NCABA, State records set at AMF Fredericksburg

NCABA Hall of Famer Larry Wallace scored the highest three-game series in association history Sept. 26 en route to his five-man team tallying the area's top single game and series pinfall ever.

Wallace, the area's top-ranked bowler in 1984-85 and a member of the NCABA Hall since 1993, recorded 34 of 36 possible strikes and an 869 series on games of 279-300-290 in the Rappahannock Men's league at AMF Fredericksburg. His series topped the previous high of 868 rolled Dec. 30, 1991 by Chaz Velasquez at AMF Laurel, but it fell short of the Virginia State record of 878 by Richmond's Paul Zevgolis set Aug. 3, 1994.

While the 1,341 opening game and 3,757 scratch series by the appropriately named "Strike Factory" team were NCABA records, the latter also was a Virginia State record.

Wallace's teammates included Dana Gore (288 first game/741 series), Jim Wolfe (251/733), Barry Wallace (279/717), and Russell Rose (244/697).
