This meeting is open to all members in good standing of the Nation's Capital Area USBC Association. You must provide proof of current membership to be admitted to the meeting. Only those ages 14 or older may vote.

Directions to NCAUSBCA Office Building:

From the Capital Beltway (I-495), take Exit 15A (outside the Beltway) at Central Avenue. You'll soon drive underneath an overpass. Get into the far right lane and take Harry S Truman Drive (North), looping around so that you ultimately end up *on* the overpass you just drove under. As you approach the overpass, start to move over toward the left lane.

From the overpass, turn left at the *second* traffic light (Lottsford Road) and drive 1/10 mile until you reach the Stop sign at the bottom of the hill. Proceed directly into the parking area across the street at the two-story "Engineer Center" building that has "9315" above the doors of the main entrance. The check-in desk for Annual Membership Meeting attendees will be just inside the front door; the meeting will take place on the Second Floor via elevator or stairs.

USBC releases lane inspections research, extends data collection through last season

ARLINGTON, Texas – Data collected during the lane certification process shows approximately 91 percent of all centers inspected had less than 10 percent of the items measured out of specification and approximately 72 percent of the centers have less than 5 percent of items out of spec.

The 2018-2019 season marks the first time the United States Bowling Congress is analyzing all data received from lane certifications and is developing a database to examine all measurements. Between the lane and pin deck, lane inspectors make 29 measurements on each synthetic lane and 21 measurements on each wood lane during the inspection process.

After reviewing the data, the Equipment Specifications and Certifications Committee has determined it will extend the data collection for another season. To get additional center certification data, all centers that have a proper inspection with the three required signatures and supply the data to USBC Headquarters will be certified for the 2019-2020 season.

Also starting with inspections for the 2019-2020 season, USBC will increase the certification fee to allow local associations to charge up to \$10 per lane bed. The

Last season, NCAUSBCA placed third among USBC local associations in BVL funds collected with \$15,700.

KULICK, BARNES, KOIVUNIEMI ELECTED TO USBC HALL OF **FAME**

Kelly Kulick, Chris Barnes, and Mika Koivuniemi will be part of the 2019 United States Bowling Congress Hall of Fame class after their election in the Superior Performance category. The three were among the 10 bowlers on the Superior Performance national ballot voted on by a panel of USBC Hall of Fame members, USBC board members, and veteran bowling writers. Candidates had to receive at least 70 percent of the votes cast to earn election. Kulick, Barnes, and Koivuniemi now are part of the 2019 USBC Hall of Fame class that will have seven members. They join the late John Davis (Meritorious Service), Bob Johnson (Meritorious Service), Larry Lichstein (Pioneer), and the late Jim St. John (Veterans), who were elected by the USBC Hall of Fame Committee in October 2018. The 2019 USBC Hall of Fame induction ceremony will take place May 1 in Las Vegas as part of the USBC Convention at The Orleans Hotel and Casino.

Lane reps play a vital role in the success of many leagues

As we all get back into the swing of bowling in this new year, there are a couple of things that I would like to point out.

First is your lane representative, who serves as a liaison between the association office and a center's bowling leagues. Each center within the association is assigned a lane representative, and most centers will normally have more than one.

A lane rep:

- > Helps promote a spirit of cooperation between bowlers, center management, and the local association.
- > Is available when possible for league officer meetings, including in-house workshops.
- > Assists leagues and league officers in solving problems that may arise during the bowling season.
- ➤ Advises leagues upon request about conflicts that may exist between their rules and those mandated by USBC.
- > Serves as an information source on the requirements, benefits, and activities of the local association.
- > Collects for BVL in his/her respective centers.
- > Presents awards as requested by league officers.
- ➤ Distributes association activity information as needed.

The next thing I would like to discuss is BVL (The Bowlers to Veterans Link), the purpose of which is to acquire funds for disabled and hospitalized veterans for recreational and therapeutic equipment and/or activities. During the BVL Fund Drive, lane reps will visit their assigned centers to collect BVL donations. Funds collected will be turned in to the association office and ultimately submitted to BVL Headquarters during the month of May.

Each association competes to see who can raise the most money for this worthy cause, and our association usually places in the Top 5 of all USBC local associations thanks to your generous donations.

One other thing claims my attention: the Annual Membership Meeting. Your local association conducts this meeting for all of its members, and it is held for the express purpose of exposing members to the interworking of the association's board of directors.

The meeting will include a discussion on the budget, the election of association officers and of Virginia State and USBC delegates, as well as the approval or disapproval of any amendments that are presented by the USBC Legislative Committee. Lunch will be served, and raffles are held.

Does your league have a postponement committee?

I hope your league has completed at least one audit of the league finances-better to be safe than sorry.

This is the time of the season when weather can disrupt the league schedule, so please err on the side of safety and allow for postponements and makeup games. We've had a reasonably mild winter so far, but the prediction is for two more storms before old man winter takes a vacation. A postponement committee avoids the possibility of favoritism.

- > Bowlers are allowed to ask for a postponement if they attend the USBC Championships or the local or state championship tournaments or attend the Annual Meeting.
- > Rule 111b states that a league cannot adopt a rule that would prohibit any prebowl or makeup bowling postponements when a team is unable to field a legal lineup due to participating in any of the above events.

Tournaments: I would like to encourage every league in the association to enter at least one team in the association tournaments. Wow! Talk about the glory days of bowling; that would be some sight to behold.

> The 56th Annual Youth Championship Tournament will be held the first two weekends in March at Bowl America Falls Church.

- > The 74th Annual Women's Championship Tournament will be held at AMF Capital Plaza March 16-17 and 23-24, 2019.
- > The 74th Annual Open Championship Tournament will bowl April 6-7, 13-14, and 27-28, 2019. Teams will be at Bowl America Bull Run, and Singles & Doubles events will be held at Bowl America Manassas.
- > Entry forms for all tournaments can be found on our association Web and Facebook pages. Both the Women's and the Open events will offer a Crossover Doubles event this year. Entrants will sign up at the time of bowling, so please arrive at least 45 minutes early to allow time to find partners.
- > Anyone wishing to be a sponsor for any of our tournaments should contact Vice President Willie Graves Jr.

Our December 2018 fundraiser based on Virginia's daily "Pick 3" game is over, and checks have been mailed. The event raised \$3,100 that will be used to fund the NCAUSBCA awards program. Thanks to all who supported this activity.

NCAUSBCA Youth Director

At NCAUSBCA's January Board of Directors Meeting, President Michael Tinsley's appointment of Ja'Sean "Jay" Billings as a youth director was approved by the board. At age 14, Billings, a resident of Suitland, Md., and an eighth-grader at Drew Freeman Middle School, becomes the association's youngest-ever board member. Earlier this month as well as shortly after accepting his new position, he took time to answer questions from editor Bob Cosgrove.



When did you first think about becoming a director?

I actually thought about it around October of 2018. Me and the (association) manager, Ron McGregor, started thinking about different ideas I was talking about, and he gave me the idea of becoming a director. He said I could forward my ideas to the board as a director.

Anything that you'd like to focus on regarding the committees on the board?

NCAUSBCA is like a big corporation, and there's not really one thing I want to focus on. It would be adult bowling, youth bowling, everything—never just one thing.

You've already done several things with the association-work the Senior Tournament, inspect bowling lanes, and even attend this season's Hall of Fame **Induction & Dinner Cele**bration. Is there something that has stood out from these experiences?

Well, I really love being at the office. I love helping out, especially the lane inspections during the summer. I love getting to learn how to do measurements, and I think that all youths should do that. We've gotten a lot of youths to come with us. We taught them how to do lane inspections, go under the pin decks. It's very fun.

What was your impression of the Hall of Fame?

I really love how everything was in order, how everything was so well done. I like all of the pictures of all of the Hall of Famers

from far back; it was very amaz-

Would you consider going to another Hall of Fame event?

Oh, yeah. That's something I'll be doing every year now.

What first brought you into a bowling center?

My grandfather, Kevin Roy, got me at the age of 3 into bowling. He and my whole family got me started.

Do your parents bowl?

My parents used to bowl, but my grandfather is the bowling guy.

What's been your biggest thrill on the lanes thus far?

The biggest thrill is when I shot my first 300 game and 800 set (815) at Bowl America Manassas at the Vern Burke Scholarship Tournament.

When did that happen?

It was March 25, 2018. I know the date!

You're currently on the "injured reserve" list. What happened?

I have a broken bone in my hand, which has not allowed me to bend my hand. This happened on the sixth of December 2018. I was reaching inside the washing machine to get money I needed. A piece of clothing grabbed my hand and spun my arm around. I had my 300 ring on, and that's what caused the broken bone in my hand. Fortunately, the money was upstairs the whole time.

USBC 2019 Index of Proposed Amendments

LEAGUE RULES

Rules Proposal No. LR 1

USBC Playing Rules Chapter 4, League Rules Rule 102e, Duties of the Secretary, Item 9

Averages on *BOWL.com* are the official bowler's average, and the importance of an average showing on BOWL.com is essential. Consequently, the faster the average is submitted to the association, the more accurate information will be for the player.

Rules Proposal No. LR 2

USBC Playing Rules Chapter 4, League Rules Rule 108b. Without Cause

When a person leaves a game without cause, he/ she will not only get zero for frames missed but will receive zero for each succeeding game.

Rules Proposal No. LR 3

USBC Playing Rules Chapter 4, League Rules Rule 122, Meetings

Requires every team captain to vote on rule changes, with approval of a majority.

TOURNAMENT RULES

Rules Proposal No. TR 1

USBC Playing Rules Chapter 6, Tournament Rules Rule 319a, Conditions that Apply

Allows bowlers with averages for both hands to choose which hand to use with the corresponding average.

BYLAWS

Bylaws Proposal No. B 1

USBC National Bylaws Article VI, Meetings Section A., Annual Meeting

Allows for proxy and absentee ballots at the USBC Annual Meeting.

Bylaws Proposal No. B 2

USBC National Bylaws Article VIII, Amendments

Puts limits on the submission of an amendment from previous year.

Bylaws Proposal No. B 3

USBC State Bylaws Article VII, Meetings Section A., Annual Meeting, Item 3

Allows state delegates to determine if HOF members should have voting rights at the state annual meeting.

Bylaws Proposal No. B 4

USBC Local Bylaws Article IV, Membership and Dues

Allows membership bought in a summer league to extend through July 31 of the following year.

2018 Mixed Tournament sets entry and prize fund records

Event raises over \$10,600 for BVL

NCAUSBCA's 9th Annual Mixed Tournament in Support of BVL, which took place December 1-2 and 8-9, set records for teams (68, previous high 54) and doubles (166, previous high 125) and had a record prize fund of over \$21,000. Yes, because I think more youths would want to come in and share their ideas with everybody. I didn't think about becoming a director before. That's why I'm gonna go out and share with all



fee increase is the first in more than two decades, when the fee went from \$3 to \$5 per lane for the 1995-1996 season.

The data from inspections for the 2018-2019 season show about 85 percent of all lanes measured were synthetic lanes or had synthetic overlays. Lane topography measurements. which include crosswise tilts. are taken on each of the five panels for synthetic lanes and three locations for wood lanes.

three panels meeting the specifications.

USBC also looked at the end pair of lanes on each end of bowling centers, as there is a common perception that lanes on either the high end or low end of a bowling center tend to play different from the rest of a center's lanes. Data showed the topography variance was not significant, meaning if the lanes do not play the same, lane topography is not the reason.

Last year, USBC announced new requirements for lane incations, and an examination of lane topography.

USBC has since been educating both associations and bowling centers about the changes, which included a new application for center certification for the 2018-2019 season. To ensure it would receive data from all center inspections, USBC allowed a one-year grace period for centers that receive an inspection and supplied USBC Headquarters with the inspection data and the three required signatures.

USBC also has worked to educate all stakeholders about the center certification process, conducting 30 Lane Inspection Workshops during the 2017-2018 season, including two workshops at the 2018 USBC Convention.

The work of the lane inspectors this season and next season will provide data that will help the USBC Equipment Specifications Committee better understand the true landscape of bowling center topography and other key measurements within the field of play and to set a clear path in this area.

The 2018-2019 season marks the first time the United States Bowling Congress is analyzing all data received from lane certifications and is developing a database to examine all measurements.

The first, or head, panel was found to have the most out-ofspecification measurements. though approximately 93% of the crowns and depressions are within specification and about 94% of the cross-tilt measurements are also within specification.

The backend of the lane showed the highest specification compliance with about 98% of the results for crowns/depressions and cross tilts on the last spections and adjusted specifications for new installations starting with the 2019-2020 season. The new requirements were based on research conducted by the USBC Equipment **Specifications and Certifications** team that included analysis of the lane certification paperwork submitted by 323 centers, an examination of more than 1,000 lanes throughout the country, a study of the pin deck specifi-




