





What is the USBC Registered Volunteer **Program?**

The United States Bowling Congress' Registered Volunteer Program was created in 2006 to protect the youths who participate in USBC Youth programs. Providing a safe environment for youth bowlers is USBC's highest priority.

Everyone deserves to participate in sports free from bullying, hazing, sexual misconduct, or any form of emotional or physical abuse. USBC's Registered Volunteer Program is designed to ensure all who work with youth members are dedicated to that objective.

Any legal adult (18 & over) who has "regular contact" with a minor (17 & under) must complete the free Safe-Sport training. This would include adults bowling in adult/youth leagues and Adult leagues, as well as youth members 18, 19, and 20 years old bowling in youth leagues. Youth members turning 18 during the season, will be required to complete the SafeSport training to continue bowling in youth leagues.

A league made up entirely of adults (18 & over) is not required to take any training. A league may adopt a minimum age requirement rule (18 & older) if it wishes.

TICKETS AVAILABLE FOR DECEMBER **FUND-RAISER**

Tickets are now available for NCAUSBCA's December 2019 fund-raiser that helps defray the cost of local awards and other programs that can benefit all members. NCAUSBCA will offer each day in December an opportunity for individuals to cash through numbers selected in the daily Virginia Lottery "Pick 3" game. In fact, every \$10 raffle ticket has three chances to win daily -- and a monthly total of 93 chances! -- with a minimum winning amount of \$15. Payouts will be made no later than January 15, 2020. Tickets are available through your lane representative as well as the NCAUSBCA office in Largo, Md.

AVERAGE BOOKS FOR ALL MEMBERS

For the first time ever, NCAUSBCA is making its Annual Averages books for adults and youths available to all members. The cover page of both books appears on ncausbca.org, and the large letter in the lower-left corner of each book indicates the current version. Those who have downloaded a book to their smartphone, tablet, or PC are encouraged to visit the site frequently to ensure they have the latest version, as the books will be updated throughout the season. Facebook followers will be advised of all updates.

BVL TOPS \$1.1 MILLION

For the third consecutive fiscal year, BVL (Bowlers To Veterans Link), has raised more than \$1.1 million to support recreation therapy grants to VA hospitals and clinics for America's veterans and active duty service members. As bowling's own and oldest charity, BVL has raised more than \$50 million since 1942 to provide support services to veterans.

BRIEFLY

The United States Bowling Congress will lower the maximum age for USBC Youth membership to 18 starting with the 2020-2021 season. The decision to lower to the maximum age from 20 to 18, with agreement from the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America and the International Bowling Campus Youth Committee, will align bowling with other youth sports. The new age limit marks the second time the USBC Youth maximum age has been lowered. In 2009, USBC lowered the maximum age for youth bowlers from 22 to 20. ... Josh Keller set a house record August 26 at Bowl America Dranesville: On the Boardwalk pattern in the Monday Madness Sport Shot league, he began with the first 31 strikes and had games of 300-300-256 for an 856 series, eclipsing the previous house record held by Ryan Riegel (847). Keller's final game of 279 made for a four-game scratch series of 1,135.

PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE • MICHAEL TINSLEY



The dry towel rule

Welcome to the new bowling season. I hope all of you had a wonderful summer and that everyone had a chance to work on their games as well as work on their equipment (i.e., purchase new inserts, de-oil and resurface your bowling balls, etc.).

We enter this new season with one of the most talked about subjects in quite a while—the use of a dry towel. In essence, you can use only a dry towel to clean your bowling ball once competition starts, which means when the first person rolls a ball for score.

In addition, you are no longer able to use any cleaning substance to clean your ball during play. If there is a foreign substance on your ball that you are unable to get off with a dry towel, you are to contact a league officer or whomever your league designates to mediate this. We suggest the team captains be designated, as they are closest to the action instead of looking for a league officer each time.

If anyone uses a cleaning solution on their ball during competition, the bowler will receive a zero for that frame, and the ball is to be removed from competition. If the bowler continues to apply a solution to the ball after being warned, his team will forfeit the game.

Once competition has begun, you cannot clean any ball with anything other than a dry towel. All balls should be cleaned with a cleaning solution before you begin bowling. To be clear, you cannot take a ball out of your bag between games and use a solution on it.

You may ask, "If I put an approved solution on my towel before competition begins, can I use it during the game?" You can only use that towel if has completely dried before use.

You may also note, "I have a cleaning solution that reads 'USBC Approved Anytime." USBC communicated the rule change with the companies to give them a chance to make the changes to their product labelling and cycle through their inventory, so remember no solution should be used once competition has begun.

I am confident that this rule will not be a problem for the majority of our members.

Presidents: Pleased be advised that you should receive a copy of the bank statement or view it online to ensure that what funds are there is accurate. Also, select a prize fund committee and have a prize fund list submitted for voting by the fifth week of bowling.

Secretaries: There is a rule change that affects your end-ofseason reporting. To ensure that bowlers have correct averages, final averages should be sent to the Association Office no later

than 15 days following the completion of league competition. It is requested that the final averages form prepared by the Association Office (paper or digital) be used.

We will conduct the association's 38th Annual Senior Tournament at Bowl America Falls Church the last three weekend in October. Anyone 50 years or older is eligible to bowl in this handicap competition. You will compete against members in your own age and gender group.

We will hold our 55th Annual Hall of Induction & Dinner Celebration on November 2 in the Grand Ballroom at the Bolling Air Force Base Officers' Club. Tickets are \$50 per person, and five individuals will be inducted (see page 7).

I encourage you to get to know your lane representative; this will be the person you contact if you encounter difficulties in your league as well as for association information, award presentations, and rule interpretations. Your rep should have been identified during your league officers' jamboree at your center this summer.

If you don't know who you rep is, please visit neausbea.org, where you can find this information. At this site, you will be able to learn about our awards program and also find an application for a position on your local Board of Directors.

Again, welcome back, and let's make this a most enjoyable season.

New season necessities

It's September and some leagues already have bowled several weeks. As you may recall, USBC rules state that prize lists should be prepared and voted on by the fifth week. Team members should have each other's contact information. If one of your teammates isn't showing up and, worse yet, not paying, at least you can find out what his/ her situation is and let a league officer know.

Most leagues have a "no arrearages" policy, so don't let league fees go unpaid for too long. Unpaid fees affect your prize fund. Last season, we had too many instances of prize money disappearing.

Presidents: Please check the bank account monthly. There should be two signers on the account, and withdrawals must have two signatures as well.

As you undoubtedly have heard, the "dry towel" rule took effect this season. It has not seemed to be a problem, as most secretaries called and received guidance or else worked with their lane representatives to get the word to their bowlers.

If you purchase your 2019-20 membership card online, you still need to complete a membership application card for each league you bowl. Simply indicate that you paid online. Please keep proof of purchase until your card arrives, and by all means, check online if you

don't get it by October 1. Don't wait until the day before you are scheduled to bowl in a tournament to find out you never received it.

If this is your first season as secretary, treasurer, or as a league officer, have no fear: Your local association site, ncausbca .org, has every form/aid you need on the home page or in the "Secretary's Corner" area. Office staff is always here to help, and your lane reps plan to visit your centers regularly to help as needed. If you don't know who your lane rep is, you can find contact information at *ncausbca* .org/lane reps/lane reps.pdf.

The 2020 tournament calendar is chocked full of both state and local tournaments, so take a look at our calendar page so that you can make your plans accordingly. New this season: Your family and friends living in other parts of the country can bowl in our local association tournaments by paying a onetime \$3.00 membership fee and use their highest average as posted on BOWL.com. Hopefully, this will mean larger prize funds, so spread the word.

Secretaries: Please remember to separate the application card for those members paying for membership from those not paying-and kindly alphabetize each pile. At least make sure each card is marked with the amount paid—\$24, \$11, \$0, etc.

Bennett, Gunn, Holtzclaw, Jefferson, and Snow to enter Hall of Fame

Induction ceremonies November 2 at Joint Base Anacostia-Bolling

Yvonne Tison, as she was known in this area, was the quintessential "bowling alley rat" of the 1970s. Growing up in and around the sport, she

has had an accomplished career on and off the lanes.

Yvonne, who started bowling at age 10, averaged 170 in the prestigious Northern Virginia Junior Travel League as a senior at Langley High School. She brought the national spotlight to the Nation's Capital Area

when she fired a four-game series of 906 on games of 170, 246, 223 and 267 at Skor-Mor Lanes during that same league in December 1974.

While attending college at George Mason University, she gave back to the sport as a volunteer youth league assistant at Annandale Bowling Center, a Certified AJBC Youth Coach and youth director at Reston Bowling Center, and a member of the Bowl America Tournament Committee. As a member of the WDCAWBA Board of Directors, she wrote the "Tison's Corner" column in *BOWL Magazine* during the 1980-1981 bowling season.

Yvonne was a trailblazer, bowling in numerous *men's* scratch leagues as these leagues opened up to women in the mid-1970s. In 1996, she was one of the first women to become an ABC Lifetime Member.



To pursue competitive opportunities, she never shied away from shoeing up with and against the men, often bowling in scratch tournaments and pot games throughout Virginia. She frequently was seen bowling in pot games at Bowl America Falls Church and Reston Bowling Center. The guys often would tease her about the "second paycheck" she took home some nights from "action" at Bowl America Burke.

She appeared in the WDCAWBA Top 10 Ranking in 1978-1979 (#8) and 1979-1980 (#7). Returning to the lanes after a five-year layoff due to work commitments, she placed fourth on the association's 1987-1988 Honorable Mention listing with a 188.2 average in her only league.

In 1979 at age 21, Yvonne led the Women's Division in each of the five rounds en route to becoming the youngest female MWBPA Scratch Invitational Champion. A 1980 *BOWL Magazine* Tournament Scratch Team and Scratch Doubles champion, she also was victorious in the 1989 MWBPA Award Score Scratch Singles and in the 1990 WDCAWBA City Tournament as a scratch and handicap team champion. In addition, there were numerous cashes in women's scratch events, including the Virginia Bowling Queens and the Women's All Star Association.

In 1980 at Bowl America Shirley, she represented WDCAWBA with Debbie Roberts in an exhibition match with WPBA touring pros Patty Costello and Cindy Coburn-Carroll.

Her personal highs include a 289 game, 698 series, and a single-season average of 199 for 60 games in the summer of 1990 in the Thursday Scratch Trios at Bowl America Burke, a league she won with teammates Ken Shaw and Todd Larson.

Yvonne Tison Bennett's accomplishments on the lanes and her contributions in our area and continued passion and dedication to bowling deem her a most worthy member of the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.



Milton "Pete" Gunn began bowling in the late 1960s because it was too cold to play basketball outside in the winter. He averaged 180 in his



first year as a sanctioned league bowler and rolled his first 300 game the next season. Pete is known for his smooth delivery, and he maintained a league average of 200-plus for most of his bowling career. He has been a dependable supporter of the local association by bowling two or more

leagues each season since he began.

He attributes his knowledge of the game to local and touring pros as well as to a book by Dick Weber entitled Weber on Bowling. He spent hours practicing to improve his game in the early years and bowled every local tournament he could. He became a PBA member in 1992.


Pete has always been a positive ambassador for the sport, and he spent many years coaching bowlers of all ages, individually and through organized programs. Some of his students include fellow NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame members Rich Wolfe, Terry Wiley, Lisa Rand, and Richard Dodge as well as other outstanding bowlers from the area such as Ken Shaw and Jay Gaskill.

In February 1999, in recognition of Pete's support for youth bowling, the winner of the Sports Plus Junior Classic Tournament received a \$500 "Pete Gunn Youth Bowling Scholarship." He also served area bowlers while working at Dave's Pro Shop at Seminary Lanes.

Pete's bowling accomplishments include 23 perfect games—two of which were bowled on the same night in different leagues at AMF Annandale; numerous games of 290 to 299; 13 800 series, with a high of 838; four association Triple Crown awards; a high league average of 220; and multiple cashes in PBA competition.

Milton "Pete" Gunn's dedication to the sport of bowling, his accomplishments on and off the lanes, and the fact that he's always been a standup ambassador for the sport make him a worthy addition to the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.

John "Claw" Holtzclaw, Capt. USN (Ret), has bowled in the Nation's Capital Area since 2002. At 85 years young, he bowls in two full-time leagues



and subs regularly in a third. He has served with distinction president of the Falls Church Commercial League since the 2014-2015 season and was captain of the oldest team (average combined age of team members was 71 years old) to win that league championship in the

2016-2017 season. John also has won other league championships, including the Falls Church Navy Guardian League, which is the oldest NCAUSBCA league.

At the young age of 80-plus, John has carried a 200-plus average, rolled a 300 game, bowled in PBA regional tournaments, including the Battle of Little Creek with partner PBA Hall of Famer Parker Bohn III, bowls each year in the World-Wide Military Bowling Championship in Las Vegas, and has participated in the USBC Open Championships Tournament for the past 12 years. He competes annually in the NCAUSBCA Open Championship Tournament.

John is very active in the bowling community, where he sponsors an annual team in the Langley Bowl-A-Thon (a charity for challenged adults) and the annual Rotary International Tournament (an event between local clubs). But what sets John apart from many others is his commitment to help others. For instance, as a practicing attorney, he has helped over 40 bowlers with legal assistance and representation and has assisted several Hall of Famers with legal issues.

Upon learning of the death of fellow league member Reggie Rich from a traffic accident on May 8, 2017, John, at a season-ending league payoff meeting two days later, led the way in establishing the "Reggie Rich Tribute Fund" that supports youth programs at Bowl America Falls Church—something that was dear to Reggie. This fund pays the lineage fees for area youths who could not otherwise afford to bowl each week in a league. In addi-

tion to allowing for the purchase of several bowling balls and bags, the fund also pays the entry fees for youths who bowl in tournaments such as the NCAUSBCA Youth Championship and the Invitational Scratch Singles, and it sponsors two teams in the Bowl America Travel League. Thus far, the area bowling community has contributed over \$18,500 to support the kids, largely due to John's leadership.

Basically, whenever John is in the center, he is open for conversation, will listen to your issues, and is always willing to take the time to help. He will even help by giving bowling tips that he has learned from many of his PBA friends.

John is one of those exceptional individuals who enjoys giving and helping others more than receiving-a true gentleman and a credit to our bowling community. He is always positive, fun to be around, possesses a great mental outlook, and enjoys interacting with his fellow bowlers.

In recognition of his bowling achievements and his contributions to our bowling community, John "Claw" Holtzclaw has been granted an honored position in the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.

Quintina "Lil Smooth" Jefferson fell in love with bowling after participating in a bowling fund-raiser in 1998. She began her bowling career



that year by joining the Frances Abney Memorial League at AMF Clinton.

Realizing she needed to learn the basics of bowling, Quintina received coaching from Frazier Atkinson, Coach Jim Taylor then sharpened her skills on lane conditions, hand positions, and the actual

structure of the game. Later, Crystal Shaw-Wesby helped her grasp the mental part of bowling that would help her to adjust on the lanes. Quintina also attended classes at the International Training and Research Center in Arlington, Texas.

Over the years, she has donated bowling balls, shoes, and bags to area youth leagues. Also, she has assisted beginning bowlers with understanding the basics of the game. She especially enjoys coaching new bowlers that have her same passion for the game.

Quintina bowled her first 300 game at AMF Capital Plaza as a member of the Bottom Liners in 2003. Since that time, she has scored over 10 perfect games, including three during the 2012-2013 season—two at AMF Capital Plaza and one at Dolton Bowl in Illinois. She bowled her first 800 series in 2013 at AMF Capital Plaza in the Top Dollar Trio's League.

Quintina has cashed in several tournaments and has walked away with numerous titles, including the 2006 Virginia State Women's Championship Division 1 Singles. She also has countless back-toback victories, including three consecutive Scratch Singles titles at the NCAUSBCA Women's Championship Tournament (2011-2013). In the 2018 event, her "Baby, I'm Sorry" team won scratch and handicap titles.

Her name has appeared in the NCAUSBCA Women's "Top 10" Ranking / Official Average Leaders 11 consecutive seasons (2007-2008 to 2017-2018)—nine of those times in the Top 5.



League officials who have minors in their competition must complete both the Safe-Sport training and a background check by NCSI (National Center for Safety Initiatives).


