USBC BOARD KEEPS PRE-PANDEMIC DELEGATE COUNTS

The United States Bowling Congress Board of Directors approved two resolutions that allow delegate representation for annual association meetings to be based on membership from the 2018-2019 season. The first resolution for the 2022 USBC Annual Meeting maintains historical representation across the country by using 2018-2019 membership totals for delegate counts. The second resolution allows USBC state associations the option to use either 2018-2019 or 2020-2021 membership totals to determine delegate counts at their annual meetings. Due to the coronavirus pandemic, significantly varying standards of federal, state, and local orders impacted bowling center operations. As a result, USBC membership in the 2019-2020 and the 2020-2021 seasons does not accurately reflect the historical membership for some USBC associations. These resolutions were passed to accurately and fairly determine delegate representation for 2022 annual meetings. The USBC Board has authority to temporarily suspend or amend the USBC Bylaws to address issues related to a pandemic. The 2022 USBC Annual Meeting will be held at The Orleans Hotel & Casino in Las Vegas from April 25-28.

NEW HALL OF FAME POLICY, TAKE 2 Last issue, NCAUSBCA announced a new Hall of Fame policy whereby Bowling Achievement nominees must have competed in at least three of the past five NCAUSBCA championship tournaments. Some readers did not understand that the policy applies *only* to NCAUSBCA members and *only* during the existence of NCAUSBCA (since 2006). It does not apply to any NCABA or WDCAWBA bowling.

NCAUSBCA Hall of Famer Dean Ryan died on October 26. Ryan, who managed The Lanes Fort Meade from 1996 to 2011, was a strong supporter of youth bowling as well as high-level bowling, hosting five PBA East Regional and six PBA Senior East Regional tournaments. He was a member of the Hall of Fame "Class of 2013." ... Director Phyllis Bourque again this season set a standard for BVL collections, recently submitting \$1,740 from mem-

bers at AMF Waldorf. Leagues contributing included Thursday Mixers (\$302), Tuesday AM Mixed (\$255), Pinefield Mixed (\$202), Winky Strine Memorial (\$202), Monday Mixers (\$195), Sunday Mixers (\$152), Inez Golden Keglers (\$151), Pins & Pitchers (\$116), Friday Friends (\$80), and Sunday Survivors (\$75).

Final policy revisions to USBC SMART program announced

ARLINGTON, Texas – The United States Bowling Congress has approved final policy revisions for its Scholarship Management and Account Reporting for Tenpins (SMART) program. The policy includes revisions based on a comment period earlier this year.

In April 2021, the USBC proposed a series of policy changes designed to increase scholarship benefits for SMART Recipients. All proposals were open for a comment period until June 30. After reviewing the feedback from webinars and submitted comments, the final policy was approved by the Oversight Committee and USBC Board of Directors.

The final policy maintains the proposed concept of allocating a portion of future investment gains and expired scholarships directly to SMART Recipient accounts by providing additional scholarships for those actively using SMART funds and creating a new SMART Recipient grant program.

NCAUSBCA Hall of Famer Greg Turner of Temple Hills, Md., became a PBA champion on September 1, 2021 by defeating Darryl Bower of Middletown, Pa., 216–214 in the PBA60 Kingsport Convention & Visitors Bureau Open in Kingsport, Tenn. For some, the final frame undoubtedly brought back memories of the 1995 Bayer/Brunswick Touring Players Championship title contest between Randy Pedersen and Ernie "I don't believe it!" Schlegel.

At the recent NCAUSBCA Senior Tournament at Bowl America Fairfax, Turner, after continuing his excellent bowling, answered several questions posed by editor Bob Cosgrove.

What was your outlook coming into that PBA60 tournament?

The month before, I had bowled on that same [Dick Weber] pattern, and I thought I had a good look, but it didn't pan out, so I went home and picked up some balls and came back to that same pattern. I was looking for a better outlook and outcome. Did I think I was going to win it? Not in the beginning, no. I thought I would have to throw a lot of strikes, but luckily I did, so it worked out.

What went through your mind as you prepared to bowl for the title?

Just trying to make the same shots I've made all day because during warm-up, I saw had a good look, so I was just trying to make the shots I've been making and stay with the game plan.

What's it like to win your first PBA Senior regional title?

It was very exciting, emotional. All of the hard work that I know I've done. I've always wanted to be a PBA player, and to be a champion, that was really great, very exciting.

What's been the reaction from people after your victory?

They've been excited for me. For some reason, they think I'm carrying the banner for the Black people, so they've been excited. They've given me love, so I appreciate that. Everybody kept saying that they expected me to do that—if I ever got out there and got a chance, they knew it was coming.

Can it be said your title match with Darryl Bower had a most interesting ending?

Yes, I felt sorry for him because he actually bowled well, and that shot was a great shot when he left that (solid) 8-pin. And I'll never be mad with the 8-pin again!

He needed a double to win, and he got the first one. I thought when I didn't strike, he was going to throw all three in the tenth—I just knew it. But luckily, it didn't happen.

Bower is a really nice guy. I felt bad for him, and I gave him his props when I took my seat.

I've always wanted to be a PBA player, and to be a champion, that was really great, very exciting.

How does this win rank among your bowling moments?


The greatest—without any question.

A dream come true?

I'm living the dream, believe me.

How does your victory affect your thinking about yourself as a bowler?

I don't think it has changed any. I still think I'm pretty good. I probably could be better. I still have a lot of stuff to learn. The guys don't tell me much out there, but I've have gotten a couple of tips from a couple of guys. It's been okay. I expect to win again.



Was there ever any doubt that a victory in PBA competition would occur?

Yes. I joined [the PBA] last year, and I was about ready to quit before this tournament because I thought I couldn't figure it out. Everybody kept pushing me, saying, "*Man, you can do it. You can do it.*" So I just stayed with it. I feel better now.

How did you celebrate your victory?

I really haven't, I guess. I was kinda like in shock, so the wife drove most of the way back home until I could calm down. We haven't really celebrated; we're just look forward to the next one.

What bowling balls did you use?

Hammer Obsession Tour, which I used almost exclusively. I tried to change, but nothing else looked good, so I kept that ball in my hand and used it for the entire tournament.

And for your spare ball?

Just a regular spare plastic ball—the Radical Spare Ball.

How do people react when they learn you bowl with a 14-pound ball?

Besides *you*, nobody's really thought about it. A lot of people know, and when I tell people, it's no big deal. You're the only one who makes a big deal about it!

Who services your bowling equipment?

Adonis Taylor—"Pooh"—at World Class Pro Shop. I can tell him what I want, and I don't even have to be there. We've been working together for a long time, so he was excited. We've been going through layouts and stuff.

Who are your strongest competitors in the area?

Ron Holt, Bobby Hall [II] ... we battle a lot. I would say those two on the senior level. I don't really play much with the young guys anymore.



The Best Bowling Tip I Ever Received

By Roger Rowley



While working with PBA Senior Tour member and Rowl Rite staffer Don Sylvia, we had many conversations about bowling and equipment. He was talking to me one day about commitments and focus that you have to have at high-level events. One of the many bowling tips he told me that sticks in my mind the most and I have used for many years can also be used in many situations.

Don said that when you're bowling in a tournament and have to make an adjustment, whether it's a line change, a ball change, or even changing your wrist position, you have to fully believe in the change and commit to it, both mentally and physically. You cannot have any doubts about whether it will work. He said that if you have doubts, you can't fully commit to the shot, and


if you don't fully commit to the shot, you're cheating yourself.

Bowling is a game of constant adjustments, he added, and every competitor is doing it, too. All bowlers make adjustments, but not all bowlers fully commit to them—the good ones do.

I've used this thought process for years, especially as of late. The adjustments you make aren't always the right ones, but if you truly believe it's right and commit to it, then you'll put forth your full effort.

Don made the point by saying that when you're bowling in an event and have the front eight, you take your time, you stay into the shot longer, you focus on your target more, you breathe right, etc. That's the same focus and commitment you have to give to your new adjustments.

Roger Rowley was elected to the NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame in 2020.


