From the Capital Beltway (I-495), take Exit 15A (outside the Beltway) at Central Avenue. You'll soon drive underneath an overpass. Get into the far right lane and take Harry S Truman Drive (North), looping around so that you ultimately end up *on* the overpass you just drove under. As you approach the overpass, start to move over toward the left lane.

From the overpass, turn left at the *second* traffic light (Lottsford Road) and drive 1/10 mile until you reach the Stop sign at the bottom of the hill. Proceed directly into the parking area across the street at the two-story "Engineer Center" building that has "9315" above the doors of the main entrance. The check-in desk for Annual Membership Meeting attendees will be just inside the front door; the meeting will take place on the Second Floor via elevator or stairs.

June 15 application deadline for PBA Billy Welu Scholarship

\$1,000 prize offered to a collegiate bowler

The Professional Bowlers Association Billy Welu Scholarship is awarded annually, recognizing exemplary qualities in male or female college students who compete in the sport of bowling.

The scholarship winner receives \$1,000. To be eligible candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintain at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent.

Applications must be postmarked by June 15.

The scholarship was established to annually recognize a college student who combines outstanding bowling talents with academic excellence.

The late Welu was best known for his expert analysis alongside legendary ABC broadcaster and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Schenkel on the popular "Pro Bowlers Tour" series. Welu was a two-champion PBA Tour champion and was a member of the PBA Hall of Fame's inaugural induction class in 1975.

NCAUSBCA ALL-EVENTS PARTICIPATION RULE CHANGED

NEW THIS YEAR: Those entering the upcoming NCAUSBCA Women's and Open Championship Tournaments will for the first time have their highest 9-game total (from Team and Singles & Doubles events) used to determine their All-Events and/or Scratch All-Events total. This season, the participation rule was changed in both tournaments so that individuals who participate multiple times will have their *highest* series in each event used instead of the *first* series. As an added bonus, all bowlers who enter All-Events and/or Scratch All-Events will pay only once to enter each event.

GAINES, WISEMAN ELECTED TO USBC HALL OF FAME

Two bowlers familiar to many members, NCAUSBCA Hall of Famer **Kendra (Cameron) Gaines**, formerly of Gambrills, Md., who now resides in Orlando, Fla., and Baltimore's Danny Wiseman, recently were elected to the USBC Hall of Fame. They will be inducted along with Jeri Edwards, Tennelle Milligan, John Janawicz, and Tim Mack. The induction ceremony for the 2018 USBC Hall of Fame Class will take place April 25 at the USBC Convention at the Grand Sierra Resort in Reno, Nevada. Through 2017, there are 419 members of the USBC Hall of Fame -- 218 in Superior Performance, 117 in Meritorious Service, 50 in Veterans, 20 in Pioneers, and 14 in Outstanding USBC Performance. The USBC Hall of Fame was created in 2005 by merging the former American Bowling Congress and Women's International Bowling Congress Halls of Fame. change ideas for ways to make local bowling better.


Awards: We have not seen many youth awards thus far this season. Are they not being applied for or just too hard to earn?



Mixed Tournament raises over \$8,000 for BVL

Extra weekend added to 2018 event

More than \$8,000 was raised for the Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL), supporting hospitalized and disabled veterans, in connection with the NCAUSBCA 8th Annual Mixed Tournament in Support of BVL presented by Sports Plus/Carmen Don Pro Shop of Alexandria, Va., that occurred at Bowl America Shirley on December 9-10, 2017.

The funds were raised through entry fees (approximately \$2.50 out of each handicap entry and \$1 out of each optional scratch entry and all-events). In addition, all proceeds from 50/50 raffles and ball raffles (balls were donated) plus \$1 from each bracket and high game side pot entry went to BVL. Funds also came from the Silent Auction and Instant Raffle opportunities.

The tournament featured a 25 percent increase in teams with 54 (eight scratch), 125 doubles (28 scratch), 250 singles (66 scratch), and 181 all-events (60 scratch) entries. There also were 144 entries in the 50+ handicap singles (50 scratch).

Tournament Manager Tom Dale announced an additional weekend will be added for the 2018 event, which will return to Bowl America Shirley on December 1-2 and 8-9.

Dale expressed "special thank yous" to presenting sponsor Sports Plus/Carmen Don Pro Shop and to event sponsors WW Contractors Inc., and Rift & Friendly Bowling Distributors.





Rule 319d. Reporting Prior Prize Winnings

1. Within the last 12-month period, anyone who has qualified for a cash and/or merchandise prize in the position standings prize list in a tournament, including all-events, special features, special prizes and donated prizes, must give tournament management the following information prior to participation for possible average adjustment:
 - a. The name of each tournament in which they have been paid the following prizes, or if not yet paid, in which they have qualified for the prize:
 - 1) \$300 or more in any event;**
 - 2) Total combined prize winnings of \$500 or more in any one tournament;**
 - 3) Total combined prize winnings of \$1,000 or more in all tournaments within the last 12 months;**
 - b. The amount of the prize.
 - c. The actual score bowled to qualify for the prize.
 - d. The prize position.
2. Failure to comply with these provisions is cause for a forfeiture of entry fees and prize winnings.

NOTE:

Qualified is defined as the date and time the tournament officially ended (completion of the last squad or round of competition), or payment of prizes, whichever comes first.

All bowlers regardless of average must comply with the provision of Rule 319d.

Prize winnings from certified and non-certified tournaments, including those using a modified format of American Tenpins (example: 9-pin tap), must be used in the application of this rule.


