New squad schedule announced for USBC Open Championships through 2024

LAS VEGAS — The United States Bowling Congress recently announced that a new squad schedule will be put into place for the next three editions of the USBC Open Championships, beginning in 2022.

The change was a result of tracking start and finish times during the 2021 USBC Open Championships, along with bowler feedback during a variety of daily schedules in recent years. The adjustments are being made with on-time squads and bowler experience as the top areas of focus.

The new schedule will eliminate the late-night doubles and singles squad and end each day with a combination squad that will use half the facility for team competition and half for doubles and singles.

Team bowling in 2022, 2023, and 2024 will take place at 2 p.m. and 9:30 p.m. (combo), and doubles/ singles squads will be held at 7 a.m., 10:30 a.m., 6 p.m., and 9:30 p.m. (combo). The event will continue to feature two oil patterns—one for the team event and one for doubles/singles—and fresh oil for every squad.

BOWLERO CORP. TO ACQUIRE BOWL AMERICA

Area bowlers woke on the morning of May 28 to news that Bowl America was going to be acquired by New York-based Bowlero Corp., the largest operator of bowling centers in North America. Many locals had wondered aloud what would happen to the Alexandria-based chain following the October 14, 2019 death of President Leslie Goldberg, 89, son of Bowl America founder and NCAUSBCA Hall of Famer C. Edward Goldberg. Bowl America, which opened its first center, Shirley, in 1958, currently operates 17 centers, including nine in NCAUSBCA's jurisdiction, with other locations in Baltimore, Richmond, and Jacksonville, Florida. Bowlero owns more than 300 bowling centers as well as the Professional Bowlers Association. "Bowlero Corp. is committed to delivering a world-class bowling experience to the 28 million-plus guests we serve each year and are thrilled to welcome Bowl America's 17 centers to our portfolio," said Tom Shannon, Bowlero Corp. CEO.

STARR SHINES AT JUNIOR GOLD **CHAMPIONSHIPS**

At the recent Junior Gold Championships in Indianapolis, Ind., Kayla Starr, 14, of Crofton, Md., who placed second among 298 competitors in the U15 Girls Division, earned a \$6,500 scholarship as well as a spot on the Junior Team USA's Developmental Team. In 2019, Starr won the D Division of the NCAUSBCA Youth Invitational Scratch Singles Tournament, and she followed the next season with a fourth-place finish in the B Division. ... Meanwhile, in the Elimination Bracket of the U18 Boys Division, James Bennett, Huntingtown, Md., fell two games short of reaching the TV Finals, placing fifth (\$3,000 scholarship). Since the new schedule will limit the maximum number of teams per day to 84, the 2022 tournament will be extended by two weeks and allow for a capacity of more than 10,600 teams. It will run from March 12–July 16 (last team date), which is 128 consecutive days of competition. If demand warrants, the tournament can be extended as far as July 31.

Captains of teams already signed up for the 2022 Open that will be affected by the time changes will be notified by eMail.

The Open Championships will return to the South Point Bowling Plaza in 2022 and 2024, and the 2023 event will be held at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada.

"We took a close look at the information we've collected during the 2021 Open Championships, and after making some squad adjustments for this year, we felt it made sense to look ahead to upcoming events, too," USBC Executive Director Chad Murphy said. "The squad durations have been consistent, so we felt comfortable making this change. We aim for the best possible bowler experience, and being on-time is a big part of that."

The success of the new daily schedule will be evaluated in the coming years, and adjustments may be made again before the 2025 tournament in Baton Rouge, Louisiana.

600 CLUB (\$40 each tournament): Any youth bowler who has bowled a certified 600 series in the NCAUSBCA Youth program is eligible for membership in the 600 Club. All competition is Scratch. There are 2 average divisions: Under 180 and 180+. Bowlers qualify for the season ending Tournament of Champions based on top finishes in the monthly tournaments. **NEW FORMAT – bowl 5 games and then stepladder finals for the monthly events. The doubles stepladder will use the Baker format.**

INVITATIONAL (\$30 each round / \$0 final round): All NCAUSBCA youth bowlers with a current season House Shot average of 150 (141 Challenge, 135 SPORT) or higher for 12 or more games will be invited to this tournament. 
