USBC bans six more bowling balls for national tournament play

ARLINGTON, Texas — The United States Bowling Congress and Storm Products have agreed on a national tournament exclusion rule and ball exchange program for six Storm Products manufactured ball models. The agreement comes after USBC identified the models having a percentage of balls produced below USBC minimum 73D hardness specification.

USBC's investigation showed a percentage of these ball models measured below the USBC-required hardness level of the approval samples submitted by Storm. Storm collaborated with USBC after being notified of this testing.

The affected models include: Storm Phase 4, Storm Electrify Solid, Storm Trend 2, 900 Global Altered Reality, 900 Global Wolverine, and Roto Grip UFO Alert.

Effective March 30, 2022, these balls models are prohibited from use in USBC national tournaments, including, but not limited to, the USBC Masters, U.S. Open, USBC Open Championships, USBC Women's Championships, all PWBA Tour events, USBC Junior Gold and Youth Open Championships, USBC Intercollegiate Championships, USBC Team USA Trials, USBC Senior Masters, and USBC Senior Queens.

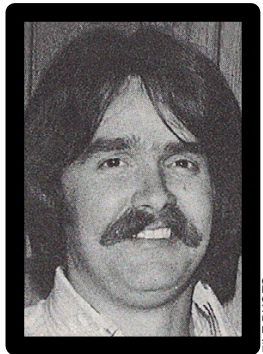

**RAY SHACKELFORD
(1949-2022)**

NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame member Ray Shackelford tragically died February 20 in an auto accident. He was 73. From the 1974-1975 to 1980-1981 seasons, he appeared in the association's "Top 10" rankings six times, including the No. 1 position in the 1977-1978 and 1979-1980 seasons. Shackelford, who competed on the PBA Tour in the early 1980s – and whose travel mate was a little-known bowler named Walter Ray Williams Jr. – gained attention in 1982 when he rolled three perfect games in the Ro-lais Open in Florissant, Mo., and the following year made nationally televised finals in [San Jose, Calif.](#), Houston (where he was runner-up to Bob Handley), and at the [Fair Lanes Open](#) at Woodlawn. His performances earned him a 1984 Tour exemption. He later opened Planet Fun, the first bowling center in Virginia that was alcohol and smoke-free and had great success with the company he and wife Sue founded, Golden Coin Amusements. He was a member of the Hall of Fame "Class of 1984."

**PBA BILLY WELU
SCHOLARSHIP**

The Professional Bowlers Association Billy Welu Scholarship is awarded annually, recognizing exemplary qualities in male or female college students who compete in the sport of bowling. The scholarship winner receives \$1,000. To be eligible candidates must be amateur bowlers who are currently in college (preceding the application date) and maintain at least a 2.5/4.0 GPA or equivalent. Applications must be postmarked by June 22. The scholarship was established to annually recognize a college student who combines outstanding bowling talents with academic excellence. The late Welu was a two-champion PBA Tour champion and was a member of the PBA Hall of Fame's inaugural induction class in 1975.

These ball models remain USBC-approved. Each USBC competition, whether tournament or league, has the option to adopt USBC's national tournament rule prohibiting use of these balls or to continue to allow their use.

USBC has shared this national tournament rule with Storm and has Storm's support. Storm will offer owners of the affected balls the option to exchange their balls for a new product. Information about the exchange program will be published on stormbowling.com.

MANAGER'S MEMO • RONALD MCGREGOR

Do your league rules cover all potential problems?

The 2021-2022 winter bowling season is nearing its conclusion, and, as usual, there are a few critical items that should have been covered to ensure an enjoyable season. An audit should have been conducted to detect any problems with the payment of the prize fund. Interaction with the treasurer is critical in making the audit a success. Any problems not covered by the league rules should have been noted along with a plan to correct those problems for next season.

Lately, I have gotten a few calls regarding the handling/violation of "cap rules." Believe it or not, there are illegal balls in play (weight/balance holes, thumb holes not being used; finger holes not used; Can isopropyl alcohol be used to clean the ball? etc.). These and any equipment specification questions can be answered by visiting [here](#).

Don't forget about elections for next season. It is important to get it out of the way before season's end.

This season's membership numbers are definitely an improvement over last season, but by no means are we back to pre-pandemic levels. Membership stands at 10,004 including youth bowlers, a far cry from the 15,000-plus prior to COVID rearing its ugly head. Mask mandates being lifted and the high rate of vaccinated folks in our area have helped, and it remains to be seen how many more bowlers decide to

come out and enjoy the sport we all love so well.

Our association tournaments conducted this season have seen a rise in participation, so that is good news. We recently completed the 75th Annual Open Tournament. The Lanes Fort Meade hosted the team event, and Bowl America Gaithersburg housed the doubles and singles. We had 92 entries, 76 of which were team entries, and we reintroduced the Crossover Doubles event, which had 229 entries.

Next season, we plan to move the Women's and Open tournaments back to their regular time slots in March and April, respectively. We hope to announce the location of these events at our Annual Membership Meeting in June.

Our association will host the Virginia State Women's and Open tournaments at Bowl America Bull Run and Bowl America Chantilly. The [Open Tournament](#) entry deadline is April 15, so there is still time to get a team together and bowl.

Delegates elected at last year's Annual Meeting will soon head off to Las Vegas to attend the national USBC Convention. There is only one by-law amendment up for a vote, and it would allow for remote ballot voting at the USBC Annual Meeting. It is posted [here](#), and we invite you to give us your feedback so that we can vote your wishes on April 28.

In closing, if you have any ideas about things we can do to

The award winners, honored for bowling achievement and/or service to youth bowling, were each presented with a plaque and \$500 in scholarship funds, which will be administered through the USBC SMART program. In addition, the four names appear on a second plaque of honorees, which now total 31.

JA'SEAN BILLINGS • Hyattsville, Maryland

Some of Ja'Sean's bowling achievements include a 300 game and 815 series on the same day at age

Final Advancers round appear-ances at the Junior Gold Championships, a second-place finish at Virginia State, and many more. He also participates in adult tournaments, including PBA Regionals and the Money Bags Scratch, Last One Standing, Virginia-Maryland Scratch, and Sunday 9-Pin No Tap events.

Ja'Sean currently is a junior at Suitland High, where he holds a 3.0 GPA. He does community service for the Boys & Girls Club and for the past three seasons has served on the Board of Directors of the Nation's Capital Area USBC Association. In earlier years, he helped coach the younger kids in his leagues at AMF Marlow Heights and Potomac Lanes.

Off the lanes, he enjoys hanging out with

friends and play golf, baseball, tennis, and, of course, more bowling. He always shows his bowling spirit all over by wearing ball brands and league shirts. His journey in bowling began with his grandfather, Kevin Roy, who started him in bowling at age 3. For Ja'Sean, bowling “felt like second nature.”

He currently participates in two leagues, the Monday Night Sport at The Lanes Fort Meade, where he holds a 185 average, which converts to a 214 average on house conditions, and the Friday MAJBT Sport Shot at Greenway Bowl, where his 170 average converts to 197.

Every year, he participates in Junior Gold, one of the largest youth bowling tournaments in the country, with several thousand youth bowlers. In this prestigious event, he has made it to the Final Advancers round three times, earning \$943 in scholarship money. He also made the Advancers round twice for an additional \$400.

All of the above qualities merit Ja'Sean Billings the NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award.

ANDRU BLANEY • Indian Head, Maryland

Andru Blaney is a role model for his youth league, as represents himself, his family, and the league at the highest levels both on and off the lanes. It has been an honor to watch Andru grow into the person he is today.

Andru was raised in the bowling alley, and at a very young age, he would sit and watch all of the bowlers. He is a well-rounded person and athlete who takes pride in being a role model.

Andru is a student of the game and spends many hours each week practicing and bowling his leagues at AMF Waldorf and The Lanes Fort Meade.

Andru is currently one of the top bowlers in the Saturday Morning Youth league at Waldorf. Andru works hard to mentor some of the



younger kids in his youth league, as there are many who want to bowl two-handed. Often, he can be found guiding and encouraging some of the younger kids on how to adjust to lane conditions, providing insight on where they should be playing on the lanes. He works very hard to continuously improve himself both on and off the lanes.

Chad Murphy said. “There is no perfect solution to this type of problem, but this agreement strikes a balance in protecting the integrity of USBC national tournaments, while giving members a choice to do what is best for them locally.”
Per the agreement, Storm Products will discontinue sales of the affected balls. USBC has concluded its investigation and will not take action on additional balls related to this production issue.
This agreement does not change the status of the Storm Spectre. The Spectre remains unapproved and on USBC’s non-conforming ball list.

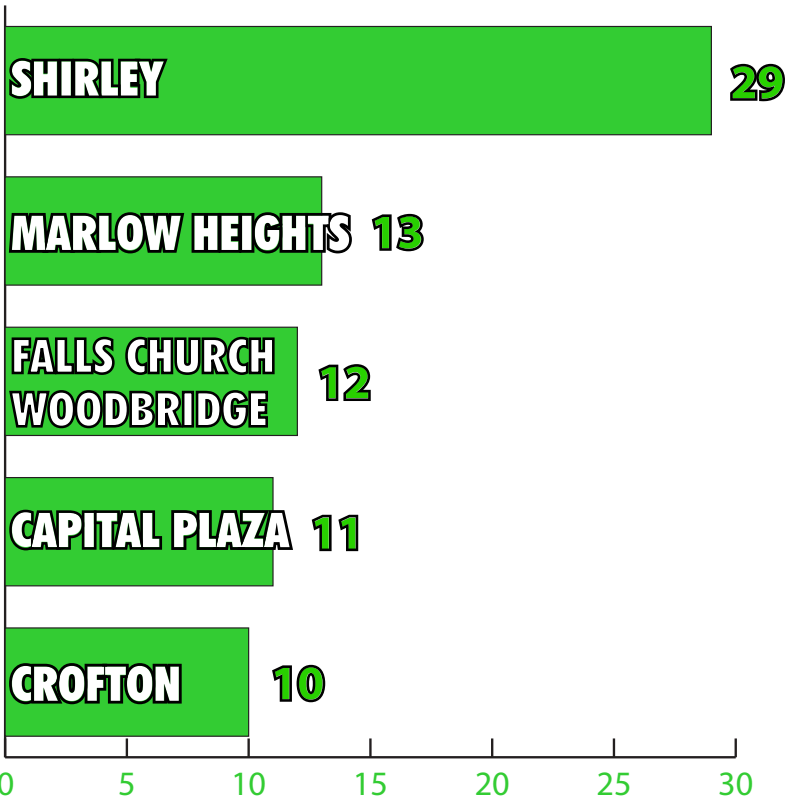

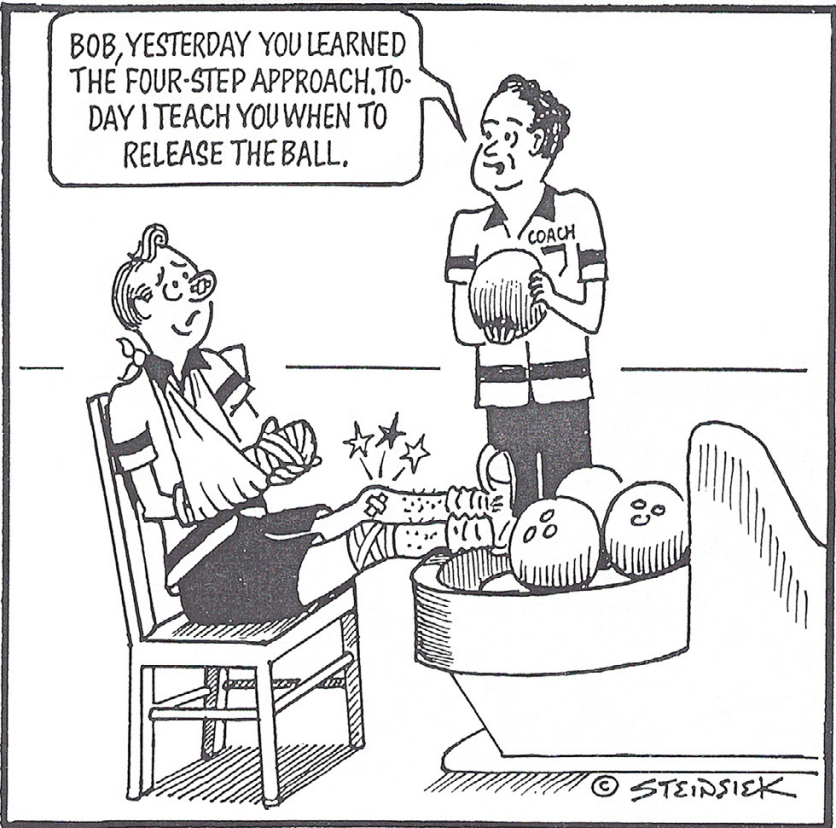

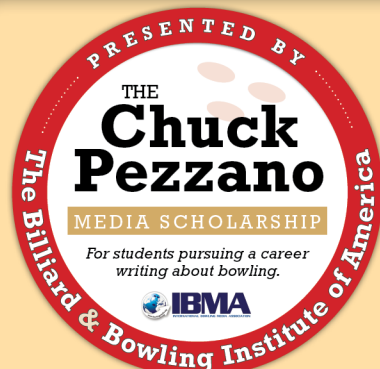

22nd Annual Guys & Dolls Tournament Rules

1. The Tournament is open to any bowler providing proof of a 2021-2022 USBC Membership and book average from the prior 2 seasons, or a final 2021-2022 league standings sheet if no prior years.
2. Bowlers must present a USBC membership card at the tournament check-in **30 minutes prior** to scheduled start time. Lineup will be **as shown on entry form**. Teams or bowlers failing to appear on the lanes, prepared to bowl at the scheduled time, shall forfeit their entry unless sufficient reason is given to warrant postponement.
3. Bowlers entered in the singles event must also enter the doubles event and visa-versa.
4. The Team captain, or his legal representative, has the privilege of substituting other bowlers for those originally entered. Only same sex substitutions will be accepted. In the doubles event, the names of both entrants must be given. Entries with the word "**PARTNER**" will not be accepted. Each Team **MUST** consist of 2 Men and 2 Women, and Doubles **MUST** consist of 1 Male and 1 Female.
5. The Doubles event will be bowled immediately following the Singles event. **SINGLES is Bowled First.**
6. All entrants will bowl 3 games on one pair of lanes in each event, unless mechanical failures dictate otherwise. No entry money will be refunded if it is discovered that a team or individual has failed to comply with all rules of the United States Bowling Congress and all rules and requirements of this tournament.
7. **Handicap will be 90% of the difference between the bowler's entering average and a scratch figure of 230. All handicaps will be calculated on a 3 game basis. It shall be the responsibility of each bowler to verify his or her average. Failure to use proper average shall disqualify scores bowled if submitted average is lower than actual average. Prize winnings will be based on submitted average if it is higher than the actual average. Average corrections must be made prior to the completion of the FIRST GAME.**
8. **ENTERING AVERAGE:** Your Highest USBC Average over the **past 2 years of 21 games or more**. If your average this season is 10 or more pins higher than the last 2 seasons, this year's average will be used. **USBC RULE 319a(2) WILL APPLY. 10 PIN RULE**
9. If a bowler does not have a yearbook average for the last 2 years, the bowler may use the highest current certified average (of 21 or more games) as of the closing date for entries of the tournament (**May 27, 2022**), otherwise they must enter with an average of 230. If using current average, a league sheet showing average as of May 27, 2022 must be provided to Tournament Officials at check-in or emailed with entry form. **If bowler does not have a yearbook or current average and competed in a summer league, that average, of at least 21 games, may be used provided it is verified at the tournament office. USBC Rules 319 c, d, & e will apply.**
10. The prize ratio for each event will be one prize for each five entries. Lineage and Expense = \$15.00, Prize Money = \$15.00 per bowler per handicap event. **PRIZE MONEY WILL BE RETURNED 100%.**
11. In the event of a tie for first place (team, doubles, singles) the tied contestants will bowl 3 games in accordance with the rules of the tournament at such time and place as decided by the Tournament Manager. Total pins, including handicap, for the 3 games will determine the winner. In the event of a tie for first place in the All Events, USBC Rule 326a will apply. When there is a tie for any championship in a tournament, it is optional with tournament management to have a playoff or declare co-champions.
12. **Entrants must report any previous tournament prize winnings in the last year of \$ 500.00 or more in total. If entrant has won \$500.00 or more in total prize winnings for a tournament, he/she must submit all his/her tournament scores and winnings PRIOR TO BOWLING. USBC Rule 319e**
13. **PARTICIPATION & DRESS CODE RULES**
 - a. All Bowlers must wear shirts with collars or **MOCK Collars, NO EXCEPTIONS!!**
 - b. **NO T-SHIRTS** may be worn on the lanes.
 - c. **NO CLOTHES WITH HOLES** may be worn on the lanes.
 - d. Bowlers may enter doubles 2 times as long as partners change. Bowlers may only cash once in scratch singles, (Highest Score). Bowlers may enter the team event 3 times, as long as 2 members of the team change.
 - e. Only one professional (PBA or PWBA) member allowed per doubles pair, and only 2 per team.
14. Scores lost due to malfunction of automatic scorers shall be re-bowled if the scores can not be verified by other scoring means.
15. Scores for ALL-EVENTS will be taken from the FIRST series bowled in each event. (Team, Doubles, & Singles)
16. USBC Rule 330 will apply. (A bowler must use the same hand to deliver the bowling ball throughout the tournament).
17. USBC Rule 329, a protest or appeal involving eligibility or playing rules must be filed with Tournament Management, the Local Association or USBC up to 5 Days before tournament prizes are paid. The protest or appeal must be in writing and the grounds for the protest or appeal briefly stated.
18. **A \$ 20.00 ADMINISTRATIVE FEE, PLUS BANK CHARGES WILL BE LEVIED ON ANY RETURNED CHECKS.**
19. **SCRATCH EVENTS:** Bowlers must compete in regular tournament to enter scratch event. Scores from handicap event will be used to determine winners of the scratch event.
