There were four recipients this year of the prestigious NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award, which is named in honor of the late association Hall of Fame member who was a strong supporter of area youth bowling. The announcement of the 2022 winners took place January 22 at Bowl America Gaithersburg prior to the opening round of the NCAUSBCA Youth 52nd Annual Invitational Scratch Singles Tournament.

The award winners, honored for bowling achievement and/or service to youth bowling, were each presented with a plaque and \$500 in scholarship funds, which will be administered through the USBC SMART program. In addition, the four names appear on a second plaque of honorees, which now total 31.

JA'SEAN BILLINGS • Hyattsville, Maryland

Some of Ja'Sean's bowling achievements include a 300 game and 815 series on the same day at age



13. He is a three-time Maryland State All-Events cham-pion, a NCA-USBCA two-time Youth Tourna-ment of Champions winner, a Mid-Atlantic Junior Bowling Tour champion, a Danny Wiseman \$300 in League Tournament champion with a runnerup spot in the Danny Wiseman tournament,

Final Advancers round appear-ances at the Junior Gold Championships, a second-place finish at Virginia State, and many more. He also participates in adult tournaments, including PBA Regionals and the Money Bags Scratch, Last One Standing, Virginia-Maryland Scratch, and Sunday 9-Pin No Tap events.

Ja'Sean currently is a junior at Suitland High, where he holds a 3.0 GPA. He does community service for the Boys & Girls Club and for the past three seasons has served on the Board of Directors of the Nation's Capital Area USBC Association. In earlier years, he helped coach the younger kids in his leagues at AMF Marlow Heights and Potomac Lanes.

friends and play golf, baseball, tennis, and, of course, more bowling. He always shows his bowling spirit all over by wearing ball brands and league shirts. His journey in bowling began with his grandfather, Kevin Roy, who started him in bowling at age 3. For Ja'Sean, bowling "felt like second nature."

He currently participates in two leagues, the Monday Night Sport at The Lanes Fort Meade, where he holds a 185 average, which converts to a 214 average on house conditions, and the Friday MAJBT Sport Shot at Greenway Bowl, where his 170 average converts to 197.

Every year, he participates in Junior Gold, one of the largest youth bowling tournaments in the country, with several thousand youth bowlers. In this prestigious event, he has made it to the Final Advancers round three times, earning \$943 in scholarship money. He also made the Advancers round twice for an additional \$400.

All of the above qualities merit Ja'Sean Billings the NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award.

Andru Blaney is a role model for his youth league, as represents himself, his family, and the league at the highest levels both on and off



the lanes. It has been an honor to watch Andru grow into the person he is today.

Andru was raised in the bowling alley, and at a very young age, he would sit and watch all of the bowlers. He is a wellrounded person and athlete who takes pride in being a role model. Andru is a student of the

game and spends many hours each week practicing and bowling his leagues at AMF Waldorf and The Lanes Fort Meade.

Andru is currently one of the top bowlers in the Saturday Morning Youth league at Waldorf. Andru works hard to mentor some of the younger kids in his youth league, as there are many who want to bowl two-handed. Often, he can be found guiding and encouraging some of the younger kids on how to adjust to lane conditions, providing insight on where they should be playing on the lanes. He works very hard to continuously improve himself both on and off the lanes.

When Andru is not bowling, he is working hard on his schoolwork to ensure that he stays near the top of his class. In addition to all of his bowling accomplishments, Andru continues to excel in school, where he maintains a 4.31 weighted grade point average and a 3.89 unweighted average, which puts him in the top 10 percent of his class of 458 students.

In addition to his tournament championships, Andru has 12 second-place finishes, both locally and out of town, including the 2017 Youth Invitational and the 2021 PBA Jr. Williamsburg U18 Boys.

While Andru has achieved success bowling in tournaments, he was also recognized for some honor scores, including an 11 in a row (290 Game) award while bowling in a 12 Bagger Tournament, an 11 in a row (298 Game) award while bowling in his Saturday Morning league, an 11 in a row (297 Game) award bowling in the Friday Night Sport Shot league, and two 300 games while bowling in his Saturday Morning league.

Whether helping others or seeking ways to improve his own game, Andru Blaney has demonstrated a dedication to bowling that earns him the NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award.
