BOWIE STATE CAPTURES FIFTH STRAIGHT CIAA CHAMPIONSHIP

2019 PBA BILLY WELU SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATIONS NOW BEING ACCEPTED

Bowie State University women's bowling team under the leadership of head coach (and NCAUSBCA director) Andrew "Doc" Campbell captured its fifth straight CIAA Championship March 24 in Virginia Beach, Va., defeating Fayetteville State University 4-2. The win also marks Bowie State's ninth overall CIAA Crown (2005, 2006, 2010, 2013, 2015, 2016, 2017, and 2018). The Bulldogs won the double-elimination tournament by scores of 135-165, 177-190, 152-136, 154-147, 190-187 and 191-180. Senior Diamond Carter (Buffalo, N.Y.) and freshman Cayla Snowden (Parkville, Md.) were selected to the All-Tournament Team. Carter was also named the Most Valuable Player of the Championships for the second year in a row. As a result of its championship, the team competed in the National Collegiate Women's Bowling Championship on April 6 in Millsboro, Del., but lost to Division I University of Maryland Eastern Shore in the opening round.

The Professional Bowlers Association is now accepting applications for the 2019 PBA Billy Welu Scholarship Award that recognizes exemplary qualities in male or female college students who excel in academics as well as in the sport of bowling. The winner will receive a \$1,000 scholarship. To be eligible, candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintaining at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent. Applications must be postmarked by June 21. The scholarship was established in 1982 in memory of the PBA Hall of Famer who served as television analyst alongside legendary ABC broadcaster and PBA Hall of Famer Chris Schenkel on the "Pro Bowlers Tour" series prior to his death in 1974. BRIEFLY Darryl Carreon of Woodbridge, Va., rolled the first perfect game of the 2019 USBC Open Championships in Las Vegas in the first game of his team event April 5. The 34-year-old right-hander also became the 31st bowler in tournament history with multiple 300s at the USBC Open Championships. His first came in his tournament debut in 2014. He followed this year's 300 with games of 212 and 154 for a 666 series. ... John Neral of Vienna, Va., placed 28th to earn \$1,120 in the PBA50 Hamilton Laness & Entertainment Center Open May 5 in Trenton, N.J.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE • MICHAEL TINSLEY



End-of-season decisions need to be made

As the bowling season comes to a close, several decisions have to made by your leagues. Foremost of these is the election of officers. The league should canvass your league members to see whether anyone is interested running for office.

Once the league has been canvassed and the names collected, there should a slate published with the names of the persons running and the title of the position for which each is running. The slate should contain all of the positions of the league officers—president, vice president, secretary, treasurer, and sergeant at arms. The person receiving the majority of votes for each position is declared the winner.

Remember to elect officers who best represent your interests and are abreast of USBC rules.

Hopefully your league was devoid of any shortages in your prize funds. The next item of interest is the secretary compiling and submitting names and averages of all bowlers in their respective leagues; this should be done in a timely fashion. This is done so that your local association can forward this information to USBC for publication on BOWL.com. If this information is not submitted in a timely fashion, the bowlers in your league will not be listed online, which could cause problems for bowlers entering tournaments in the upcoming year. This is part of the secretary's duties, and he/ she should not be paid until all of the current season's business has been completed.

Now that your season has successfully completed, you are ready for summer. It is time to check your equipment for possible surface damage and oil consumption as well as your inserts for wear and tear. If there is minor damage to your ball, you should have it sanded to remove small nixes and scrapes, de-oiled to remove excess oil, and have your inserts replaced if they are worn.

After having done all of that, you are now ready to work on your game. Most bowling centers offer some type of discount for summer bowling; take advantage of these discounts. You should take this time to practice a couple of times a week to work on what gave you the most trouble during the season. Remember that we can't strike all the time, but we can convert our spares. Spare conversions will certainly improve your average.

Remember there are some new rules coming the next couple of seasons. This coming season, you will only be able to use a clean white towel to clean your ball during competition. You may use any USBC-approved cleaning or polishing solvents before or after competition.

The PBA recently was featured on the FOX Sports Regional Networks' documentary-style program, *FOCUSED*.

Starting August 1, 2020, you will no longer be allowed to have a weight hole drilled in your ball, and each hole of the ball should have a finger or thumb inserted in it. So if you have a weight hole drilled in your ball, you should think of replacing it now to beat the rush next summer.

With that being said, enjoy your summer, and we'll see you next bowling season.

Those routine phone calls

Most leagues are ended or almost finished, depending if weather delays necessitated makeup games. Here are some of the calls we routinely get this time of the season:

> What to do now that a shortage in the prize fund has been discovered?

 \succ Why are the scratch prizes larger than the handicap prize in a handicap league?

> We had a bowler quit the league. Is he entitled to get any money?

As a reminder, please remember to submit the Triple Crown winners from your league. This is an award given to the male and/or female bowler in a league that holds the highest average, highest scratch game, and highest scratch series. The form can be found on the association site in the "Secretary's Corner."

Treasurers are required to present a financial report to the league members at payout and to maintain a record for 60 days. Treasurers who do not plan to

> I am bowling in a tournament this weekend, and I never got my sanction card. What do I do?

➤ My average isn't correct on our Web site and *BOWL.com*. How do I get it corrected?

League secretaries are reminded that final averages are to be submitted to the association office as soon as the league session has ended. Even though the bowling center may have been producing the standings, it is still the responsibility of the *league secretary* to make sure the final averages are submitted. Please list all bowlers that have bowled one or more games. We maintain a list of leagues that have not given us the final averages on *ncausbca.org*. hold the office next season must turn over all records to the incoming treasurer.

Anyone purchasing a Basic membership will not be eligible for awards and is limited to bowling in only one league.

The 74th Annual Women's Championship and 74th Annual Open Championship tournaments have ended, and both tournaments added a Crossover Doubles special event that bowlers seemed to like. Participants were able to bowl with any other bowler as long as they were in the same squad. Both tournaments also allowed bowlers to use their highest Team, Singles, and Doubles scores for the All-Events prize division.

Secretaries must file final averages within 15 days of league's completion

LAS VEGAS – Delegates elected three board members and voted on eight legislative proposals as the 2019 United States Bowling Congress Convention and Annual Meeting came to a close May 2 at The Orleans.

The ballot for the USBC Board election had four candidates slated by the USBC Nominating Committee—Anthony Colangelo of Meridian, Idaho; Rich Foran of Billings, Montana; Bo Goergen of Sanford, Michigan; and Lowell Lovgren of Kelso, Washington—with candidate Richard Ramsey of Byers, Texas running from the floor.

On the first ballot, Colangelo (637 votes), Goergen (629), and Lovgren (582) were elected, with Foran receiving 396 votes and Ramsey receiving 263. A candidate had to receive a majority of votes from the 972 eligible voters to be elected. The newly elected board members begin their three-year terms on Aug. 1, 2019.

Also joining the USBC Board starting with the 2019-2020 season will be new USBC Hall of Fame member Chris Barnes, who was elected by Team USA athletes earlier this year. He replaces Bill O'Neill, who did not seek another term.

Chris Floyd and Aaron Yuratovich are joining the International Bowling Campus Youth Committee, which also returns current members Melissa Mc-Daniel and Chrissie Kent.

In addition to the board elections, delegates voted on eight proposed amendments, with three related to league rules, one for tournament rules, and four proposals for bylaws.

Delegates approved a league rules amendment that will require a league secretary to furnish a list of individual averages to the local association manager within 15 days of a league's completion, and then rejected two additional league rules proposals and a tournament rule proposal. Two amendments to bylaws were approved, including allowing state delegates to determine if hall of fame members should have voting rights at the state annual meeting.

The 2019 USBC Convention also celebrated a special milestone, as it was the first convention in which every association was fully merged, and USBC announced a new award to recognize and celebrate an outstanding local association. Skagit Valley USBC of Burlington, Washington, was selected for the inaugural USBC Association Excellence Award, which was presented to association president Lonny Olson.

The presentation of national awards, including the Alberta E. Crowe Star of Tomorrow Award to Mabel Cummins of Elburn, Illinois, and the Chuck Hall Star of Tomorrow Award to Trace Nuss of Tampa, Florida, also took place Thursday.

USBC President Karl Kielich and USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy presented their annual reports, and delegates heard reports from the USBC Strategic Planning Committee and from International Bowling Campus Youth Development.

During Convention Week, delegates attended numerous seminars, including a presentation about the Registered Volunteer Program and SafeSport, featuring United States Olympic Committee Vice President of Athlete Safety Wendy Guthrie and Katie Hanna, Director of Education and Outreach for the U.S. Center for SafeSport.

The Bowlers to Veterans Link (BVL), which provides recreational and therapeutic programs and services to America's active duty and veteran service men and women, made its annual presentation and announced it had raised just over \$1.1 million for the Department of Veterans Affairs through contributions during the 2017-2018 season.

California was the top state association contributor to BVL with \$106,488, while Metro Phoenix USBC again was the top local association contributor with \$30,177. Be sure to visit BowlForVeterans.org to learn more about BVL.

Bowl for the Cure®, the yearround fund-raising initiative sponsored by USBC in partnership with Susan G. Komen, had its annual Meet for the Cure celebration and special luncheon for breast cancer survivors.

In 2020, the USBC Convention returns to The Orleans with the event scheduled to run from April 27-30.

USBC extends partnership agreement with South Point Hotel's Tournament Bowling Plaza

The United States Bowling Congress and the South Point Hotel and Casino have extended their partnership agreement to bring USBC Championships events to the Tournament Bowling Plaza in Las Vegas through 2033.

The extension of the agreement will have the USBC Women's Championships taking place at South Point Hotel's Tournament Bowling Plaza in 2029 and 2032 (in addition to 2020, 2023, and 2026), while the USBC Open Championships will visit the venue in 2030 and 2033 (after 2021, 2024, and 2027). The extension keeps each event at the Tournament Bowling Plaza every third year.

Puts limits on the submission of an amendment from previous year.

Amendment No. B 3 – Accepted (767 accept, 84 reject)

USBC State Bylaws Article VII, Meetings Section A., Annual Meeting, Item 3

Allows state delegates to determine if Hall of Fame members should have voting rights at the state annual meeting.

Amendment No. B 4 – Rejected (336 accept, 510 reject)

USBC Local Bylaws

Article IV, Membership and Dues

Allows membership bought in a summer league to extend through July 31 of the following year.

Billings, Blaney earn Youth 600 Club Tournament of Champions division titles






