## Weyand bests Wallace to win PBA senior regional at U.S. Bowling

Springfield's Jim Weyand defeated Larry Wallace of Manassas 248-193 in the deciding contest of the PBA South Region Alexandria, Va., Senior Open Nov. 28 at U.S. Bowling to earn the \$1,500 top prize. Wallace settled for \$800.

Weyand, who averaged 207.11 for 18 games, advanced to the title match in the stepladder finals by conquering in succession Edward Buco, Berlin, Md. (3-2), Guppy Troup, Taylorsville, N.C. Among area players, Holmes placed fourth and earned \$700, while Hall of Famer Larry O'Neill finished 12<sup>th</sup> and collected \$450—the same amount as Allen Morrow of Stafford, Va., who placed 16<sup>th</sup>.

Pete Gunn of Stafford, who finished 29<sup>th</sup>, earned one of the two \$250 "Super Senior" bonuses awarded for those age 60 and over.
