CURRENT LEAGUES/AVERAGES: The Tuesday Nite Men's Handicap at Lord Calvert, the Eastern Majors Travel League, and I'm a roving sub in the Lost Weekenders at Shirley. I generally average around 220.

HIGH GAME/SERIES: 300 (23) / 814 (twice).

MOST RECENT BOWLING ACCOMPLISHMENT: Rolling my 23rd 300 game at Greenway Bowl in Odenton, Md., in the Eastern Majors Travel League.

MOST MEMORABLE TOURNAMENT TITLES: I was captain of the Dayton (Ohio) Industrial championship team that won \$25,000 and also winning the Bill Rhodman Memorial.

BEST PART OF MY GAME: Probably my intensity-the desire to win.

WORST PART OF MY GAME: Dealing with dry lanes.

GREATEST MOMENT IN BOWLING: Being inducted into the NCABA Hall of Fame (in 1995).

WORST OR MOST EMBARRASSING BOWLING MOMENT: Missing the 10-pin in the 10th frame at the High Roller in Las Vegas that cost me the chance to advance to Round of 16, which is the elite round. It was awful, trust me.

BEST TACTIC I USE TO HANDLE PRESSURE: I place myself in another situation. I imagine I'm in a league and I'm bowling against one of my buddies for just talking rights. What this does is it just throws the butterflies and nervousness right out the window because it's the most common situation for me.

ALL-TIME FAVORITE BOWLER: It would have to be Earl (Anthony). Even though he's on the left side, when I came up, he was the guy to emulate.

PROS I ENJOY WATCHING ON TV: Norm Duke, Chris Barnes, and Robert Smith. Duke is probably the most versatile player out there. Out of all the pros, I've seen him throw the largest variety of shots. I've competed against Barnes a lot of time as an amateur, and I've had first-hand looks at him so much. To see him go to the pros and do as well as he has.... It's the next thing to a hometown guy when you bowled against a guy so often. And Robert Smith probably because he throws about as much ball as anybody out there. He throws about as *powerful* a ball as anybody out there. So he's always good to watch —always *fun* to watch.

PERSONAL SPARE-SHOOTER RATING (1 best - 10 worst): 2.

SPARE BREAK I DON'T WANT TO SEE IN THE 10TH FRAME: The 3-10 baby split. I've missed it every which way and I probably make it 60 percent of the time, but that's not good enough. It doesn't haunt me, but I don't want to see it. I'd rather shoot at a bucket (2-4-5-8), double wood (2-8), or even a 5-7.

THE THING I LEAST UNDERSTAND ABOUT BOWLING: Ball weight configurations. I chose not to [learn about it] because I did make the attempt, but it confused me because I wasn't getting reactions that were projected for certain configurations. So I found myself in a better situation reacting better from the ball rather than expecting something from the ball's configuration. So I chose then to put the weight configurations in the hands of my pro shop.

LOCAL BOWLER I MOST RESPECT: Dave Hart, because of his persistence and determination to overcome any and all conditions and situations. He's a true money player.

UPCOMING LOCAL BOWLER TO WATCH FOR: Kenny Lowe, if not already there, has a ton of talent and now is learning to bowl and not just throw.

INTERESTS OUTSIDE OF BOWLING: Everything about computers. I love to tinker: taking them apart, putting them together, working on them, troubleshooting, research.

FAVORITE MEAL: Traditional Thanksgiving dinner with turkey, macaroni and cheese, candied yams, cabbage, and hot rolls.

FAVORITE BEVERAGE: Coke.

FAVORITE ICE CREAM FLAVOR: I'm boring: Neapolitan is fine with me!
