Hall of Fame nominations due Dec. 31

The postmark deadline for nomination of candidates for the Nation's Capital Area USBC Association Hall of Fame "Class of 2025" is December 31, 2024. All NCAUSBCA members have the privilege of submitting nominations to the Hall of Fame Committee for consideration. Nominations are open to all bowlers and non-bowlers who by their efforts have furthered the interests of the sport of bowling in the Nation's Capital Area.

Any person (league officer, proprietor, sponsor, association officer, director, press/radio/TV personality, etc.) who has demonstrated long-term or significant contributions is considered suitable for nomination. (Please note that active "Bowling Achievement" candidates must have competed in a minimum of three [3] of the past five [5] NCAUSBCA Championships tournaments—the "Open" for men, "Women's" for women—to be considered by the Hall of Fame Committee.)

Nominations must contain the full name of the nominee and a one-page biography, including the reason(s) for nomination in one of the following categories:

WEEK ADDED TO 2025 USBC WOMEN'S CHAMPIONSHIPS

With spots quickly filling for the 2025 United States Bowling Congress Women's Championships in Las Vegas, the tournament staff has extended the 105th edition of the event by a week to allow for more teams to compete at the South Point Bowling Plaza. The 2025 event now will run from April 26 to July 6 at the 60-lane tournament venue inside the South Point Hotel, Casino, and Spa and feature competition for 72 consecutive days. The tournament originally was scheduled to conclude June 29. The event's capacity currently sits at more than 80 percent for 2025, and the extra week will open spots for an extra 196 teams. More than 3,700 four-player teams already have registered. Squads at the 2025 Championships will take place at 9 a.m. (doubles/singles), 12:30 p.m. (doubles/singles), 4 p.m. (team) and 7:30 p.m. (team on Saturday/Monday/Thursday and doubles/singles on Sunday/Tuesday/Friday). The new week will feature available spots at 4 p.m. for teams and 12:30 p.m. for doubles and singles. The tournament staff also recently opened additional team and doubles/singles sets for 7:30 p.m. squads in May and June. The cost to enter the 2025 tournament will be \$55 per event, plus an optional \$15 for all-events (\$180 per bowler). There also will be a \$20 processing fee per team. The Women's Championships features four average-based divisions in each event and will introduce Team All-Events for the first time in 2025.

BRIEFLY....

The USBC Hall of Fame will welcome five new members when the 2025 class is inducted May 7 during the USBC Convention in Las Vegas. The USBC Hall of Fame Committee recently elected Shannon O'Keefe of Jacksonville, Ala.; Bryan Goebel of Shawnee, Kan.; and Randy Pedersen of Orlando, Fla., in the Superior Performance category, and Tom Clark of Muskego, Wisconsin, and Keith Hamilton of Park Ridge, Ill., in the Meritorious Service category. ... Bowlers are encouraged to check into ncausbca.org frequently to learn details about the 2025 NCAUSBCA Women's Championships Tournament as well as a new association-sponsored event for past and present members of the military scheduled for March 8-9 at The Lanes Fort Meade. In addition, there will be news about the NCAUSBCA 19th Annual Membership Meeting scheduled for Sunday, April 13.

- b. Be cleaned with any liquid substance or cleaning agent.
- c. Have any foreign material on it including, but not limited to, powder, rosin, marker, or paint.

All bowling balls so altered or cleaned must be removed from the competition. So once practice is over, put those wet towels and cleaners away!

In closing, thank you all for your dedication to the sport. Let's finish this year strong!

MANAGER'S MEMO • RONALD MCGREGOR

Does your league have a plan for bad weather?

December is one of the two months (May is the other) during which we have our Virginia lottery fund-raiser. There are three chances to win every day, and 93 chances throughout the month. If you still have not as yet availed yourself of this wonderful opportunity to support your association's programs, everything you need to know about how to purchase tickets can be found on our Web page.

The deadline for Hall of Fame nominations for the "Class of 2025" is December 31, 2024. Can you think of anyone you would like to nominate? If so, you may submit the nomination by eMail: manager@ncausbca.org, Fax: 301/499-5927, or drop it off in person to our office. Criteria/guidelines can be found [here](#).

Rule 117d: Weather hasn't really been a factor so far this season. However, it is a good idea to have a plan to deal with makeups for missed bowling. Know who is supposed to be notified in case of cancellations, etc.

Rule 108/5: All drilled holes *must* be used in every delivery. Violations will lead to forfeiture.

Rule 319d: Reporting Prior Prize Winnings. This is the bowler's responsibility—not the squad sponsor. The same applies to the entering average.

1. Within the last 12-month period, anyone who has qualified* for a cash and/or mer-

chandise prize in the position standings prize list in a tournament, including all-events, special features, special prizes and donated prizes, must give tournament management the following information prior to participation for possible average adjustment:

- a. The name of each tournament in which they have been paid the following prizes, or if not yet paid, in which they have qualified for the prize: (1) \$300 or more in any event; (2) Total combined prize winnings of \$500 or more in any one tournament; (3) Total combined prize winnings of \$1,000 or more in all tournaments within the last 12 months.
- b. The amount of the prize.
- c. The actual score bowled to qualify for the prize.
- d. The prize position.

2. Failure to comply with these provisions is cause for a forfeiture of entry fees and prize winnings.

NOTE: **Qualified* is defined as the date and time the tournament officially ended (completion of the last squad or round of competition), or payment of prizes, whichever comes first. All bowlers, regardless of average, must comply with the provision of Rule 319d. Prize winnings from certified and non-certified tournaments, including those using a modified format of American Tenpins (exam-

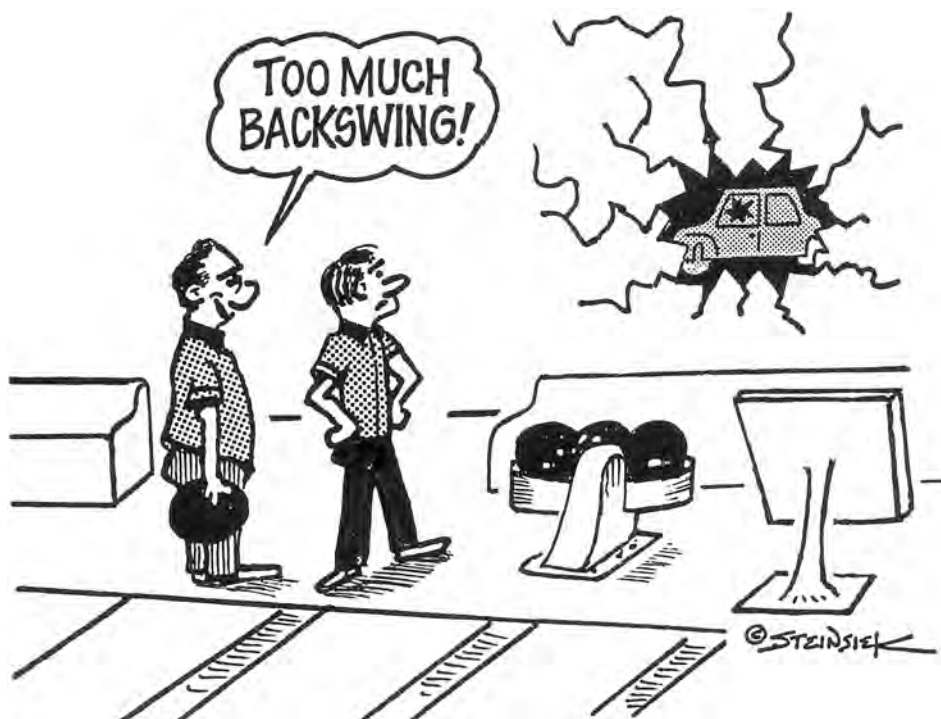

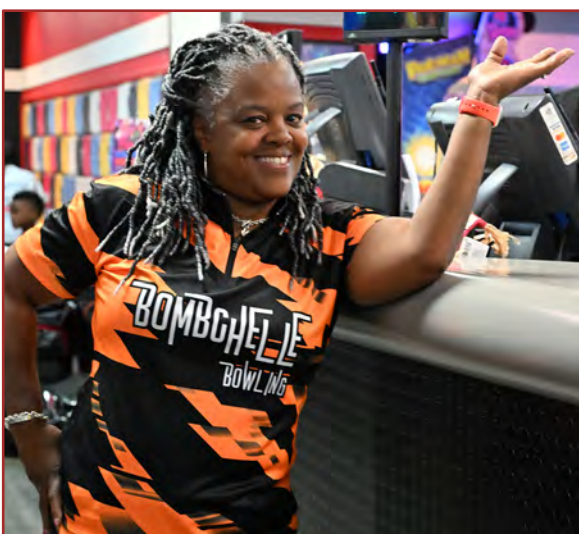

The Best Bowling Tip I Ever Received

By John Neral



In the summer of 2023, I had trouble repeating shots and generating more ball speed. This caused a lack of consistent shot-making, decreased scoring, and a failure to accurately read my ball motion.

I had a lesson with former Team USA Head Coach Jeri Edwards and former TEAM USA Assistant Coach Ken Yokobosky in Rockaway, New Jersey, who quickly diagnosed two things that made a huge difference in my game.

First, they noticed that I wasn't energizing my trail leg enough in my finish position. In other words, my trail leg was "lazy" and wasn't clearing my hip quickly enough to get it out of the way of my swing.

Second, they noticed I wasn't staying in the ball long enough at the release point. This caused me to turn the ball early, which caused an inconsistent ball motion and also caused the ball to lose more energy down lane.

When I began practicing energizing my trail leg and staying in the ball longer at release, I noticed an immediate difference in my ball reaction. This was especially true when throwing urethane, as those pieces of equipment tend to get "tired" as you bowl more games on them.

I've been able to read my ball motion more consistently, which has helped me make better adjustments because I am repeating more quality shots. Additionally, it's improved my balance position at the foul line and has definitely improved my score. Since that lesson, I have had a handful of top-10 finishes in PBA Regional events, with a best finish of third last month at the PBA50 Team Walton Ft. Meade Open.

Now, whenever I feel I am not throwing the ball well enough, I always go back to these two tips and remember to get my trail leg out of the way quicker and stay in the ball longer before releasing it.

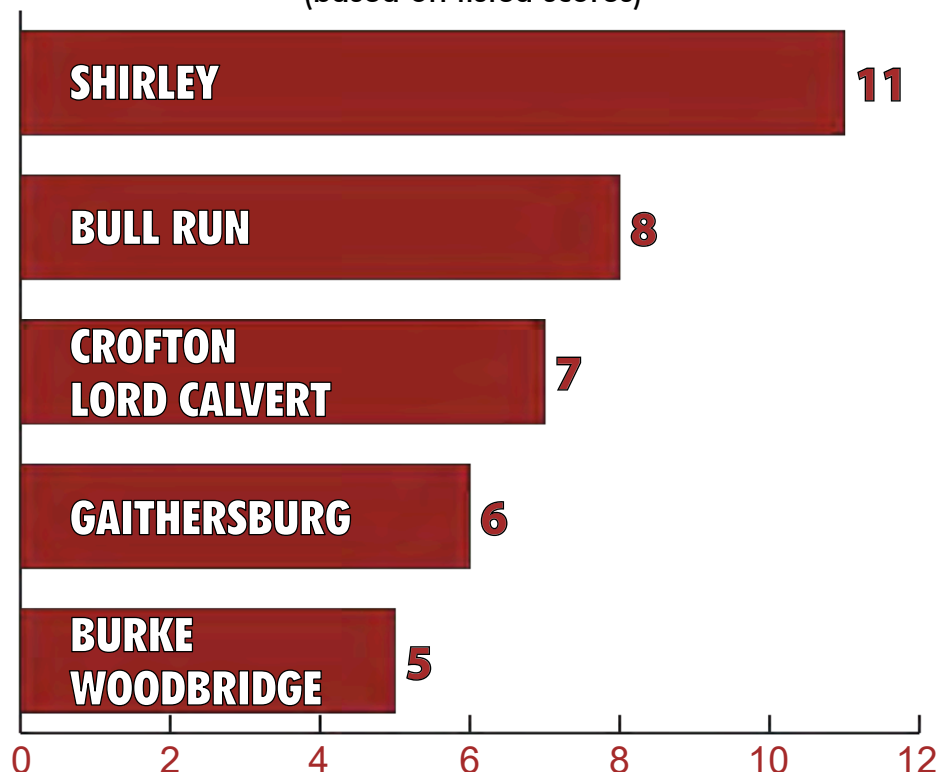
