For a multiyear period, he was simply unbeatable in this area," said

Gary "Guru" Parsons. After noting online comments by Stephen Hahn, Hall of Famer Bobby Michaelson, who also competed against his father in the 1970s, wrote: "Losing a parent is never easy, but I hope Stephen finds solace in knowing that there are many of us who share the same admiration for his father. As a true Patriot, boxer, tough-as-nails bowler, and private family man, Mike Hahn's legacy will serve as a touchstone for future generations to come. Mike Hahn might have been a tough S.O.B., but I bet, after you

stripped the layers, you found a 'Teddy Bear.' Farewell, my friend, and thanks for letting me briefly share the bowling spotlight with you." ... **Sonja Debrew**, Temple Hills, Md., lost her battle with cancer on September 18. A two-time "Top 10" bowler, it was only last year when she scored 762 on games of 236-279-247 while teaming with Warren Wiggins to capture the Doubles title and place second in Scratch Doubles in the NCAUSBCA Open Championship Tournament. She was 44.



This meeting is open to all members of the Nation's Capital Area USBC Association. You must provide proof of current membership to be admitted to the meeting. Only those ages 14 or older may vote.

Directions to NCAUSBCA Office Building:

From the Capital Beltway (I-495), take Exit 15A (outside the Beltway) at Central Avenue. You'll soon drive underneath an overpass. Get into the far right lane and take Harry S Truman Drive (North), looping around so that you ultimately end up *on* the overpass you just drove under. As you approach the overpass, start to move over toward the left lane.

From the overpass, turn left at the *second* traffic light (Lottsford Road) and drive 1/10 mile until you reach the Stop sign at the bottom of the hill. Proceed directly into the parking area across the street at the two-story "Engineer Center" building that has "9315" on top of it. The check-in desk for Annual Membership Meeting attendees will be just inside the front door; the meeting will take place on the Second Floor via elevator or stairs.

3 Championship Tournament games is the "key" to listings consideration

With the expected growth of "Sport" and "Challenge" leagues in the coming seasons, the NCAUSBCA board of directors at its October meeting approved a proposal that would recognize high average achievement of the Top 10 NCAUSBCA male and female adult bowlers in three "Official Average Leaders" categories: Sport League, Challenge League, and House/Standard League. Averages will be based only on 66 or a Sport league where averages did not count toward the required second league for ranking and thus Sport leaguers had to bowl in a *third* league in perhaps a different center for consideration.

In addition, a minimum of nine games in the NCAUSBCA Open Championship Tournament was a rankings requirement for men, while women needed nine games in the NCAUSBCA Women's Cham-

more games bowled in a certified NCAUSBCA league.

The new program takes effect this season.

Under the former "official rankings" program, there were numerous high-average bowlers who were eliminated from rankings consideration due to competing in only one league, one center, or in pionship Tournament. Conflicts in scheduling could at times be a problem for some members to bowl all nine games.

Under this new association program, bowling only three games in the association's Open (men) or Women's (women) Championship Tournament is the key that will automatically open members

to consideration for official average recognition. It makes no difference in how many leagues or centers one bowls; what matters is the *type* of league—Sport, Challenge, or House/Standard. Thus, it is most important that secretaries mark the proper category on their league certification application.

In each category, 10 men and 10 women will be listed, and a qualifying bowler can be recognized in all three categories.

Thus, any NCAUSBCA member this season who bowls at least 66 games in just one league can appear in the Official Average Leaders listings, and up to 60 bowlers—30 men and 30 women—will have the opportunity to be on these lists.

So remember: Bowling a minimum of three Championship Tournament games is the simple key to opening this opportunity.

The importance of taking lessons; stretching your practice dollar

Q. You have many times mentioned that to improve your game, you should take some lessons. So my question is, do you take lessons?

A. This is a great question; the answer is yes, I do take lessons. It makes no difference how much knowledge of the game you have or how good you are or how good you are or how good you think you are. It is not always possible to feel what may be wrong with your own game. You need someone else's eyes to catch a flaw in your game.

I have never figured out why bowlers think the game is easy and they don't need lessons to get better. Golfers don't hesitate to get a lesson to take one stroke off their game, but bowlers will not get a lesson to increase their average by 10 pins.

I am now 75, and I have averaged 200 every season since I was 19. Yes, that is 56 consecutive years. I take lessons to keep my game up. You can never learn too much. All the touring pros have instructors to stay competitive, so get some instruction and keep practicing. This will improve your game.

ANSWERS: 1, AMF Capital Plaza; 2, Bowl America Dranesville; 3, Bowl America Shirley; 4, February 25, 2018; 5, False; 6, False; 7, False; **A.** There are a few things that can be done to save money. Some centers have cards for sale that let you buy 25 or 50 or some even 100 games up front at a reduced rate. After you bowl, they simply punch those games out on the card you get. Some centers will have a designated day or two during the week that you can bowl for a reduced rate. Some offer a reduced price for league members.

Then there is my tip for any or all of your practice. You don't win one thing by getting a strike in practice. What you do get is one less shot. So throw your spare first.

Say you are struggling with the 10-pin; shoot at that first and then throw your strike ball at the remaining pins next. You have effectively doubled your practice dollar.

Q. I have misplaced my information on the Thumb Carpets you sell. Can you send me your address?

A. Yes, but first let me explain what Thumb Carpets are. They are a soft thumb insert that goes in the back of the thumb hole. They take the place of about three pieces of white bowlers tape. They are the same shape as bowlers tape. Because there is a yarn surface, you will get no suction from the hole being too tight. This reduces swelling.

There are two ways to put the carpet in the hole that makes your release slow or fast. You get a tight fit, yet a clean release.

Once you try these, you will be hooked. I can also do bulk orders if you want some to sell yourself. I will also send you instructions on use and installation.




