

Azlee Evans Rolls 300 Game at Shirley

WDCAWBA's Second Perfecto

On December 5, a 21-year-old woman hit one of the few reached, yet vastly sought, pinnacles of anyone's bowling career. With a Columbia White Dot during the Friday Night Mixed League at Bowl America Shirley, Azlee Evans rolled her first 300 game.

It was only the second perfect game ever rolled in the history of the WDCAWBA. Hall of Famer Margarett Uncles strung twelve consecutive strikes in a game at Bowl America Town Center in 1966.

"I didn't even realize that I might bowl a 300 until the first ball of the 10th frame," Azlee explained. "There were only four frames showing" on the monitors of the automatic scorekeepers, she said.

Azlee, who was carrying a 160 average in that league, set another lifetime high for herself that night. The 300 game combined with a 182 and 174 game, let her finish the night with a 656 set. Her previous high set was a 649.

Azlee has been bowling for nine years. Her father got her started in YABA, and she has been bowling ever since.
