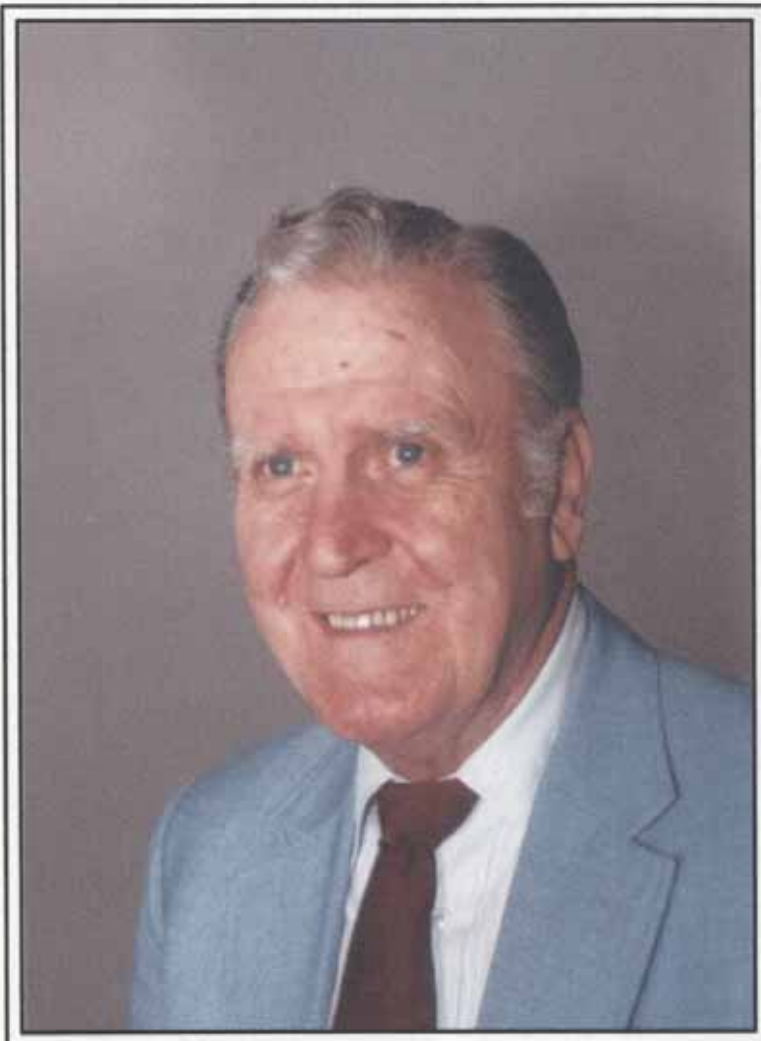

PROFILE OF MALTON V. EVANS HALL OF FAME - MERITORIOUS SERVICE

Mal was born in Danville, Virginia; married Barbara and they had two children; Wanda Kaye and Mark. Mal is the proud grandfather of four grandchildren and two great grandchildren. He has a degree in Business Administration with a major in Management from the University of Virginia. Beginning his Civil Service career in the Secret Service, he transferred to the Department of Commerce where he retired after 30 years. At the point of his retirement he was serving as the executive assistant to the Secretary for Aerospace.

His bowling involvement began in the White House Lanes in Washington, D. C., bowling on a pair of lanes installed under the White House during the tenure of President Harry S. Truman.

In 1988 Mal came to Myrtle Beach and began bowling immediately. He held his first league office in 1989. Since that time he has held every league office at one time or another. He was appointed to the board of the Grand Strand Bowling Association in 1989. He was elected Director of the year in 1993. Mal has served as Chairman of the Bowler of the Year Committee, established the Top 10 Ranking Program and donated the frames and pictures for the Top 10 Ranking that we see in each center. He was elected president of the Grand Strand Bowling Association in 1998.

While serving as chairman of the Legislative Committee, he rewrote the by-laws for the association and established committee guidelines for all committees of the Board. He established the Secretary of the Year Program and rewrote the duties of the directors. He established the Orientation Committee. He wrote and activated the Life Membership Program as we know it today.

As Chairman of the Hall of Fame Committee Mal established and wrote the guidelines for the Hall of Fame Committee for the men's board. He established and wrote the categories that we use in our Hall of Fame: Meritorious Service, Bowling Achievement and Veterans Category. Mal built the Hall of Fame display, complete with photographs, and donated it to the Associations.

Mal has also accomplished a great deal while rolling the ball. His highest average was 214, his high game is 299 and his highest series a 783. Other individual accomplishments which occurred over the years were several 11-in-a-row (two 290 games), two 297 games, a 298 and a 299 game. Mal has also rolled 37 series of 700 or higher. At one time Mal was ranked as No. 2 in the state of Virginia. Tonight he is ranked No. 1 with us.
