

Leslie H. Goldberg, president of Bowl America Inc., died October 14, 2019 at age 89 following a lengthy illness. After a career in advertising in New York, he returned to the area in 1976 to work alongside his father, NCA-USBCA Hall of Famer C. Edward Goldberg, taking control upon the founder's passing in 1983. Rick Brooks, who managed Bowl America Shirley for over 15 years in the same location shared by Bowl America Headquarters, wrote: "I had the pleasure of having Mr. Goldberg -- "Mr. G." -at my center for lunch every day. You would have never guessed who he was: His clothes were a bit shabby, often didn't match, and most of the time, he wore an Elmer Fudd hat or a camo baseball cap. He rarely missed a day. He insisted on paying full price, never tipped, and complained quite often. Tuna was his favorite, but only if it was made fresh -- he could tell if it was last night's. He would try the soup and chili to make sure it was up to his standard. If he didn't like it, he would tell us to throw it out. One day, he had a problem with the potato chips, which required finding a new vendor for chips. After lunch, he would spend the remainder of his hour at the control desk buying lottery scratch tickets, his favorite hobby. I won't say how much he spent or how much he won, but I can tell you both categories were enormous. I'm pretty sure at least one time I sold him a \$20,000 winner. When I asked if he had the ticket, he looked up at me over the top of his glasses and said, 'Well, you know, Rick, if I did, I wouldn't tell you,' and he smiled. He was gentle but stern. His expectations were high because he wanted the best for the customers. Bowl America won't be going anywhere anytime in the near future. Mr. G. built a very strong foundation."

Once again this season, Phyllis Bourque of the Tuesday AM league at AMF Waldorf leads the way in raising funds individually for BVL, collecting \$1,750 primarily from leagues at her center. What is amazing about her effort this time is that it occurred after she had fallen and broken five ribs! ... Bowlers at Crofton Bowling Centre were shocked and saddened upon learning of the passing of Perry "Cookieman" Cook, who died October 28, 2019 following a heart attack three days earlier while en route to the bowling center. A member of Monday, Wednesday, and Friday morning leagues, Cookieman was 68.

There's help online for league officers

By now, all administrative tasks should have been completed (i.e., prize funds established, league rules implemented, league officers performing their duties). With that being said, I have heard of instances where new secretaries have been thrust into the position without proper training or guidance. When you vote a new officer into office, at a minimum, the previous officer should take some time to sit down and explain what the duties entail what is expected of the individual.

Secretaries can find any information they need at NCAUSB-CA.org. In addition, you can call the office at 301/499-1693 to ask any other questions or information you may need. Those at the office will be more than willing to assist you, as in the long run this will make their jobs smoother.

On BOWL.com. USBC offers training for league secretaries, treasurers, and presidents.

There is still some confusion as to whether USBC or the local association (NCAUSBCA) provides awards. USBC provides one-time awards for a 300 game and 800 series. NCAUSBCA awards can be found on the Web site at the "Secretary's Corner." There is nothing happening with the local association that cannot be found on the site.

Thus, everyone has a chance to place. This should be the association's biggest tournament, as most of our membership has reached the tender age of 50. BVL Month in America brings awareness to the bowling community's commitment to veterans

FAIRFAX, Va. - The focus of the bowling community turns to veterans this month with BVL Month in America, an initiative that brings awareness to the work that BVL (Bowlers to Veterans Link) does to support veterans and active duty military by funding recreation and therapy services throughout the United States.

As bowling's oldest and own charity, the bowling community is active in raising funds and awareness to support America's veterans since 1942. While many centers and bowling associations started their fund-raising events around Veterans

Day, BVL Executive Director Mary Harrar emphasizes that November is only the beginning of the ongoing year-round, fund-raising efforts, including programs such as "Shoes for Freedom," which asks bowling centers to set aside at least one shoe rental daily for a month, quarter, or year as a donation to BVL.

Over the next year, Harrar said the focus will be on the organization's "I AM BVL" campaign, calling it a simple message to share with others about why they support BVL and its work with veterans. "Almost everyone has a personal connection to





military service or a veteran, whether it's a family member or friend, and I AM BVL helps tell the stories of the impact that veterans make on all of us."

Harrar joined the BVL Board of Directors in Washington, D.C., for several activities on Veterans Day, including a BVL fund-raising event, the annual BVL Board of Directors meeting chaired by John LaSpina of Long Beach, N.Y., and participation in a wreath-laying ceremony. The BVL flag was also included in the parade of colors that kicked off the national day of observance.

"It's a tremendously emotional, almost indescribable, experience to present the wreath to the honor guard at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier on behalf of BVL," said LaSpina, who was one of four BVL representatives to participate in a wreath-laying ceremony at Arlington National Cemetery on Veterans Day. "It puts into perspective the undeniable sacrifices that our veterans make for all of us, and amplifies the importance of the work BVL does to provide needed support and services for all who have served."

LaSpina noted that the bowling community has been a stalwart supporter of BVL and veterans over the past 77 years since BVL was founded, adding "there is still so much more we can all do to raise our voices and much-needed funds to brighten veterans' lives."

BVL Board member and USBC Vice President Karen Jost of Tumwater, Wash., and bowling proprietor David Kellerman of Georgetown, Texas, also represented BVL at the Veterans Day Breakfast with U.S. Secretary of Veterans Affairs Robert Wilkie. The weekend in the nation's capital kicked off with a fund-raiser hosted by Bill and Kate Moore on the lanes in their home in Clifton, Va. Brunswick Pro Staff members Johnny Petraglia, Walter Ray Williams Jr., and Parker Bohn III also appeared at the event that raised more than \$10,000 for BVL.



The kit includes professionally produced, customizable league and open play flyers to generate additional traffic throughout the center.

BVL also offers free soldier pin cutouts for centers to display throughout their venue when patrons make a donation. BVL wristbands and dog tags are available for purchase to use as incentives for special events and donations.

Last year, BVL raised more than \$1.1 million for the third consecutive fiscal year. 
