Any person (league officer, proprietor, sponsor, association officer, director, press/radio/TV personality, etc.) who has demonstrated long-term or significant contributions is considered suitable for nomination. Nominations must contain the full name of the nominee and a one-page biography including the reason(s) for nomination in one of the categories listed below:

The area bowling community was shocked and saddened to learn of the October 10 passing of Denard E. Bankston II, 24, who died in a single car crash in Woodbridge, Va. A 2011 youth Invitational champion, he recently completed his third season of adult league competition where he averaged 229, 221, and 211 bowling parttime in leagues at Bowl America Woodbridge and 219 for 103 games in the Lost & Found league at Bowl America Shirley.

Tickets are available for NCAUSBCA's December 2022 Fund-raiser that helps defray the cost of programs that can benefit all members. Available numbers to select are here. As the association recovers financially from the pandemic, it is hoped that more members and friends will support this latest venture, whereby NCAUSBCA will offer each day in December an opportunity for individuals to cash through numbers selected in the daily Virginia Lottery "Pick 3" game. Bowlers must be aware of new bowling ball rule

Entering the third month of the 2022-2023 bowling season, we are excited that the number of bowlers returning to the sport is increasing. The Nation's Capital Area USBC Association Board of Directors and staff are here to serve our bowling community. Our Web site, ncausbca.org, is full of information to help leagues and bowlers, so visit often.

Take a moment to read Rule 18, Bowling Ball – Altering Surface. Bowlers cannot use isopropyl alcohol or any liquid substance or cleaning agent to clean a bowling ball once competition has started. Patting a ball with a product like rosin or Easy Slide is adding a foreign substance to the ball and cannot be done during competition.

Contact a league or tournament officer if you need to clean your ball during league or tournament competition. Remember to clean your ball before starting league play with an approved cleaner during practice unless otherwise specified by league or tournament rules.

League officers, make sure you are up-to-date on your knowledge of Rule 104, *League* **Officers Duties**.

> Presidents, you are responsible for managing your league and enforcing the rules. Practice good bookkeeping and review bank account statements or center financial statements monthly.

> Secretaries, if the bowling center uses an electronic

method to capture scores and bowler information, you are responsible for keeping a record of the scores bowled by all team members and substitutes and reporting the scores (USBC Rule 104d). Throughout the season, membership application cards must be submitted within 30 days of a bowler's starting date. \succ Treasurers, set up the league bank account in the name of the league with the signatures of at least two officers. Make sure the bank statement is sent to the league president. Deposit league funds within one week of receipt. You are responsible for a complete accounting of all receipts and disbursements.

In leagues using in-house banking services, you are responsible for all the duties specified in Rule 104e. Helpful information for league officers is located in the "Secretary's Corner" on *ncausbca.org*.

Tournament bowling

Many league bowlers wonder how they compare to other bowlers in the area. Fortunately, there is an easy way to find out: You can participate in local, state, or national tournaments. Local tournaments are organized and run by your association. Other organizations also hold local tournaments.

They are not particularly expensive, generally running \$30 each for singles, doubles, and team competitions. That is close to the amount we now

go as a group, as this makes it more of a social event. You might want to visit the center where the competition is held. If it is part of the corporation that owns your center, you can use your free practice games. This lets you get the feel of the place where you will compete.

We know that USBC makes rules that govern our leagues. These rules are designed to make sure the competition is fair and provides opportunities for each bowler to succeed and have a chance to win.

If you make the decision to participate in a tournament, talk to your team members and go as a group, as this makes it more of a social event.

pay for each week of a competitive league; the only difference is that the prize money portion is paid back to the winners at the end of the competition.

Ongoing and upcoming tour-naments include the Virginia State Senior Tournament, the NCAUSBCA Senior Tournament in November, and December's NCAUSBCA Mixed Tournament in Support of BVL. BVL, the Bowlers to Veterans Link, brightens the lives of America's veterans and active duty men and women through recreational and therapeutic programs and services.

It is well known that individuals participate in tournaments usually make mental and physical preparations prior to the competition and therefore often exceed their league averages. USBC also has developed rules for tournaments, and it acknowledges that reality but also wants to address the issues of some bowlers who always perform at a much higher level. They have two rules that are important to this issue.

Rule 319d states that bowlers who have won prizes of \$300 in one category, \$500 in one tournament, or over \$1,000 in one year must keep a record of those earnings and scores. When they plan to participate

in a tournament, they are required to provide that information to the tournament manager who can then decide, if the records suggest, he or she might have to adjust the participant's average upward to be fair to the other bowlers.

The penalty for not providing this information to the tournament manager is removal of all scores and forfeiture of entry fees and any prize money qualified due to scores bowled. Generally, if a bowler has earnings in excess of those listed above, they should provide this information when they send in their entry form for the tournament. If a bowler's average is ever adjusted upward by a tournament director, the bowler must al-ways reveal that fact in any future tournament competition.

The second rule that is important is Rule 319e. This rule directs tournament bowlers to keep a record of every game bowled in tournament competition. All the games included for the past year should be able to be combined and divided by the number of games. That number is a bowler's tournament average (BTA). If the BTA is more than 15 pins above the last year's book average, the bowler is required to notify the tournament director of that fact and must use that higher average while bowling in a handicapped tournament.

As you can see, these rules are there for a purpose. You are bowling in a competition and want a fair chance to win. The rules help keep the competition balanced so you have that chance.


