

Ray Shackelford

NCAUSBCA Hall of Fame member Ray Shackelford tragically died February 20 in an auto accident. He was 73. From the 1974-1975 to 1980-1981 seasons, he appeared in the association's "Top 10" rankings six times, including the No. 1 position in the 1977-1978 and 1979-1980 seasons. Shackelford, who competed on the PBA Tour in the early 1980s - and whose travel mate was a little-known bowler named Walter Ray Williams Jr. - gained attention in 1982 when he rolled three perfect games in the Rolaids Open in Florissant, Mo., and the following year made nationally televised finals in San Jose, Calif., Houston (where he was runner-up to Bob Handley), and at the Fair Lanes Open at Woodlawn. His performances earned him a 1984 Tour exemption. He later opened Planet Fun, the first bowling center in Virginia that was alcohol and smoke-free and had great success with the company he and wife Sue founded, Golden Coin Amusements. He was a member of the Hall of Fame "Class of 1984."
