Winners named for USBC national high average, series awards for 2021-2022 season

ARLINGTON, Texas – A pair of Professional Women's Bowling Association Tour champions made their way to the top of the list to claim United States Bowling Congress National High Average and Series Awards for the 2021–2022 season.

Liz Kuhlkin of Schenectady, New York and Breanna Clemmer of Clover, South Carolina are two of the 10 award winners being recognized for the top performances of the season. The USBC National High Average and Series Awards are presented to adult male and female USBC members and youth USBC members in male and female divisions.

Kuhlkin earns the women's high average award for the second time in three seasons after recording a 247.29 average for 124 games at Schenectady's Towne Bowling Academy.

The men's high average award for 2021-2022 belongs to Jesse Hawkins of Pikeville, Ky., for posting a 257.47 clip for 90 games during the Gary Stepp

MEMBERSHIP DEPT.

Women's Championships will shift from Cincinnati's Western Bowl to the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada. Cincinnati now is scheduled to host the event in 2027 at Western Bowl. Said Strike and Spare Family Entertainment Centers Operations Manager Ron Schmittou: "In order to accommodate our existing business, Hoinke Tournament, and the renovation schedule, the best option was for Western Bowl to shift hosting the USBC Women's Championships to 2027. This change will allow us to provide the best possible venue experience for the Women's Championships and our current customers." The 2024 Women's Championships will take place at the NBS. The venue underwent a \$4.5 million renovation leading up to the 2021 event and will be an opportunity for many bowlers to experience the recently renovated facility for the first time. Registration for the 2024 Women's Championships will open in April 2023.

The United States Bowling Congress announced a schedule

change for the USBC Women's Championships. The 2024

The USBC 2024 Open Championships in Las Vegas will return to the South Point Bowling Plaza and take place for 136 consecutive days, running from March 2 to July 15. Members of the Captain's Club currently have the opportunity to secure their spots at the 2024 event. The early registration period is available to current qualifying members, and captains will receive details and instructions by eMail. The online portal will open to all bowlers starting March 2 at 1 p.m. To be eligible for the benefits of the Captain's Club, a captain must have five or more teams registered to bowl for the 2023 event. The Open Championships will make its fifth visit to the South Point Bowling Plaza and seventh overall trip to Las Vegas for the tournament's 120th edition. The entry fee at the 2024 tournament will be \$70 per event, plus an optional \$15 for all-events (\$225 total). There also is a \$25 processing fee per team. The 2023 Open Championships is scheduled to begin March 4 and run through July 24 at the National Bowling Stadium in Reno, Nevada. USBC has fully reinstated the following bowlers: James R. Peck of Severn, Md., and Steve A. Melvin of Manassas, Va. These individuals again become eligible to compete in USBC leagues and tournaments with all of the attendant membership privileges.



There were three recipients this year of the prestigious NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award, which is named in honor of the late association Hall of Fame member who was a strong supporter of area youth bowling. The announcement of the 2023 winners took place January 21 at Crofton Bowling Centre prior to the opening round of the NCAUSBCA Youth 53rd Annual Invitational Scratch Singles Tournament.

The award winners, honored for bowling achievement and/or service to youth bowling, each were presented with a plaque (by Invitational Manager Robin Leonard) and \$200 in scholarship funds, which will be administered through the USBC SMART program. In addition, the three names appear on a second plaque of honorees, which now total 34.

MAX EDER • Springfield, Virginia

Max Eder is a senior who soon will graduate from Lake Braddock Secondary School with a 3.8 GPA and will attend Muskingum University this fall to bowl with the Fighting Muskies. He is an incredible person who has dramatically improved as a bowler and has come an incredibly long way.

Bowling is a true passion for Max, who started around three years ago in a fun youth league, got some good advice, and met some caring people who saw his potential and thus moved to a more competitive elite league where he has excelled ever since. He received better coaching from Bryant Mehio and now works with Will Clark and bowls on Sport shots several times a week.

With the support of his parents, coaches, and extended bowling family, Max improved 20 pins this past year to reach a 200 average. He received five offers to bowl on college teams, which undoubtedly came about due to his hard work, drive to succeed, and amazing attitude, along with his always being a supportive teammate.

This season, Max won the Storm Mid-Atlantic Junior Bowlers Tour Tournament of Champions as well as a division scratch title in the most recent Vern Burke Scholarship Tournament.

Some of his other accomplishments include top finishes in the Storm Mid-Atlantic Junior Bowlers Doubles Tournament, the Monday Mixed Triples league, and his youth league at Bowl America Burke, where he had high average and most improved average in addition to three times being named the center's Youth of the Month. There also were second-, third-, and fourth-place finishes in Storm Mid-Atlantic Junior Bowlers competition, along with placing fourth in the NCAUSBCA Youth Championship Tournament (twice) and the 7th Annual Paul Goodwin Youth/Adult Scholarship Bowling Tournament.

In 2022, Max was a C Division finalist in the NCAUSBCA Youth Invitational Scratch Singles Tournament. He also qualified for Junior Gold at the USBC Invitationals (Round 2) and for the association's 600 Club Tournament of Champions.

Max, a member of the National Honor Society, plans to study education in college and hopes to work with elementary school students.



He volunteers regularly to assist elderly neighbors with just about anything for which strong hands are needed. Max:

- > Does yard work for ailing neighbors and doesn't take any money (although he sometimes accepts cookies).
- > Regularly participates in park cleanups at Lake Accotink and in the neighborhood.
- > Collects and delivers recyclables in an effort to help the environment.
- ➤ Bags food at Food for Others.
- > Encourages and helps special needs members of the bowling community feel good about themselves and get better at the sport he loves.

Whether selflessly helping others or seeking ways to improve his bowling, Max Eder clearly has demonstrated characteristics that merit him the NCAUSBCA Ted Gruszkowski Jr. Youth Star Award.

KAYLA STARR • Crofton, Maryland

Before moving to The Lanes Fort Meade, Kayla Starr already had made a name for herself in the youth world in the Baltimore area. In 2015, she started bowling the Preps league at Fort Meade and entered a world of coaching excellence to help with her game. Kayla has won scholarships in the Pepsi Championships in the U12 and U15



Girls divisions, winning the U15 Girls title in 2021 and 2022.

Kayla bowls all over the United States in Storm Youth Championships (SYC) events, in which she holds several titles, the PBA Jr. events, and in the Storm Mid-Atlantic Jr. Bowlers Tour as well as other team and singles events.

In 2021, Kayla bowled in the Junior Gold Championships in Indianapolis, where she made it to the advancers round, then advanced to the TV finals where she came in second place, and she also was named to the Team USA Developmental squad. She also made it to the JBA Jr. TV finals on FOX where she competed against Jillian Martin for the title. Kayla also claimed a PBA Junior Doubles title.

But 2022 has been Kayla's biggest year so far. Beginning in February, where she graced the cover of *Bowlers Journal International* and was

Prize fund, contribution records continue at NCAUSBCA Mixed Tournament in Support of BVL

NCAUSBCA's 12th Annual Mixed Tournament in Support of BVL, which took place December 3-4, 10-11, and 17-18, set records for the fourth consecutive year for teams (130, previous high 94) and doubles (269, previous high 201) and had a record prize fund of \$38,314 — \$7,800 more than the previous high. In addition, the tournament raised a record \$21,500 (previous high \$15,000) for the NCAUSBCA 2022-2023 contribution to BVL.

The tournament, held each December at Bowl America Shirley, plans to re-oil the lanes between the first and second squads next year, as several early squads sold out over two weeks before the closing date. I intend to limit singles/doubles squads to a maximum of six bowlers per pair of lanes.

Chris Garvey of Vienna, Va., bowled the high series of 794 (team), while Paul Rumbaugh of Stafford, Va., and Dale Lion of Fairfax, Va., each bowled a 296 game, both in the doubles event to share high game honors. There were 11 series of 750 or better, seven games of 280 or better, and 14 games of 279.

Special thanks go to the tournament's presenting sponsor, the Sports Plus / Carmen Don Pro Shop, as well as event sponsors Rowl Rite Bowling, FXBG Photobooth, Sysnetic Data Systems LLC, Andrea Dale, and Tom Dale.



Days after competing in the NCAUSBCA Youth 53rd Annual Invitational Scratch Singles Tournament, Andru responded to questions posed by editor Bob Cosgrove.

How does making Junior Team USA rank among your many accomplishments in bowling? What are three of your other highly related bowling accomplishments?

Making Junior Team USA is my biggest accomplishment; it is number one on my list. Making match play in Junior Gold 2022, National finalist PBA Jr., and winning Storm Youth Championship Coastal Classic in October 2022.

What things—benefits—do you want to get out of being a Junior Team USA member?

I look forward to being a Junior Team USA member because it will provide me the knowledge to grow my game. I will receive training from some of the best bowling athletes/coaches in the USA. I will be provided the opportunity to represent my country anytime on the lanes.

I am committed to attend Mount Mercy University (in Cedar Rapids, Iowa) in Fall 2023. Bowling was a major factor when I decided which college to attend. However, I also made sure that the college offered the programs (finance or accounting) that I am planning to major in.

Coach Mike Sinek; my dad is a coach; Jim Lewis, my mentor. I have worked with many other bowling coaches as well, throughout my time,





23rd Annual Guys & Dolls Tournament Rules

- 1. The Tournament is open to any bowler providing proof of a 2022-2023 USBC Membership and book average from the prior 2 seasons, or a final 2022-2023 league standings sheet if no prior years.
- 2. Bowlers must present a USBC membership card at the tournament check-in **30 minutes prior** to scheduled start time. Lineup will be <u>as shown on entry form.</u> Teams or bowlers failing to appear on the lanes, prepared to bowl at the scheduled time, shall forfeit their entry unless sufficient reason is given to warrant postponement.
- 3. Bowlers entered in the singles event must also enter the doubles event and visa-versa.
- 4. The Team captain, or his legal representative, has the privilege of substituting other bowlers for those originally entered. Only same sex substitutions will be accepted. In the doubles event, the names of both entrants must be given. Entries with the word <u>"PARTNER"</u> will not be accepted. Each Team MUST consist of 2 Men and 2 Women, and Doubles MUST consist of 1 Male and 1 Female.
- 5. The Doubles event will be bowled immediately following the Singles event. SINGLES is Bowled First.
- 6.All entrants will bowl 3 games on one pair of lanes in each event, unless mechanical failures dictate otherwise. No entry money will be refunded if it is discovered that a team or individual has failed to comply with all rules of the United States Bowling Congress and all rules and requirements of this tournament.
- 7. Handicap will be 90% of the difference between the bowler's entering average and a scratch figure of 230 All handicaps will be calculated on a 3 game basis. It shall be the responsibility of each bowler to verify his or her average. Failure to use proper average shall disqualify scores bowled if submitted average is lower than actual average. Prize winnings will be based on submitted average if it is higher than the actual average. Average corrections must be made prior to the completion of the <u>FIRST GAME</u>.
- 8. **ENTERING AVERAGE**: Your Highest USBC Average over the **past 2 years of 21** games or more. If your average this season is 10 or more pins higher than the last 2 seasons, this year's average will be used. <u>USBC RULE 319a(2) WILL APPLY. 10 PIN RULE</u>
- 9. If a bowler does not have a yearbook average for the last 2 years, the bowler may use the highest current certified average (of 21 or more games) as of the closing date for entries of the tournament (May 26, 2023), otherwise they must enter with an average of 230. If using current average, a league sheet showing average as of May 26, 2023 must be provided to Tournament Officials at check-in or emailed with entry form. If bowler does not have a yearbook or current average and competed in a summer league, that average, of at least 21 games, may be used provided it is verified at the tournament office. USBC Rules 319 c, d, & e will apply.
- 10. The prize ratio for each event will be one prize for each five entries. Lineage and Expense = \$15.00, Prize Money = \$15.00 per bowler per handicap event. PRIZE MONEY WILL BE RETURNED 100%.
- 11. In the event of a tie for first place (team, doubles, singles) the tied contestants will bowl 3 games in accordance with the rules of the tournament at such time and place as decided by the Tournament Manager. Total pins, including handicap, for the 3 games will determine the winner. In the event of a tie for first place in the All Events, USBC Rule 326a will apply. When there is a tie for any championship in a tournament, it is optional with tournament management to have a playoff or declare co-champions.
- 12. Entrants must report any previous tournament prize winnings in the last year of \$ 500.00 or more in total. If entrant has won \$500.00 or more in total prize winnings for a tournament, he/she must submit all his/her tournament scores and winnings PRIOR TO BOWLING. USBC Rule 319e
- 13. PARTICIPATION & DRESS CODE RULES
 - a. All Bowlers must wear shirts with collars or MOCK Collars, NO EXCEPTIONS!!.
 - b. NO T-SHIRTS may be worn on the lanes.
 - c. NO CLOTHES WITH HOLES may be worn on the lanes.
 - d. Bowlers may enter doubles 2 times as long as partners change. Bowlers may only cash once in scratch singles, (Highest Score). Bowlers may enter the team event 3 times, as long as 2 members of the team change.
 - e. Only one professional (PBA or PWBA) member allowed per doubles pair, and only 2 per team.
- 14. Scores lost due to malfunction of automatic scorers shall be re-bowled if the scores can not be verified by other scoring means.
