

KENT BOWLERS HELP NEEDY DURING HOLIDAYS

So said Charles "Fly" Towell, secretary of the Kent Cincinnati Mixed League at Bowl America Kent, as canned goods, turkeys, baby food, and financial donations to help those less fortunate were being collected at the bowling center. Mike Mears of the West Lanham Hills Fire Department represented the Red Cross during the food collection.
