

USBC AFFIRMS STRING PINSETTERS ARE NON-APPROVED EQUIPMENT

The United States Bowling Congress affirms string pinsetters currently are considered non-approved equipment. String pinsetters may not be used in USBC-certified competition, including USBC-certified leagues and tournaments. USBC is clarifying its position related to string pinsetters following the recent announcement from the International Bowling Federation, stating it will allow the use of the machines in IBF competition. "Currently, there is no empirical data for USBC to determine exactly what additional variables string pinsetters may present related to equipment specifications and standards," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. USBC is in the process of conducting research related to string pinsetters. USBC plans to complete an initial phase of the study and publish the results in 2022. However, the results may or may not provide conclusive data to support a position on string pinsetter certification. For more information on equipment specifications, visit BOWL.com/ EquipAndSpecs.

IBMA SELECTS WALTER RAY AS BOWLER OF THE MONTH

Walter Ray Williams Jr. of Oxford, Florida has been selected the October 2020 Bowler of the Month by the International Bowling Media Association (IBMA). Williams Jr. won two PBA50 regionals in October, the PBA50 Timber Lanes East Open in Oxford, Pennsylvania, and the PBA50 AMF Mechanicsville South Open in Mechanicsville, Virginia. Those two wins are the 116th and 117th in his remarkable PBA career, the most tournament wins by any PBA player. ... Chris Barnes of Double Oak, Texas took IBMA honors for September.

BRIEFLY.... The USBC Hall of Fame Committee recently elected Bill and Barbara Chrisman of Pleasant View, Utah in the Meritorious Service category. Over more than three decades, the Chrismans have used their positions and success as co-founders of Storm Products, Inc., one of bowling's premier manufacturers, to have an immeasurable impact in the sport beyond just the production of balls, bags, shoes, and accessories for Storm, Roto Grip, and now 900 Global. ... The 2019-2020 "We Are Everywhere" league at Bowl America Falls Church included "NCAUSBCA Triple Crown Award" winner Carol Zirkle, who qualified with her 172 game, 464 series, and 130 average -- all highs for women in the league.



Dysart, Rowley, Sinek elected to NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame

NOEL DYSART

Noel Dysart's bowling career began in 1956 at age 13 when he started spending Sunday afternoons with his dad at the bowling center in a small Minnesota town.



When the Navy moved him to the Washington area in 1982, he started to bowl in local leagues, became a life member in USBC, and spent every couple of weekends bowling in ABT tournaments. For the next 27 years, except for the 41/2 years he was stationed outside the area, he continued to participate in Nation's Capital Area Bowling Association and other bowling

events, both locally and nationally. Noel has bowled in the Falls Church Commercial league for more than 15 years, including the year their team, which included two Hall of Fame members, won the championship.

His high average is 209, and he has accomplished several 300s and a 787 high series. Noel and his doubles partner, John Holtzclaw, have bowled in the World Wide Military Bowling Tournaments and in the ABC/ USBC Open Championships for more than 15 years.

Starting in 1997, Noel began to regularly volunteer at the association, entering membership and average information and processing awards. In addition, he volunteered to assist with the association lane inspections.

Around the same time, he pursued his interest in teaching the sport of bowling by attending numerous Dick Ritger Bowling Camps and became certified as a Level III Ritger Instructor. His attendance at USBC training courses resulted in his certification as a Bronze and Silver Level Coach.

Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, there will be no induction ceremonies this year. The "Class of 2020" will be inducted at the next scheduled Induction Celebration, which hopefully will occur next year.

Upon his retirement from the Navy in 2002, Noel increased his participation with the sport of bowling. He accepted an appointment as a member of the association's board of directors and served in that capacity until the 2006 merger of ABC/USBC, which markedly reduced the number of directors. In 2003, Noel returned to Navy employment, taking a job at the Bethesda Naval Bowling Center, which he later managed from 2008 to its closure in July 2019. At that center, he took over the coaching and management of the youth league.

Always active in collecting funds for BVL, he identified the organization as a resource for support of our Wounded Warriors, who were being treated at the hospital. BVL provided funding for the recovering patients to bowl, and Noel worked with them to increase their ability to participate in the sport.

In 2013 and 2015, he was instrumental in working with Storm to offer a one-day program for the Wounded Warriors, where they received a bowling ball, shoes, and bag, along with two hours of instruction from the Storm staff. This provided many of these injured veterans not only equipment but also skills that they could take to their homes in small town America. Patients included many amputees as well as those veterans who had been affected by brain injuries during our Middle East wars.

In 2012, the association was challenged by a situation where some of its members were averaging scores in leagues that did not correlate with their performance in various tournament competitions. After deliberating, they decided to create the Rerate Committee to further evaluate the problem and suggest corrective actions if necessary. Noel was chosen to lead the effort, and he served as chairman of the committee from 2012 to 2019.

In 2013, after the death of the head of the Lane Inspection Team, Noel was asked to take over the responsibility for scheduling, inspecting, and recording results with USBC. He served in that capacity from 2013 to 2018. It required the assignment of three teams, including one led by him, to conduct the lane inspections required by USBC.

Noel Dysart is an accomplished bowler who has served his country and our association. An honored position has been reserved for him in the Nation's Capital Area United States Bowling Congress Association Hall of Fame.

Roger D. Rowley has been involved in bowling most of his life, on the lanes in competition, in management with several bowling companies/centers, and espe-



cially as a proprietor/ entrepreneur where he created a bowling supply company and created several products that are very much on the market today.

Although Roger had a brief stint (two years) as a youth bowler, it was following his United States Army service in the Presidential Honor Guard when his bowling career started to rise. During his first five

years of bowling, his average rose 30 pins into the low 200s and bowling became a passion for him ever since.

A regional PBA/PBA Senior member for over 30 years starting in the mid 1980s, his 25 perfect games and eight 800 series span nine different bowling centers. He was active in local events and tournaments, winning local scratch tournaments, the Virginia State Team Tournament in the mid-1990s, and four titles in Roger Tarr's "Over 40" event until injuries (knee replacement) necessitated some time away from physically bowling. Roger has bowled three perfect games after age 60, including one at the 2019 NCAUSBCA Senior Tournament at Bowl America Falls Church and another one at the 2019 BVL Mixed Tournament at Bowl America Shirley.

Prior to Roger's time away from performing on the lanes, his personal accomplishments included a high series of 822; a league average of 220 or higher in 14 of 15 winter seasons from 1999 to 2013 (with a high average of 232 in 2002); and an NCAUSBCA Top 10 ranking in the 2009-2010 season with a 220.873.

Even taking 2¹/₂ years off of bowling before his knee replacement did not stop Roger from contributing to the sport he loves. He enjoys talking with others about the sport and working with them to improve their game, especially youth bowlers. Those whom he instructed knew of his accomplishments on the lanes and felt confident that his knowledge would improve their game.

Roger has created products designed to help bowlers resolve common problems during league and tournament play. The first was "The Grip Strip," designed to aid in a better grip during the backswing, which, following a few tweaks, became the staple product for his company, Rowl Rite Bowling. More products came as a result, including "Grime Solver," which was an approved "anytime use" ball cleaner by USBC; and "Dry n Slide," a powder that aids in sliding by absorbing moisture from the bowler's shoes. His vision resulted in products available in over 50 pro shops across three countries. Rowl Rite Bowling had the opportunity to sponsor the University of Florida Gators bowling program for two seasons with products and promoting the sport of bowling, as well as some touring PBA players utilizing his products.

Roger's creativity was also seen in the creation of a scratch league using a challenge format—a three-game league where each game is scored differently. There also were separate jackpots that allowed bowlers to win money throughout the course of the season.

Roger's league challenge format became a reality in the summer of 2011 with 22 teams in a 40-lane center; the following two summers, the league had 40 teams. The interest in this format parlayed into the creation of additional leagues locally and in other parts of the country, with an emphasis on more challenging lane conditions that our current youth bowlers (tomorrow's adult bowlers) see more frequently than ever before.

The passion and commitment Roger has for our sport is unparalleled. His creative nature has brought forth products and resources that came directly from his experiences and challenges on the lanes, things that all bowlers face. His creativity generated a renewed interest in scratch bowling that continues to engage and challenge bowlers. And his return to the lanes following his knee replacement surgery will certainly bring forth more contributions for our sport.

Since Roger's return to bowling in 2015, he has once again maintained a 220-plus average in each season since. Most recently, Roger won the VISE VMSBT Senior/Super Senior Scratch Challenge I, beating local Hall of Famer and PBA member Lee Brosius in the finals. He has also bowled three more 300 games since his return.

Roger also has created several new tournaments that have done very well. One of which, The Scratch Call-Out Tournament, where scratch bowlers must actually call out their opponent from the field and beat them in a two-game total pins match, and then in order of pin fall, bowlers will again call out their opponent round by round until the last one standing is the Call Out Champion. So the eventual winner actually gets to call out their opponent all the way to the title.

The Hall of Fame recognizes those in our association whose visions and contributions to our sport have made a difference for the industry. The accomplishments of Roger D. Rowley, both on and off the lanes, along with his dedication and passion for our sport, make him a worthy addition to the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.

MICHAEL F. SINEK

Michael F. Sinek started bowling in 1970 with his father at Fair Lanes Woodlawn in the Early Bird Special on Sunday mornings. He has had a long history of coaching



and bowler development. Under his leadership, the University of Maryland team won their first-ever Eastern Pennsylvania Maryland Intercollegiate Bowling Conference Championship with a perfect 16-0 record in the 1989-1990 season. late-night The team practices at Andrews Air Force Base became legendary, with many local amateur and profession-

al bowlers stopping by to practice with the team.

He has strongly supported youth bowling in the association. In addition to supporting the Saturday Morning Youth and Sunday Junior Gold Prep programs, he also runs the Monday Junior Gold program, which focuses on pattern reading, lane play, and bowling ball selections. Fort Meade youth bowlers have had a lot of success recently at the NCAUSBCA Youth Invitational as well as supporting a majority of The USA Bowling Team Champion Chesapeake Bay Strikers. Mike's coordinated nationally recognized coaching opportunities like Storm University, Camp Bakes, and he personally ran bowling clinics for junior and adult bowlers at The Lanes Fort Meade.

Advanced Kegel Products such as Specto (laser radar tracking) and Torch ball path training tools have been introduced and installed at The Lanes, with Mike giving Specto and Torch lessons often. He regularly coaches bowlers of all skill levels and has also trained other coaches in the use of Specto and Torch, allowing bowlers and coaches of all skill levels to improve their performance.

One of Mike's proudest accomplishments is the creation of the Wounded Warrior Event at The Lanes Fort Meade and Bethesda Naval Bowling Center. He created this event to give Wounded Warriors equipment, instruction, and a recreational skill that they can carry with them forever. He procured sponsorship from Storm, Dexter, Vise, and Bowler's Supply to provide balls, bags, shoes, and accessories for the wounded warriors. During 2012 through 2013, Mike coordinated with the Fort Meade Soldiers' and Family Assistance Center (SFAC) and Bethesda Naval Hospital to fit and drill bowling balls for the wounded warriors. He also coordinated the training sessions with the professional bowlers and coaches on the Storm, Dexter, and Vise staffs. In 2014, with the dissolving of the Fort Meade SFAC, he coordinated with Noel Dysart, manager at Bethesda Naval Bowling Center, to run and emcee the event.

Mike has been considered a Sport Bowling expert for many years, helming the NCAUSBCA's first and longest-running Sport (Scratch) league, the Bud Scratch Trios at Fort Meade. He bowled in a Sport test league in St. Louis in 2000 and brought the concept to Fort Meade upon his return to the area.

Mike has supported bowlers in the association for years, working in pro shops and bowling centers. He started at Myers Pro Shop in 1985 under the tutelage of Berlin Myers and Pete Jackson. From 1987-1991, he worked out of the pro shop at Andrews Air Force Base, where he progressed from shop assistant to night manager. From 1991 to 1997, he managed centers at Brunswick Columbia Lanes and Fort Meade. He also worked with the Sports Plus/Carmen Don Pro Shop from 1997 to 2011, with a break in 2000 to 2001 when his wife was stationed in St. Louis. Upon his return back to the area, he went back to Sports Plus and worked there until he started his current managerial position at The Lanes Fort Meade.

Mike twice has held the position of Director for the NCAUSBCA. He was Conference Secretary/Treasurer at the Eastern Pennsylvania Maryland Intercollegiate Bowling Conference from 1986 to 1988. In addition, Mike penned the "Kollege Korner" column in *BOWL Magazine*, for which he also wrote occasional articles and took photographs when the PBA and PWBA tours were bowling locally. His "Ballard Ball" photo, which first appeared in *BOWL Magazine*, was picked up by the *Information Please Sports Almanac*.

Since 2001, Mike has worked for Storm Products as a Staff Coordinator, which includes advising and editing staff members' written reviews and videos submissions for bowling community Web sites and blogs. Mike helped set the framework from which the Storm Products staff grew from just over 200 to the more than 900 staffers that represent the company worldwide.



USBC Collegiate to extend eligibility for student-athletes

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress will grant an additional year of eligibility to studentathletes competing during the 2020–2021 USBC Collegiate season.

The decision is consistent with announcements from other collegiate athletic organizations and was made in conjunction with the USBC Collegiate Advisory Committee, comprised of representatives from the NCAA, National Association of Intercollegiate Athletics, National Junior Collegiate Athletic Association, and National Collegiate Bowling Coaches Association.

The 2020-2021 season originally was postponed in July due to the COVID-19 pandemic and is scheduled to begin in January 2021 as a second-semester sport.

"After reviewing the decisions made by other organizations and discussing options with the USBC Collegiate Advisory Committee, we agreed to grant an additional year of eligibility to student-athletes participating in the upcoming season," International Bowling Campus Youth Development Managing Director Gary Brown said. "With things changing daily across the country, we feel this decision provides the flexibility for the best possible student-athlete experience."

USBC announces 2021 tournament schedule

ARLINGTON, Texas — A new year is on the horizon, and that means exciting things for tournament bowlers and BowlTV subscribers.

The 2021 United States Bowling Congress event calendar again will include the traditional tournaments competitors of all ages and skill levels have grown to enjoy.

The tournament schedule and live BowlTV coverage will kick off with the USBC Team USA Trials during the first week of January.

The event originally was slated to take place in Las Vegas, but it now will be held in the Indianapolis area during the same time frame, Jan. 2–7.

The Team USA Trials will be followed by two high-profile events run in conjunction with the Professional Bowlers Association, the 2021 U.S. Open and USBC Masters.

The U.S. Open tentatively is scheduled for Feb. 21–28 at The Ashwaubenon Bowling Alley in Green Bay, Wisconsin, and the Masters is slated for March 29–April 4 at the Gold Coast Bowling Center in Las Vegas.

Both sets of dates are subject to change based on the schedule and programming for the PBA and its TV partner, FOX Sports, while locations and entry maximums also can change due to recommended best practices, social-distancing protocols, and other COVID-19 restrictions.

Both the U.S. Open, a collab-

orative effort between USBC and the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America and the Masters, again will be considered majors on the PBA Tour schedule.

Registration now is open for the pre-tournament qualifier, an on-site event that will give

The 2021 U.S. Open will feature 108 of the world's best bowlers, most of whom earned their spots in the event based on their recent on-lane performances. The list includes leaders on the PBA Tour points list and top performers at USBC events and PBA majors.

The U.S. Open format features qualifying across multiple oil patterns and round-robin match play, before the top five competitors advance to the TV stepladder, based on their 56game pinfall totals.

The Masters generally attracts hundreds of the sport's top competitors for 15 games of qualifying over three days, before the field is cut to the top 63, plus the defending champion, for a unique double-elimination match-play bracket that features three-game matches.

The 2020 U.S. Open was held in Lincoln, Nebraska in February and won by Australia's Jason Belmonte for the 12th of his record 13 major titles. The 2020 Masters was canceled in 2020 due to COVID-19. Lefthander Jakob Butturff won the event at Gold Coast in 2019.

Along with the U.S. Open and Masters, the format, location, and entry maximums for all 2021 USBC tournaments are subject to change based on the recommended best practices and social-distancing protocols as the start date of each tournament approaches.
