



"Bowling Achievement" Hall of Fame candidates must have Championship Tournament participation

The NCAUSBCA Board of Directors recently passed a proposal that requires individuals nominated for the association's Hall of Fame in the "Bowling Achievement" category to have participated in a minimum of three (3) of the past five (5) championship events — the Open Championship Tournament for men and the Women's Championship Tournament for women.

For current non-member Bowling Achievement nominees, NCAUSBCA Championship Tournament participation in their last five seasons as an NCA-USBCA member (if applicable) will be considered.

In addition to Hall of Fame members being given perpetual honor and recognition in Nation's Capital Area bowling circles (as well as the International Bowling Museum & Hall of Fame in Arlington, Texas), NCAUSBCA goes all out, spending literally hundreds of dollars for a jacket, ring, certificates, etc., for each new inductee as part of its induction procedure.

Therefore, the board voted that all Bowling Achievement nominees should, at the very least, demonstrate support for the inducting organization by participation in its Championship Tournament.

MANAGER'S MEMO • Ronald McGregor



Be careful throwing that first ball of the new season!

Many leagues are now bowling, and some began on the first day of the season—a pent-up need to get back to bowling, I guess. I know I'm ready to get started.

If you did not bowl last season, be careful when you throw that first ball. A few bowlers got an up-close and personal look at the oil on the floor when they fell. *How did my timing go off so quickly*, they wondered.

Some leagues have decided to be "vaccine" leagues. This is fine, as long as bowling center management agrees and the league by majority vote elects to make this distinction.

As you may recall, USBC rules states that prize lists should be prepared and voted on by the fifth week. Team members should have each other's contact information. If one of your teammates isn't showing up, and worse yet not paying, at least you can find out what his/ her situation is and let a league

officer know. Most leagues have a "no arrearages" policy, so don't let league fees go unpaid for too long. Unpaid fees affect your prize fund. Last season, we had too many instances of prize money disappearing. Presidents: Please check the bank account monthly. There should be two signors on the account, and withdrawals must have two signatures as well.



Five elected to NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame

Bell, Clark, Holland, Sudduth, Taylor form "Class of 2021"

DARNELL R. BELL

Darnell R. Bell spent most of his childhood playing sports and watching his family bowl at Park-



land, Bowl America Silver Hill, and Bowl America Kent. At 14, he started working at Parkland as a porter and in later years as a mechanic.

He never participated in youth leagues but started bowling as an adult at age 16 with his father, which made him want to get

better. While in high school, he kept score for many of the area's top bowlers in pot games at Silver Hill, and this inspired him to want to bowl on their level.

During the 1990s, he worked on his game under the guidance of the late Lamont Bush and rolled a perfect game in 1995 — the first of 25 in this area, along with 13 800 series. Bush, Gerry Flemming, and future Hall of Famer Glenn Callaway helped him understand various aspects of bowling, including layouts, ball surfaces, and lane play.

After winning a Team USA Qualifier in 2000, Darnell represented Virginia in the Team USA trials in Reno, Nev. That experience advanced his interest in the game.

In 2004, he signed his first advisory contract with Track (under Chuck Gardner), and in 2006, he moved to the Columbia 300 Amateur Staff (Chad Murphy). He currently is a Columbia 300 staff member (Brands of Brunswick).

He ran successful singles leagues in 2010 and 2011. The following year, while serving as tournament director for the The National Bowling Association's (TNBA) Greater Washington Bowling Senate (GWBS) Doubles event, he opened the Str8bizness Pro Shop.

Darnell has appeared in the association's "Top 10" rankings three times — 9th in 1998-1999 (212.18 composite average), 4th in 2007-2008 (223.622), and 9th in 2016-2017 (227.3216).

The NCAUSBCA Open Championship Tournament is always on his calendar, and in recent years, he's been one of its top performers: In 2017, he tossed a perfect game in the Team event. In 2018, he rolled two 300s in an 847 series to capture the Scratch Singles title and place third in Singles. In 2019, he was runner-up in Scratch All-Events and third in Scratch Singles.

Darnell has a 190 average for 27 games on challenging USBC Open Championships lane conditions, and over the past 25 years, he has placed high in numerous tournaments and has emerged as champion in many different events, including: Maryland Handicap & Scratch Open (three times), Clash of the Titans Doubles (with Keni Lowe Jr. in Delaware), Vir-Mar Scratch Bowlers Tour (twice), TNBA Singles division of GWBS Doubles, TNBA Eastern Regional All-Events in New Jersey, Lilac Optional Singles (in Scratch Doubles), Bowl4Money.com Sport Shot, and the Roger Rowley Call-Out Tournament at Quantico.

Darnell R. Bell has demonstrated sustained excellence on the lanes. He is a most deserving addition to the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.

BARRY CLARK

Barry Clark started his career in 1969 as a 16year-old porter at Lynwood Lanes in Woodbridge. After completion of four years of college at George



Mason University, he was advanced to Assistant Manager. With his family influence in management and his degree business, in he quickly advanced through the ranks, and by the age of 30 became a bright and shining star in local bowling center management.

Over the past 10 years, his center, Bowl America Woodbridge, provided close to \$200,000 in scholarship money to participating youth bowlers involved in the USBC SMART program and holds the rank of the "Number 1" college scholarship provider in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

In 1983, Barry was given his first center to manage, Bowl America Burke, and in over a 5¹/₂-year period, he raised the youth league bowler count from 270 to 591. One of the ways he did this was to help create the "Rolling Bowling" idea. At the time, Bowl America had a fully operational lane with an approach, ball return, and automatic pinsetter housed in a long trailer.

From 1985-1988, Barry assisted in the Braddock Road Youth Club, where he became Commissioner of Bowling and was successful in introducing bowling to a whole new group of youth bowlers.

From 1988–1998, while Barry was manager of Bowl America Manassas, he was involved with the school board, trying to get bowling recognized as a club sport. When the board decided to cancel the bowling programs, Barry created the Northern Virginia High School Boosters league, which was able to offer scholarships instead of trophies.

While at Bowl America Woodbridge, from which Barry on September 2, 2021 retired after more than 23 years as manager, every participating child was offered free reconditioned bowling balls and drilling, as long as he/she remained in the youth program. In addition, the center offered the following leagues: youth/ adult, Saturday morning youth, high school, home school, and college.

In 1989, due to his experience and involvement in the sport of bowling, Barry was selected by the administration of Northern Virginia Community College to be the adjunct instructor for the Loudoun campus. In 2012, he was selected for the equivalent position at the Manassas campus. His positions ended in 2019 after 30 years of service.

For all of these reasons, Barry Clark's passion, dedication, and proven accomplishments for the sport of bowling make him a worthy candidate for the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.

LORENZO "ZONE" HOLLAND

Lorenzo "Zone" Holland was first introduced to bowling while serving in the United States Ma-



rine Corps. It was here that he developed his love for bowling while receiving instructions from legendary bowler Don Carter.

In 1996, after serving 22 years in the Marine Corps, Zone returned home to Calvert County in Southern Maryland, where

he became a fixture on Saturdays as a youth bowling coach. Having no kids of his own in the bowling program, he has dedicated every Saturday since then to coaching youth bowlers of all ages. In addition, he is more than willing to provide instruction to adult bowlers of all skill levels to those who ask.

Zone's passion and dedication to youth bowlers of all ages and skill levels has resulted in him starting additional bowling clinics that are held on Sunday mornings and Wednesdays afternoons. These additional clinics have resulted in having numerous youth bowlers bowl perfect games during both regular league play and during youth tournaments.

During these sessions, youth bowlers are exposed to many different lane conditions and oil patterns in which he instructs them on how to attack the pattern. Beyond the additional instructional sessions developed and managed by Zone, he constantly searches for tournament and scholarship information to pass on to his youth bowlers. This has resulted in one of his students receiving a full bowling scholarship to Indiana Tech University. Zone will take the time at his own expense to travel both locally as the youth travel team coach and nationally to watch and instruct his youth bowlers while they are competing in numerous tournaments. Additionally, Zone serves as the Director/Coach for Lord Calvert Bowl's Youth Travel league.

Zone assists the youth bowlers with numerous fund-raising events to help offset the costs of the out-of-state tournaments. Some of the fund-raisers include "50/50s" and bowling ball raffles. For over 32 years, Zone has promoted the sport of bowling to both youth and adults by dedicating his time and passing on his passion for the sport. He is willing to go above and beyond to assist anyone who is interested in learning the sport. This includes obtaining at his own expense the Bronze Level Coaching Certification so he can better coach and instruct his students. He also has held the position of president in numerous leagues.

In addition to his passionate dedication to the sport through coaching, Zone is an accomplished bowler himself, as his record includes 11 perfect games and three 800 series.

The youth bowlers that are our future will continue to carry on the passion of our sport. It is coaches like Lorenzo "Zone" Holland that pass on the knowledge and passion to our future adult competitors. An honored place awaits him in the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.

JOHN SUDDUTH

In 1957, a bowling center was built in John Sudduth's small town of Warrenton, Va., where he



went bowling with many of his friends, though he did not do very well at the time. Then he started going every day until he became better and started beating them.

When he was 11, he started working at the center, watching the kids while their mothers

bowled. He worked at the center until he was 18 before going off to school.

He loved the sport of bowling and became one of the best youth bowlers in the area. During this time, he learned as much as he could about bowling, especially by watching the PBA tournaments on television.

In 1969, he went into the Army and spent 1¹/₂ years in Germany, where he bowled every day. During this time, he would help people learn to bowl. When he was not helping others, he participated in tournaments every weekend, winning several events.

When he started bowling in the Washington, D.C. Area, his game had improved so much that he qualified fifth in the Nation's Capital Area Bowling Association's (NCABA) "Top 10" Rankings in the 1975-1976 season. He also won the Virginia State All-Events and Doubles. John placed second in several other tournaments, including the Don May Summer Classic (twice), Nation's Capital Area/Baltimore Area Masters (twice), and NCABA Mini Masters.

During this time, he was involved with improving bowling in this area. It largely began in 1981, when Bowl America's Irv Clark created a new position for John, "Bowler Development Coordinator." Within the first year, John went to every seminar he could, including classes conducted by the PBA, Brunswick, and Century. He spent time in Las Vegas and trained under legendary instructors Don Johnson and Fred Borden. John went to virtually every seminar by Bill Taylor and spent several days with Tom Kouros. By doing this, he became a Master Instructor who trained many staff members and anybody else who wanted to learn how to teach bowling. He has taught over 1,500 people.

When John first started, he trained several Bowl America employees how to measure and drill a bowling ball. Before this time, the managers would take the measurements and send them to the main office, where the balls would be drilled and sent back to the center. Over a two-year period, he helped Bowl America create 14 pro shops in its centers.

One of John's first jobs was to make sure that all lanes were properly oiled. He was sent to lane maintenance seminars, where he learned the importance of properly cleaning and oiling lanes each day. By buying updated lane machines, there was a more consistent scoring environment. Overall company lane maintenance became much better once these changes were initiated.

In the the mid-1990s, Bowl America sent John to Jacksonville, Florida, where he became a regional manager for the company.


A PBA member for 35 years, he still tries to learn as much as possible about bowling. He gained additional knowledge about our sport while serving on the board of the Bowling Proprietors' Association of America for 12 years with some of the top leaders in the game.

John Sudduth has spent his whole life learning, teaching, and bowling. He's loved every minute of it and would not change any of these experiences for the world. He is a welcome addition to the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.

NORBERT O. TAYLOR JR.

Norbert O. Taylor Jr. has participated in the sport of tenpin bowling for almost 50 years. He has been one the fiercest competitors on the lanes, and his competitive nature brings out the best of those who compete against him.

As a competitive bowler, he has been very successful, having tallied 14 perfect games, along with 12 800 series during his bowling career. His highest sanctioned average is 229. While his prowess as a bowler is distinguished, his service



to the game and his willingness to further the education of fellow bowlers is what sets him apart from others.

In service to the game of bowling, Norbert excels in his commitment and conversance.

His commitment: Norbert has a passion for the game, not just as a bowler,

but also as an ambassador to the sport of bowling. Through his Crofton Classic Pro Shop, he and his team have sponsored a number of local tournaments to foster the competitive bowling environment. He is a great teacher and mentor, spending time with bowlers of all skill sets, teaching them the finer points of the game. Many bowlers owe a debt of gratitude to the fine coaching he has provided.

Norbert has been instrumental in the growth of several youth programs, helping the next generation learn and understanding the art of bowling. He has also assisted a number of college-bound bowlers prepare for competitive bowling at the next level, through lectures and expert ball-fitting. Many of his students, both young and old, have found success in league, tournament, and collegiate competition.

Bowling as we know is at a crossroads due to decreasing numbers of sanctioned bowlers and the effects of COVID-19. Norbert has done a lot to help grow the game of bowling during these tough times by reaching out to the next generation of bowlers, our youth and young adults, and providing them a safe haven to be able to discuss and learn about the art of bowling. Through his pro shop, he has brought industry leaders and experts to help further the knowledge flow of bowling. Norbert currently passes his knowledge to the next generation of drillers by using his pro shop as a lab to teach the finer points of pro shop operations.

His conversance: Norbert currently is a coowner of one of the most successful pro shops in the area. He has been involved with bowling pro shops since 1982, working in shops located in AMF Capital Plaza and the former AMF Clinton. Norbert is International Bowling Pro Shop and Instructors Association-certified and attends numerous workshops yearly to stay up on the most up-to-date information regarding bowling, equipment, and technology. This knowledge and attention to detail have allowed him to be able to provide world-class service to his customers and students. His knowledge and expertise has enabled numerous bowlers to reach personal accomplishments regarding scores and tournament victories. But more specifically, he helped generations of bowlers fall in love and continue to love the game of bowling.

Without Norbert's desire and willingness to aid the bowling community, there would be many individuals who may not have had the opportunity to reach their bowling summit regarding knowledge and training, compete with the confidence that they had the best equipment and fit for their game, or simply know that they had someone in their corner who did the best he could to help them be all they could be as a bowler.

Norbert O. Taylor Jr. has been one of the best bowling ambassadors in this area who has made a difference in many bowlers' lives and careers. A special spot has been reserved for him in the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame.
